Hoofkampus kry groter kameranetwerk

’N Volgende fase van die installering van die US se kameranetwerk is pas voltooi. Strategiese roetes op die hoofkampus en koshuise word reeds 24 uur per dag deur ’n netwerk van kameras gemonitor, en onlangs is kameras by koshuisingange ook in gebruik geneem.

Daarmee saam is die beligting op die hele kampus verbeter en word struik en plante deurlopend uitgedun om die moontlikheid van skuilplek en skadukolle tot ’n minimum te beperk en om die monitering van die kameras te verbeter.

Mnr Viljoen van der Walt, Direkteur: Risiko en Beskermingsdienste, sê die stelsel werk goed en verdere uitbreidings word reeds beplan.

Die USBD het ’n beheerkamer waar al die kameras op kampus 24 uur per dag gemonitor ord.

Uiteindelik gaan die netwerk uit meer as 100 kameras bestaan.

Die netwerk bestaan uit statiese en bewegbare kameras, wat deur beamptes in die beheerkamer hanteer en gemonitor word.

Die straatkameranetwerk is drie jaar gelede in gebruik geneem toe 22 kameras regoor kampus geïnstalleer is. “Die jongste toevoeging, die kameras by koshuis se ingange, is die eerste fase van ’n projek om kameras by alle kampuiseingange te installeer. Uiteindelik gaan die netwerk uit meer as 100 kameras bestaan. Maar ’n mens moet onthou dat so ’n stelsel slegs ter ondersteuning van veiligheid en misdaadoplossing kan wees, en nie noodwendig misdade verhoed nie.”

Van der Walt het daarop gewys dat ’n bewegbare kamera nie gedurig op een punt gefokus word nie. “Die moniteringsbeampte beweeg die kamera om die hele omvang van die gebied te monitor. As iets dus buite die periferie gebeur, sal dit nie op film vasevang word nie.”

Hy sê die USBD-beamptes het gespesialiseerde opleiding van ’n internasionaal erkende kameramoniteringskenner oor die gedrag van misdadigers ontvang. Dit help hulle om tussen ’n groep mense ’n verdagte persoon te kan uitken na gelang van daardie persoon se gedrag en liggaamstaal.

“Fasiliteitsbestuur het onlangs meer ligte op kampus aangebring sodat ons beter beelde snags kan opneem. Bome en struik is gesnoei om kameras ’n

onbelemmerde uitsig te gee. Die Fasiliteitsbestuurspan het een nag regoor kampus geloop

en gevind daar is ’n merkbare verbetering in beligting op kampus,” sê Van der Walt.

Die USBD werk tans aan ’n beleid en prosedure vir die opname en monitering van kringtelevisiebeelde. “Dit het ten doel om etiese kwessies aan te spreek rakende privaatheidskending en die uitsluitlike besigtiging van die beelde om misdade op te los.”

Van der Walt het gesê dit word ook in die vooruitsig gestel om deurlopend meer kameras op al die US se kampusse aan te bring soos wat die behoeftes vereis.

Die US Visekanselierstoekening is verlede maand by twee afsonderlike geleenthede in Stellenbosch en Johannesburg aan 40 skenkers gemaak. Daarmee is erkenning gegee aan hul bydraes tot 31 Desember 2010.

Die Visekanselierstoekening gaan aan individue wat kumulatief meer as R1 miljoen en instellings wat meer as R2 miljoen geskenk het, terwyl die Visekanselierstoekening: Goud gaan aan individue of instellings wat die R5 miljoen kerf verbygesteek het.

Altesaam 23 skenkers het die Visekanselierstoekening en ’n oorspronklike kunswerk deur Lucas Bambo ontvang.

Die ander 17 skenkers het die Visekanselierstoekening: Goud ontvang, asook ’n oorspronklike kunswerk deur Christina Bryer.

Vanjaar was die eerste keer dat individue vir die Visekanselierstoekening: Goud in aanmerking gekom het.

New crest launched

This month, Alumni Relations launches its new crest, which will “elevate the brand and create enthusiasm and a sense of pride in SU”.

