Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS)



Prof Elmi Muller. An internationally renowned surgeon, is the new Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS) at Stellenbosch University. She is an A1-rated researcher who performed the first HIV positive to positive kidney transplants in the world in 2008 and today serves on several international bodies to recognise her pioneering work. In addition to her MBChB and MMed (Surgery) degrees, she holds a PhD in surgery and an MBA. She is the first woman to lead the FMHS since its establishment in 1956. Prof Elmi Muller is married to Stephanus, a musicologist. They are parents to Willem and Johan.



Dr Theresa Fish currently holds the position of Vice Dean: Clinical Services and Social Impact at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences of the University of Stellenbosch. Critical aspects of her current work are the engagement with the public health sector, particularly the Western Cape Health Department and the National Health Laboratory Services, to optimise the relationship with the University for academic purposes. Nominated as co-ordinator by the 4 Universities, she led the team that delivered a new governance agreement between the department of health and the universities in 2012 and, in 2020, finalised the Bilateral Agreement between Stellenbosch University FMHS and the Western Cape Government: Health. She was instrumental in delivering the first Rural Clinical School in South Africa. She serves and has served on various committees at provincial and national levels as well as within the University structure dealing with governance in health and higher education, education and training in health and policy development, human capital strategy and planning, and civil society capacity

development. Since January 2022, she is a member of the Stellenbosch University Council. She has previously held the position of Senior Lecturer at the University of Stellenbosch Business School (USB). Before this, she worked as a medical doctor in the public health sector from 1987 until 1999. She has a Doctorate in Business Administration: Higher Education Management through the University of Bath (2021). She obtained the degree Master of Business Administration (cum laude) from the USB in 2001 and received the award "Best research project by an MBA student in the field of economics". She also completed a Health Policy and Planning course at the Nuffield Institute of Health in Leeds, UK, a Healthcare Financing Course at the Actuarial Department at UCT and a Diploma in Community Health at Stellenbosch Medical School. Her undergraduate degree is as a medical doctor (MBChB at the University of Cape Town).



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Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS)



Prof Portia J. Jordan is the Executive Head of the Department of Nursing and Midwifery, Stellenbosch University, South Africa. She holds a Ph.D. in Nursing, Master of Business Administration, and specialist qualifications in Critical Care - and Nephrology Nursing. Her research focuses on critical care nursing, evidence-based practice, and patient safety education in nursing. Nationally, she is the chairperson of FUNDISA (Forum for University Nursing Deans in South Africa), and a member of the Critical Care Society, Southern Africa. Internationally, she is a member of the Tau Lamda Chapter for Sigma Teta Tua International Honour Nursing Society (STTI) and an executive board member of the STTI Research and Advisory Council. Portia is also part of a global transformation forum in nursing education: a community of practice of nursing leaders and deans across seven (7) global nursing schools, that focus on evidence-based practice, patient safety initiatives, and quality of care.



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Presenters' Professional Biographies



Dr Charlène Heyns-Nell specialises in Neurofeedback and brain-based coaching to train the brain. She was the co-founder of iMed Tech biotech company optimizing access to breast prosthesis for breast cancer survivors. In 2020, she co-founded 3DIMO, a venture-backed agritech company that automates livestock data analytics to monitor livestock farms' productivity. In 2016, she was recognized as Africa's top female innovator in Africa by the World Economic Forum. She was awarded the South African Youth of the Year, 2017. In 2018, she was awarded Forbes Africa magazine's 30 under 30, and awarded Industrialist of the Year in Southern Africa at the All-Africa Business Leaders Awards. She was inducted as a Harambe Entrepreneurship class of 2018 fellow and Crans Montana fellow, 2019. Outside her work, she is an active hiker, writes love letters, designs toys and tabletop board games and currently learning to fly a Cessna 172.



Ms Doris Viljoen is the Director of the Institute for Futures Research (IFR) at Stellenbosch Business School, where she endeavours to interpret global as well as local trends and assess their relevance for South Africa and Africa. She has specialised skills in environmental scanning, the application of foresight methodology, scenario planning as well as strategy development. She has a wide range of research interests and is passionate about asking the right questions, searching for, finding relevant data, and designing tools and techniques to facilitate thinking about plausible futures. She is also a senior lecturer on the Stellenbosch Business School PGD and MPhil in Futures Studies.


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FMHS - Tygerberg International Office Secretariat

She endeavours to expand the international reach of FMHS and SU through growing existing partnerships and fostering new collaborative programmes and initiatives with academic and professional institutions worldwide.
