“Youth and Higher Education in South Africa”



Yusef Waghid is Distinguished Professor of Philosophy of Education in the Department of Education Policy Studies at Stellenbosch University. He joined Stellenbosch University almost two decades ago as Director of the Centre for Educational Development and has been full Professor of Philosophy of Education in the Department of Education Policy Studies since 2002. He was also Chair, and Dean of the Faculty of Education. He holds doctorates in the areas of Philosophy of Education (Western Cape), Education Policy Studies, and Philosophy (Stellenbosch). He is a fellow of the Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf), executive member of the International Network of Philosophers of Education, internationally acclaimed scholar with the National Research Foundation and is Editor-in-Chief of the *South African Journal of Higher Education*. His research interests focus on analytical and evaluative inquiry vis-à-vis democratic citizenship education, and cosmopolitan education focussing on teaching and learning, educational policy and higher education transformation (mostly in Africa).