The new branding incorporates the official SU crest, and, says Ms Bev Witten, Director: Alumni Relations, it links directly to the University and is therefore representative of all alumni.

According to Witten the new crest is also a symbol of the division’s new strategy to cultivate better relationships with alumni and getting them more involved in SU’s activities.

“We wanted to elevate the brand and give it a more sophisticated look. The new crest had to represent all alumni at all levels, increase loyalty and a feeling of nostalgia. They should feel proud of the institution they graduated from. We also want to establish a feeling of community among alumni,” she says.

Witten felt that the previous branding, MatiesAlumni, was not inclusive as it was tied with only sports and societies.

Alumni Relations has also started putting their new 5-point strategic framework into action, which are cultivation and

engagement, communication, volunteer management, early student engagement and alumni-giving.

“These strategies include initiatives geared towards alumni in order to raise enthusiasm for and interest in supporting their alma mater so that SU can remain a relevant, competitive institution that continues to build its knowledge and research,” Witten says.

Cultivation and engagement involves establishing, building and maintaining positive relationships, internally and externally.

“The past year we’ve had 35 alumni events in different locations around the world, more than double than that in previous years. It is all about connecting with our alumni and building relationships.”

Through communication, Alumni Relations wants to create a hub and interest groups among alumni on all platforms, including the social media.

“We also want alumni to contribute not only financially, but also through their talent and skills, thereby creating a peer-to-peer connection and a body of ambassadors for SU who will illuminate the work of the University and its impact in the

field of higher education,” explains Witten their strategy of volunteer management.

Early student engagement is the fourth leg of the strategy, which aims to involve students in alumni activities and interactions so that they would stay connected to SU after graduating. “Research has shown that if you do not connect with alumni within the first five years after graduation, you’ve lost them.”

With alumni-giving the division wants to increase participation in annual giving to SU. “We also want to create a culture of giving amongst current students by inviting them to join the Class Gift programme. It gives them an understanding that their collective contribution can make a difference,” Witten adds.

Sangdosent wen gesogte ATKV-kompetisie



NRF honours SU academics

Three top SU academics were recently honoured by the National Research Foundation (NRF) for their research excellence.

Prof Yusef Waghid, Dean of the Faculty of Education and Professor of Philosophy of Education has been honoured with the NRF Special Recognition Award for “Champion of Research Capacity Development at South African Higher Education Institutions” for 2011.

This award recognises an individual’s efforts in helping nurture the next generation of talented researchers.

Waghid is an elected member (fellow) of the Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf), executive member of the International Network of Philosophers of Education (INPE), and Editor-in-Chief of the South African Journal of Higher Education. His current research focuses on philosophy of education, democratic citizenship education, cosmopolitanism and higher education transformations.

Dr Cang Hui and Dr John Terblanche have both been awarded P-ratings, which is given on the basis of exceptional potential demonstrated in their published doctoral work and/or their research outputs.

Cang studied applied mathematics at Xi’an Jiaotong University and obtained his PhD in mathematical ecology in 2004 before joining SU later that same year to do his post-doctoral research on spatial pattern analysis.

In 2008 he joined the DST/NRF Centre of Excellence for Invasion Biology as a full-time researcher.

He has published more than 60 peer-reviewed papers in 25 journals as well as four book chapters in the field of ecology and applied mathematics.

Terblanche obtained a PhD in Zoology from SU. His work has provided the foundation for a variety of applications in the control of agricultural pests and pest-borne diseases. He also worked on the Tsetse Fly

Project and the Antarctic invertebrate survey.

He serves as a scientific advisor to the SA Department of Agriculture’s Genetically Modified Organisms Committee and has initiated a number of projects with industry partners such as Citrus Research International and the SA Sugar Research Institute.

'Tourists' in Stellenbosch

Responsibility Centre explores town's history

On Friday morning, 5 August, the managers at the Responsibility Centre (RC) of the Vice-Rector: Community Interaction and Personnel, Prof Julian Smith, took to the road on a special trip that renewed their ties as a unit and served as a reminder to them of the broader context within which they undertake their tasks at Stellenbosch University (SU).

