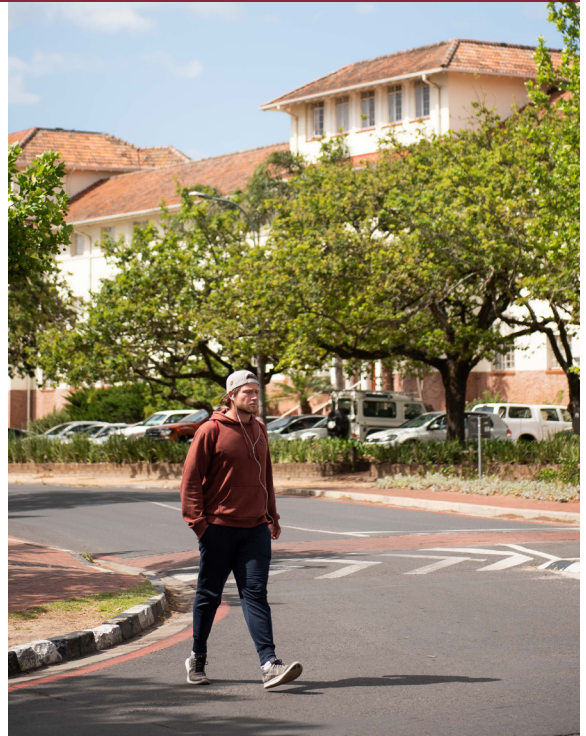
Stellenbosch University International stands ready to assist you, as an international undergraduate applicant, with the following:

2. GETTING STARTED

VISAS

All international students without South African citizenship will need a valid study visa. Your study visa application should be submitted in your country of origin before you travel to South Africa.

HEALTH INSURANCE

The South African Department of Home Affairs requires proof of medical cover registered with the South African Council for Medical Schemes in terms of the Medical Schemes Act, 1998, and paid annually for the duration of your studies. You will need this proof to be able to apply for your study visa and register at Stellenbosch University.

Please note that Stellenbosch University is not affiliated to any particular health insurance provider. Therefore, any health insurance will be accepted, as long as it is registered in South Africa. For information on health insurance providers, please visit www.sun.ac.za/international. We ask that you deal directly with the provider of your choice, and strongly encourage you to read the contents of your health insurance carefully.

NATIONAL BENCHMARK TESTS

It is compulsory for all candidates to write the National Benchmark Tests (NBTs).

Please visit the website www.nbt.ac.za, where you will find information regarding the dates and venues of these tests.

South African candidates must obtain at least 50% for the NBTs and the National Senior Certificate (NSC) jointly in a 40:60 ratio. However, if you have completed an international examination, and not the NSC, this ratio will not be applied, although you still need to complete the NBTs.

ACCOMMODATION

All international students are responsible for securing their own accommodation. Visit www.sun.ac.za/international for information on student accommodation options in the Stellenbosch area.

WELCOMING AND ORIENTATION

All full-degree first-year students participate in the official Welcoming Programme hosted by the Division of Student Affairs at the start of the academic year.

At the start of each semester, Stellenbosch University International also organises a special orientation programme for all new international students. You will need to register for this programme. Topics covered during orientation include the following:

A matriculation exemption is a legal requirement for first-degree study at a South African university. If you have completed an international curriculum or foreign schooling system, you will need to make sure that you meet the requirements for matriculation exemption set by Universities South Africa (USAf).

Please check that you meet the requirements for your chosen degree programme, and that you have attained the indicated grades in the subjects listed in this booklet, on the indicated levels, for example:

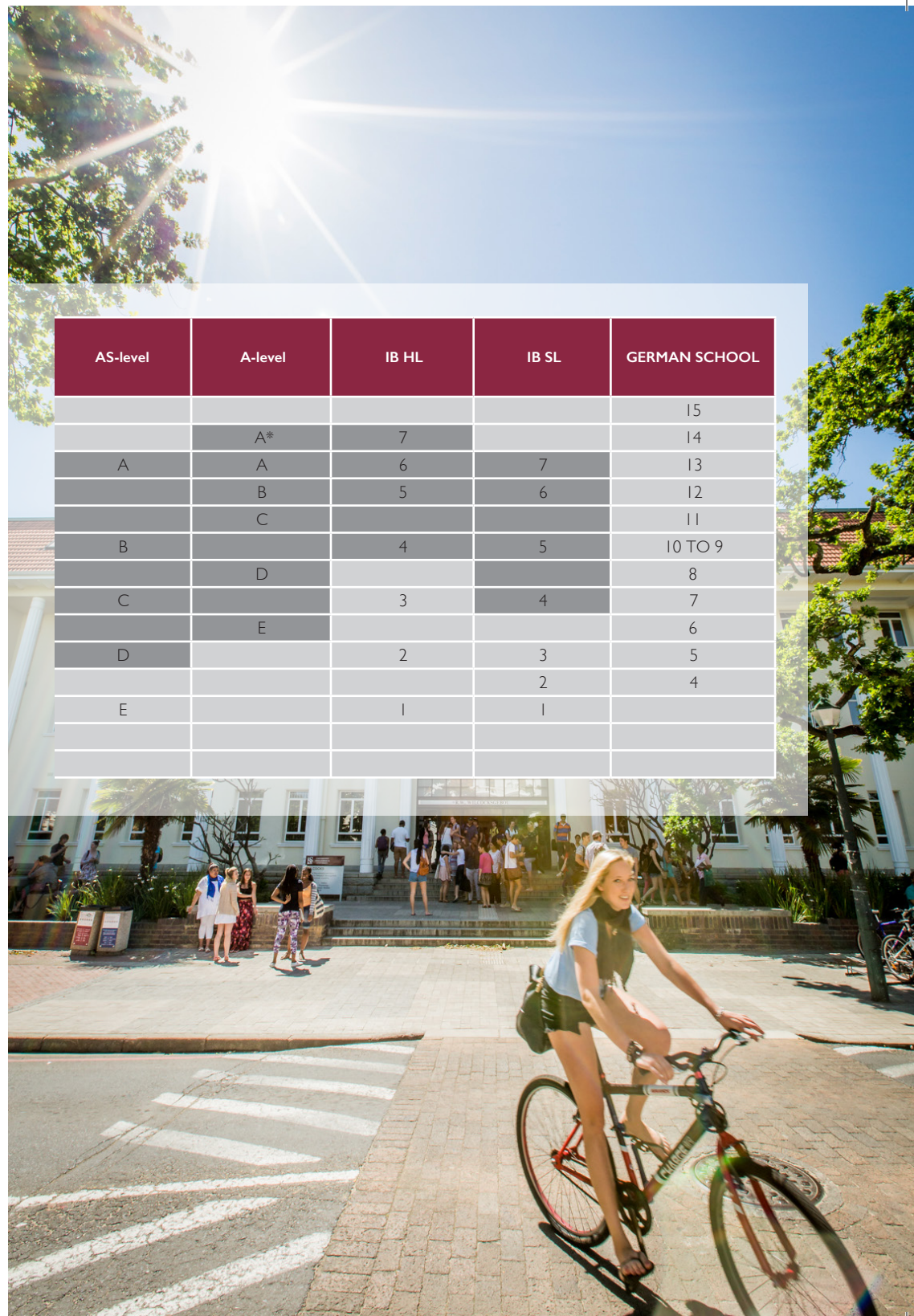

4.2 Requirements for students qualified in the USA system

If you are applying from the USA, you will need the following:

A High School Graduation Diploma, as well as a certificate of eligibility for admission to study at any USA university with a valid senior college accreditation issued by any of the following accreditation bodies:

- Accrediting Council for Independent Colleges and Schools (ACICS)
- Distance Education and Training Council (DETC)
- Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE)
- New England Association of Schools and Colleges – Commission on Institutions of Higher Education (NEASC-CIHE)
- North Central Association of Colleges and Schools – Higher Learning Commission (NCA-HLC)
- Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU)
- Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS)
- Western Association of Schools and Colleges – Accrediting Commission for Senior Colleges and Universities (WASC-ACSCU)

OR

A High School Graduation Diploma with at least two subjects passed at grades 3, 4 or 5 for the Advanced Placement (AP) examinations of the American College Board

OR

A SAT I score of 1 600, with a subminimum of 550 for Critical Reading and 500 for Mathematics

A SAT II score of 1 050 for English and either Physics or Chemistry, with a subminimum of 500 for either the English or one of the Physics, Chemistry, Biology or World History scores obtained at one or more sittings

