One of the most important announcements pertains to the *Travel Ban* - see specifically the section regarding returning students. Here follow official communication from Stellenbosch University: *"The University has imposed a temporary ban on all international travel for staff and students. This ban also extends to international guests visiting the University. The travel embargo will be in place until 30 June 2020.* **Staff and students who are abroad at the moment will have to self-quarantine for a period of 14 days when they return.** While the University cannot prohibit staff and students from traveling in their private capacity, we urge individuals to please act responsibly in making plans that involve international travel. On your return you will also be expected to self-quarantine for a period of 14 days. To limit the risk of the spread of COVID-19, staff and students who do contract the virus due to private travel, will not be allowed to return to work, class or a residence until they are medically fit to do so."

The Registration of South Africans Abroad (ROSA) is a service available to SA citizens. The information is confidential and will only be used by the Embassy and DIRCO to establish contact with citizens and next of kin in case of an emergency.



Currently the ROSA website is off-line indefinitely and all SA citizens traveling abroad are hereby advised to register with their local SA Mission/s abroad directly. Below you will find the contact information of the respective South Africa Representatives abroad.

Stellenbosch University Students Currently Abroad:

- It is very important to follow the instructions and recommendations of the host university. If you have specific questions about your exchange, you first need to consult your host university because they are best acquainted with their local environment. Please follow their recommendations and advice.
- If you decide to return home due a personal decision, request/recommendation from your host institution or the South African government, it is important to note that you will need to observe the 14 days of self-isolation. Entering South Africa from High Risk countries could mean that more steps will be required of you by the South African government.
- If you are planning to return home, please send an email to <u>exchange@sun.ac.za</u>.
- Students who are planning to return should carefully consult the travel information from the respective airlines and travel advisories of the South African government.

Stellenbosch University Students who planned to go on exchange in the first semester, but have not departed yet:

Due to the current travel ban of Stellenbosch University you will not be able to go abroad during the first semester. We therefore recommend two things:

- You can cancel your exchange
- Explore the option of rescheduling your exchange to the next semester.