"This initiative is a fourth in the series of giving RC management exposure to a variety of contexts," says Smith.

The most recent trip was conceptualised by Dr Jerome Slammat, Senior Director:

Community Interaction, and organised by Jacob du Plessis, Manager: Projects, also of Community Interaction.

"The idea was to expose our colleagues to different Stellenbosch contexts where they would meet people who would tell them about 'their Stellenbosch'," says Slammat.

The trip started at the Old Lückhoff School in Banhoek Road, where the group met Mr John Abels, a former bookbinder at both SU and UWC.

Abels was a pupil at Lückhoff

and regaled his visitors with tales of the school's colourful history, and of the relationship between SU and the local coloured community. He also proudly guided the group through the permanent photo exhibition housed in the building.

"Mr Abels can take you back in time and give Old Lückhoff a voice again. It's so enriching to be a tourist in your own work environment," said Monica du Toit.

The "tourists" then moved on to Idas Valley, a neighbourhood with its origins in the 1920s. Here they met up with Mr Otto van Noie, a

former teacher.

He told of the beginnings of Idas Valley, talked about the most important social, political and economic indicators of the area, and was

passionate about the potential of Idas Valley. Stops along the route were the "Red House" in Kahler Street, the Arts Barber Shop and Botmashoogte, the new SU residence.

Jackie Wiese, Director of Maties Sport, said, "There's so much about Stellenbosch's history that we are not aware of. Visits of this nature create the opportunity for greater understanding and insight for all our residents."

And then on to Kayamandi, established as an area for black people after a decision by the municipality in 1936.

The group met Bonez (Anga Bonongo) and Nompie (Nompiliso Katangana), development workers at Prochorus, a community-based organisation promoting social development in Kayamandi. Bonez and Nompie led a walk through the streets, during which they introduced the group to a computer class for adults and a crèche run by Prochorus at various points in Kayamandi. Lunch was served at Silusapho Homestay.

The last stop was the Pebbles Project on the farm Villieria, just outside Stellenbosch. Pebbles provides a preschool service to the children of farm workers from various farms.

The driving force behind Pebbles is Sophia Warner, a teacher for children with special needs who emigrated from the UK to South Africa six years ago.

She talked about the different initiatives of Pebbles and the important role of SU volunteers and service-learning students in the project. She also took the group to one of the Pebbles crèches.

The group returned to campus at the end of the day, unanimous in their praise of their special, outstanding experience.

"The excursion was so valuable and most informative, especially because it took place in and around our own town this time. We were very privileged to be introduced to people, activities and areas as well as points of view about the history of our town that, in the normal course of things, are often hidden away. These new insights and opportunities can only be to the benefit of the University," Smith said.

New Centre for Evidence-Based Health Care launched at Tygerberg

"Evidence-Based Health Care offers a transparent and rigorous approach to making health-care decisions. In the context of the quadruple burden of disease and limited resources, there is increased recognition of the importance of making decisions informed by the best available evidence," said Mr Theuns Botha, Western Cape Minister of Health at the launch of the Centre for Evidence-Based Health Care (CEBHC) at the Faculty of Health Sciences on 22 August 2011.

The Centre, the first of its kind in South Africa, will build capacity in EBHC, conduct relevant research, and will be active in promoting the use of best evidence in health-care policy and practice. This is achieved by producing reliable evidence assessments based on assessing and interpreting results from systematic reviews on specific questions, communicating the evidence and promoting its use by a variety of stakeholders, including the general public, the media, health professionals and policy makers.

Botha said the increasing demand for reliable evidence by policy-

makers and clinicians favours a climate in which the CEBHC can grow. He expressed his hope that the CEBHC will assist the government, non-governmental organisations and the private sector to make use of the best evidence in health-care policy and practice.

Prof Russel Botman, SU Rector, said the approach of evidence-based health-care teaches doctors and other health-care providers how to separate good research from poor quality research and in doing so make informed decisions on treatment.

"This approach fits in with how the University sees its role, and that of science, in society. Research at SU is guided by two notions – excellence and relevance. SU's scientists and academics have consistently excelled at producing useful research and technology. They have proven to be true experts – not only at generating and transferring knowledge, but also at applying it to the benefit of needy communities," Botman said.

Prof Jimmy Volmink, Dean of the Faculty, said the research at the CEBHC will focus on conducting high quality systematic reviews,

researching the barriers to and facilitators of the uptake of best evidence in health-care policy and practice, and testing strategies aimed at enhancing evidence-based decision-making.

"At the same time, our academics will enhance, teach and promote evidence-based health care at undergraduate and postgraduate levels. We are very proud of our record of combining global excellence and local relevance in the quest to improve the health of our nation and the continent.

"It has been widely recognised that Africa needs better health systems, but strengthening health systems must involve the necessary research to inform the targeting of resources and optimise service delivery," Volmink said.

The CEHBC works with national, regional and international collaborators including the Effective Health Care Research Consortium and the International Cochrane Collaboration. Dr Taryn Young has been appointed as the Director of the CEBHC.

Nuwe vleuel gee hoop

Met die opening van sy nuwe vleuel is die US se Regshulpkliniek nou gerat om van volgende jaar 'n selfs groter en beter diens aan gemeenskappe in en om Stellenbosch en op die platteland te bied.

Verlede maand het die Regshulpkliniek, geleë in Banhoekweg, 'n nuwe vleuel met vier nuwe kantore en 'n seminaarkamer geopen. Dit stel die Regshulpkliniek in staat om dubbel soveel studente te kan akkommodeer wat praktiese vaardighede in 'n regspraktyk wil opdoen. 'n Nuwe sentrum met 14 rekenaars is ook ingerig vir gebruik deur studente-konsultante wanneer hulle korrespondensie namens kliënte en pleistukke vir die hof moet opstel.

Die Regshulpkliniek, wat deel vorm van die US se HOOP Projek, het op 1 Julie 1988 sy deur geopen te Crozierstraat 20, met mev. Lutricia Roos as die eerste direkteur, waarna prof Etienne le Roux in 1990 as direkteur oorgeneem het. In 1995 het die Kliniek verskuif na sy huidige tuiste, die ou Lückhoff Skool in Banhoekweg.

Mnr Kruger van der Walt, huidige Direkteur van die Regshulpkliniek, vertel die Kliniek het oor die jare uitgebrei: "In Januarie 1999 was die Kliniek se begroting vir die

jaar R162 820, en was ek en 'n sekretaresse al personeel. Twintig finalejaar-LLB-studente het op vrywillige grondslag elk twee uur per week by die Kliniek kom werk en met kliënte gekonsulteer."

Tans is die Kliniek se begroting R3,2 miljoen, en daar is 23 personelede, met 32 studente wat praktiese ervaring daar kry.

Die Regshulpkliniek werk hoofsaaklik met sake oor uitsettings op plase, arbeidsgeskilte, gesinsgeweld, egskedings, skuldverligting en motorbotsings. Jaarliks word met sowat 4 000 kliënte gekonsulteer. Gratis regsdiens – insluitend regsadvies en hofverteenvoording – word aan behoeftiges verskaf, veral aan dié uit voorheen benadeelde gemeenskappe. In die proses word finalejaar-regstudente en kandidaat-prokureurs opgelei.

Seminare en werkwinkels word ook aangebied vir die polisie, gemeenskapsleiers, munisipale amptenare, en in Julie is juis 'n seminaar oor die werking en toepassing van die nuwe Kinderwet aangebied.

Met die nuwe vleuel sal die Regshulpkliniek van volgende jaar plek hê vir 64 studente, wat beteken die Kliniek sal selfs meer sake kan hanteer.

"Die Regshulpkliniek se voortbestaan is noodsaaklik, sodat ons hoop kan gee aan die minderbevoorregtes in ons omgewing deur funksionele, professionele gemeenskapsdiens," sê Van der Walt.

Thumbs up for SA's Antarctic history project

Although still in its early stages, the Antarctic Legacy Project, of which SU is part, has received the green light from international polar scholars.

The online databases being built as part of the project were showcased to researchers from ten countries who attended the 7th International Scientific Committee for Antarctic Research (SCAR) History Action Group workshop at SU. Once completed, researchers will have easy access to databases containing more than 100 000 pages of historical records, photographs and poignant stories about South Africa's presence in the Southern Ocean and the Antarctic region over the past six decades.

The Antarctic Legacy Project is run in association with the DST-NRF Centre of Excellence for Invasion Biology (CIB) based at SU, and the Department of Historical Studies and Animal Demography Unit at UCT. It is funded by the Department of Science and Technology through the National Research Foundation (NRF).

"This tool for polar historians and scholars from various disciplines will not only help to investigate South Africa's Antarctic research efforts, but will also ensure that work will be done on topics," Dr Cornelia Luedecke, Chair of the international SCAR History Committee, said.

South Africa, through SANAP, is the only African country with

South Africa, through SANAP, is the only African country with involvement in the Antarctic region.

involvement in the Antarctic region, and manages research bases on Antarctica, Gough Island and Marion Island.

"The current funding investment has been made to stimulate and develop research in the fields of social science, law and humanities within the context of the South African National Antarctic Programme, or SANAP," said Ms Candice Steele, Programme Director: Knowledge Fields Development at the NRF.

The bulk of the project will be completed by 2013, after which further funding will hopefully ensure the ongoing updating of the databases. They will include more than 100 000 historical records such as maps, drawings, photographs, slides, diaries and oral history interviews.

UCT researchers have thus far digitised more than 70 000 pages of relevant public records from the South African National Archives.

On their part, the CIB team is busy collating the private records and stories of South African scientists, artisans, engineers and mariners who have been involved in the annual resupply and scientific research efforts. This database will contain an estimated 30 000 photographs, documents and other materials.

"People who have worked in the region are more than willing to share the photographs and memories of their experiences with us," says social scientist and CIB researcher Ms Dora Scott of the support for the project.

HOPE in action

SU research leads to development plan

So often research just ends up on a shelf in a library, but a recent survey done in the town of Swellendam proved that research can be turned into action to develop communities.

The Railton Community Assessment Project (CAP) has produced results that were used to create an action-plan for community development, which will be implemented in the next year. Railton is a historically coloured community in Swellendam, and the action-plan is a direct result of a SU research project.

“With this project we connected research with action, rather than letting the findings end up on a shelf. It aims to build the strengths and resources of the community, which includes the structures, people, the natural environment, education and the inhabitants’ talents,” said Prof Tony Naidoo at the launch of this action plan in Swellendam at the end of July. Naidoo and Prof Sandy Lazarus led the research team.

Prof Russel Botman, SU Rector, said at the event this is proof of how

the University’s HOPE Project uses research to make a real difference in poor communities. Through HOPE initiatives like the Frederik Van Zyl Slabbert (FVZS) Institute for Student Leadership Development, SU will support development in Railton.

The Railton CAP began in 2009 as a joint undertaking by the Railton Foundation in the Netherlands (an organisation dedicated to the development of Railton) and SU to ascertain the needs and resources in the community and make recommendations for future development. The research was completed in November 2010. The team used a community-based participatory approach, in which workshops, questionnaires and interviews were used as method. In total 297 people from Railton shared their views about the community’s needs and assets.

These needs included, amongst others, food security, youth development, cultural activities and job opportunities. Among their assets were infrastructure, health services, the natural environment and human

talent. The respondents were asked about priority areas for community action, and they listed education, skills and youth development, housing and food security as some of their priorities.

These findings then shaped the researchers’ recommendations. Lazarus explained: “The recommendations link directly to the research. It is necessary for schools in Railton to work together. The talent of the youth should be nurtured, and, with the help of government structures, the infrastructure of the neighbourhood must be supported.”

Ms Ilze Olivier, who steers the

Railton Community Action Plan (RAICAP) along with Mr Herman Smit, said there are nine areas on which they will focus in the first twelve months. These are skills development and vocational training, sport, youth development, entertainment and relaxation, job creation and economic growth, social development, agriculture, safety and security, and tourism. Some of the outcomes will be the establishment of a sports and youth forum, the development of an annual district entertainment calendar, a soup kitchen, and building a place of safety.

The organisations that will help

with the implementation of the projects, include Journey Trails (youth development through exposing young people to the natural environment), SCORE South Africa (sport as means of youth development), Friends of Railton (a support organisation consisting of professionals who grew up in Railton), as well as SU’s FVZS Institute.

Naidoo and Lazarus said: “This is an excellent example of community-based participatory research, which has fully activated the principle of ‘action-research’, which emphasises the need for research to inform and facilitate action in the community.”

SU takes lead in rock dating in Africa

World-class additions to the rock-dating facility at SU now makes it easier and more cost-effective for South African geologists in academia and industry to find answers about the tectonic evolution and age of the African continent.

This is thanks to a new Thermo Element 2 HR-SF-ICP-MS, which has been installed as part of the Inductively Coupled Plasma Mass Spectroscopy Laboratory (ICP-MS) of the Central Analytical Facility (CAF). It was funded by the SU Strategic Fund and ALE Committee, and unveiled in the Department of Earth Sciences at an event sponsored by Thermo Scientific.

It is the only one of its kind in use for highly-precise and accurate geochronology in Africa, and one of

only a handful of similar ones around the world that are used to perform geochronological research in the academic sphere.

Geochronology is used to determine the absolute ages of the crystallisation of magmatic rocks such as granites, the formation of mountain belts such as the Alps, and the formation of mineral deposits such as diamond-bearing kimberlites.

The ICP-MS Facility is headed by Prof Dirk Frei, who recently joined SU from the Geological Survey of Denmark and Greenland. He is very impressed by the speed at which the new equipment can scan samples, and its “incredible sensitivity” to provide very accurate measurements of the samples being investigated.

Up to 600 age determinations

can be made per day, each taking less than a minute. This is done in an automated fashion, with each age determined from a drill hole only 15-20 thousandths of millimetres wide and less than 10 thousandths of a millimetre deep.

The new equipment extends the SU’s ability to geochronologically date minerals such as zircon, apatite and monazite at high spatial resolution on a commercial scale.

At the recent launch function, CAF director Prof Gary Stevens credited Prof Ian Buick of the SU Department of Earth Sciences and former CAF analyst Dr Chris Lana for their initial work in getting the rock-dating facility off the ground in 2010.

Book launch

First title in STIAS series published


The first book in a series of publications on lectures presented by the Stellenbosch Institute for Advanced Study (STIAS) was launched in August.

Archbishop Emeritus Desmond Tutu was the keynote speaker at the launch of the book *The Humanist Imperative in South Africa* on Thursday, 11 August, at the Wallenberg Research Centre on campus.

The book comprises 26 multidisciplinary essays and reflections originally presented at two symposia of the New Humanism Project held at STIAS in June 2009 and February 2010. Amongst the 28 contributing authors are leading academics and public figures, which include John de Gruchy (Editor), Neville Alexander, Russel Botman, Paul Cilliers, Hendrik Geyer, Jan-Hendrik Hofmeyr, Hans Huysen, Antjie Krog and Njabulo Ndebele.

The essays focus on the humanisms that have shaped our society and its constitution, what it means to be human beings together in South Africa, and issues of economic and social justice, human dignity and rights.

Prof De Gruchy, a STIAS Fellow, said in his opening address that he hoped the collection of essays in the book would make a contribution to

the wider debate in South Africa.

STIAS is aptly referred to as “a creative space for the mind” where top researchers and intellectual leaders find innovative and sustainable solutions to issues facing the world and, in particular, our country and Africa. It is moulded in the tradition of institutes for advanced study across the globe.

Prof Geyer, STIAS Director, said: “The STIAS series of publications are aimed at a broad public which will naturally vary with specific research themes. Straddling the academic world and the public forum of an engaging public is a challenge that STIAS accepts. We trust that each STIAS publication will reflect the “creative space for the mind” in

which it is rooted, stimulate public interest and debate, and contribute to informed decision-making at various levels of our society.”

In his speech at the launch Tutu describe *The Humanist Imperative in South Africa* as “crucial for our beautiful land”, and said that to be human is to be in relationship.

“The essays in this book all

underscore this fact. We are made for interdependence and for a relationship of ‘complimentarity’. I have gifts that you don’t and you have gifts that I don’t. No one can ever be fully human who claims to be self-sufficient,” Tutu said.

Lizette Rabe skryf boek oor Rykie van Reenen

Prof Lizette Rabe, hoof van die US se Departement Joernalistiek, het pas ’n boek oor die legendariese joernalis Rykie van Reenen (1923–2003) die lig laat sien: *Rykie, ’n lewe met woorde*.

In ’n tyd toe die meeste vroue óf onderwysers óf verpleegsters geword het, het Van Reenen vir haar ’n loopbaan in die joernalistiek oopgeskryf. Sy het Suid-Afrika se eerste vroulike oorlogskorrespondent geword toe sy die Jom Kippoer-oorlog in Israel gaan dek het.

In die 1960’s het sy naam gemaak as rubrieksrywer van “Van alle kante” in *Die Burger* en in die 1970’s vir “Op die randakker” in *Rapport*. Die rubrieke was sulke lekker

leesstof dat dit tot die volgende trappe van vergelyking aanleiding gegee het: “Ryk, ryker, Rykie”.

Van Reenen se fyn waarnemingsvermoë, wydbelesenheid en kreatiewe taalgebruik het haar in ’n klas van haar eie geplaas. Sy het geskryf oor kerksake, die politiek van die dag – dikwels stroomop – en het onderhoude met talle prominente Suid-Afrikers gevoer, van Hendrik Verwoerd tot Steve Biko.


Van Reenen word beskou in dieselfde liga as Piet Cillie en Schalk Pienaar en het ’n groot rol gespeel in die professionalisering van vroue-joernaliste. Sy het ’n eredoktorsgraad van haar alma mater, die US, ontvang.

Rabe se boek bevat detail oor Van Reenen

se tyd as Matie vroeg in die 1940’s. In 1999 is Media24 se sekonderingspos in die Joernalistiekdepartement na Van Reenen genoem. So leef haar naam voort onder nuwe generasies joernaliste.

Rabe het die eerste vrou geword wat as redakteur van ’n Afrikaanse publikasie by Naspers aangestel is toe sy in 1994 die leisels by *Sarie* oorgeneem het. In 2001 is sy akademies toe – as die eerste vrou aan die hoof van die US se Departement Joernalistiek.

De Beer is sedert 2006 aan die Konservatorium verbonde, en is ook artistieke direkteur van die akademiese koor Schola Cantorum. Hierbenewens is hy ook tans die dirigent van die Mecer Stadskoor Tygerberg, en het voorheen ook die Drakensberg Seunskoor, die Potchefstroomse Kamerkoor en die Noordwes Kinderkoor gelei.

Nadat De Beer sy studies in Potchefstroom

voltooi het, het hy sy meestergraad aan die Universiteit van Oslo, Noorweë, behaal, en sy DMus as deel van ’n samewerkingstudie tussen die NMMU in Port Elizabeth en die Noorweegse Staatsakademie vir Musiek in Oslo.

Hy tree gereeld as gasdirigent en beoordeelaar op, en is juis in Oktober in Riga, Letland, gasdirigent vir twee kore, waarna hy in November ’n beoordeelaar gaan wees vir ’n internasionale koorkompetisie in Maleisië, waar hy ook ’n koorwerkwinkel sal aanbied.

- Schola Cantorum tree op Woensdag 21 September om 20:00 in die Endlersaal op. De Beer en Byron-Mahieu van der Linde dirigeer die koor in werke van onder andere Mendelssohn, Rheinberger en Bach, asook die première van Roelof Temmingh se *Te Deum*. Van der Linde is die eerste meestersgraadstudent wat die nuutgestruktureerde kursus in koördinerings aan die US onder De Beer sal voltooi. Hierdie konsert sal ook as een van sy eksamens hanteer word.

Huldeblyk aan prof Paul Cilliers

Filosoof se werk móét voortgaan

Prof Paul Cilliers, bekende hoogleraar in kompleksiteit en filosofie aan die US, het einde Julie gesterf – kort nadat hy aangestel is as **Uitgelese Besoekende Professor in die Nagraadse Skool van die Universiteit vir Humanistiek (UvH) in Utrecht, Nederland.** Die musikus **HANS HUYSSSEN** bring hulde aan Cilliers.

Prof Paul Cilliers se heengaan op 31 Julie is vir sy kollegas en studente, die Universiteit en die hele land se akademie 'n ontsaglike verlies. Landswyd het talle doodsberigte verskyn met huldeblyke aan die filosoof en sy unieke bydrae tot die studie van kompleksiteit; die leraar wie se uitdagings aan sy studente net deur sy aanmoedigende toewyding oortref is; die kuns-, musiek- en literatuurkenner wat sy insigte ook hier met groot passie wyd en vrugbaar kon deel; die kok (wie se skeppings ek ongelukkig nie ervaar het nie, maar waarvan baie kan getuig); en die wetenskaplike wat verfynde metodes vir interdisiplinêre navorsing ontwikkel het. Kortom, die universele mens wat werklik besig was om 'n verskil te maak.

Dié wat Paul Cilliers geken en met hom gewerk het, is deur die nuus van sy onverwagse dood geskok soos wat 'n lelike vuishou jou tref. Hy was in vele opsigte 'n sleutelfiguur en het

te midde van 'n groot aantal projekte en verantwoordelikhede gestaan, waarvan die sukses tot 'n groot mate van sy entoesiastiese dog kritiese leiding sou afhang. Bo en behalwe sy professionele uitmuntendheid het sy menslikheid altyd uitgestaan. Vergaderings of gesprekke met Paul was nie net doeltreffend en vrugbaar nie, maar altyd goeie belewenisse – vriendelik, groothartig, skerpsinnig, gesellig. Dit was – soos ons nou eers werklik weet – uiters kosbare momente.

Paul se heengaan laat 'n gapende leemte in ons gemeenskap wat baie treurwerk sal verg om te verwerk. Die ander sy van die saak is egter dat hy met sy denke 'n werklik nuwe spatie geskep en gevul het, en in hierdie geval is sy heengaan 'n duidelike roeping om hierdie spatie – die veld van kompleksiteitsdenke – daadwerklik self te betree, dit

verder te ondersoek en ten bate van die gemeenskap en die wetenskap te ontgin.

Inderdaad het dit sedert Paul se dood in 'n besondere mate duidelik geword hoe verrykend en verreikend sy invloed werklik was: te midde

van die bedroefde skare wat sy heengaan betreur, sien ons mekaar meteens vir die eerste keer raak – almal wat voorheen hoofsaaklik op hom gefokus het omdat hy hulle op die een of ander manier geïnspireer het. En ons besef ons onderliggende samehörigheid en hoe onskatbaar ryk hy ons agterlaat.

Daar is geen vraag nie: Paul se werk moet voortgesit word, hoe

onbekwaam iedereen ook al in die lig van hierdie oorweldigende uitdaging voel. Dalk sou niemand dit regtig voorheen kon waag om self skouer aan die wiel te sit nie – nou moet ons. Op 'n besondere manier het Paul ook hiervoor voorsien.

In hierdie gees gaan die werk aan die Sentrum vir Studies in Kompleksiteit, wat hy saam met Jannie Hofmeyr gestig het, onverpoosd voort. Die kernaktiwiteit van hierdie navorsingsinisiatief is

'n interdisiplinêre kollokwium, nou onder leiding van Hofmeyr, waar studente, akademici en ander belangstellendes weekliks byeenkom om kerntekste in die veld van kompleksiteitsstudies te analiseer en krities te bespreek.

Die studiegroep is daaraan toegewy om die visioenêre werk van Paul Cilliers voort te sit – 'n boeiende en grondverskuivende onderneming.