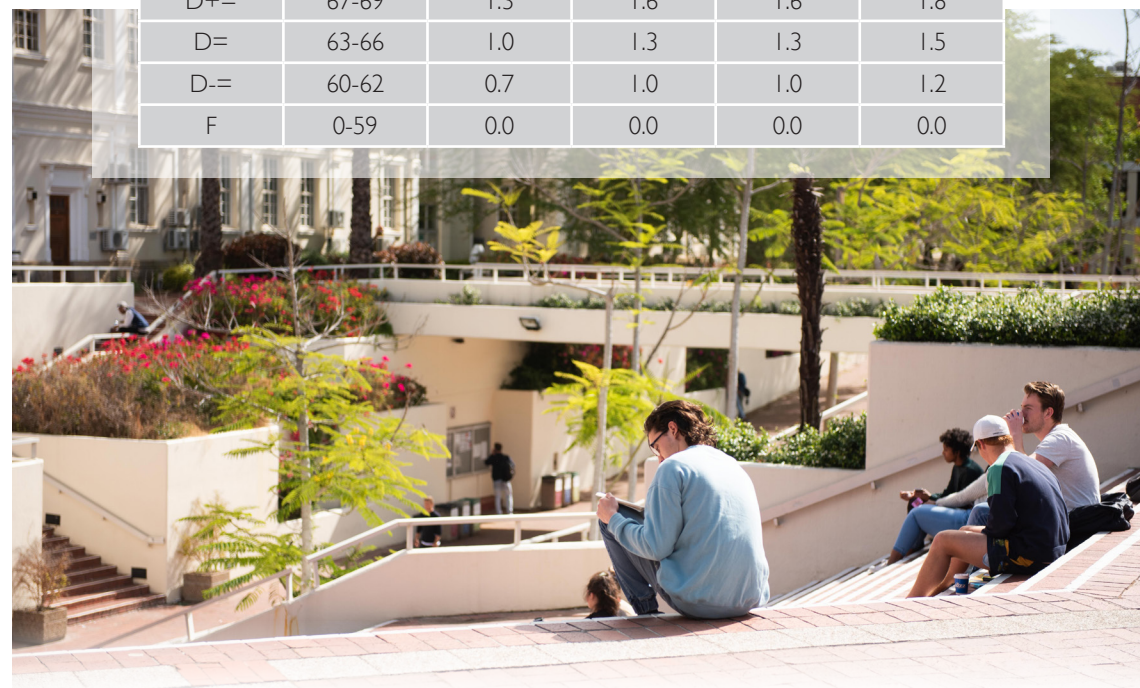

4.3 Matriculation exemption and admission requirements for students qualified in the Namibian system

4.3.1 Matriculation exemption

The matriculation requirements for candidates who completed school in Namibia are as follows:

Pass marks (1–3) in four different approved NSSC Higher Level subjects, and a pass mark (A–C) in one Ordinary Level subject selected from groups I and II, and two from groups III, IV and V in terms of paragraph 15 of the South African Matriculation Board's regulations:

Group I:	An approved first language
Group II:	An approved second language
Group III:	An approved third or foreign language that is not offered under group I or II, Biology, Chemistry, Mathematics, Physical Science or Physics
Group IV:	Art and Design, Biology (if not offered under group II), Chemistry (if not offered under group III), Economics, Geography, History, Mathematics (if not offered under group III), Music, Physical Science (if not offered under group III) or Physics (if not offered under group III).
Group V:	Accounting, Business Studies, Computer Studies, or Design and Technology

Higher Level subjects from Group V must be accompanied by a pass in Mathematics on at least Ordinary Level.

If you are unsure whether you qualify for matriculation exemption, please contact the South African Matriculation Board directly. Stellenbosch University reserves the right not to consider a candidate who cannot provide proof of matriculation exemption.

4.3.2 Stellenbosch University programme-specific requirements

South Africa's National Senior Certificate (NSC) no longer consists of subjects on different 'levels' such as Higher Grade and Standard Grade. It now offers only one level that is comparable to the former Higher Grade. This has the following implications for students from Namibia:

Please do not downgrade to Ordinary Level in subjects that are required for admission.

NB: English must be HL on either 1st language or 2nd language level.

A GUIDE TO PERCENTAGE UNIFORM MARKS

This factsheet is a guide for schools in countries where percentage uniform marks appear on statements of results for Cambridge IGCSE, Cambridge O Level and Cambridge International AS & A Level.

We provide the percentage uniform mark as well as the grade for a syllabus. The percentage uniform mark is not the total mark achieved for the syllabus. It is a point on a common scale for all syllabuses to show whether the candidate's performance is close to the top, middle or bottom of the grade.

For example, a student who gets the minimum mark necessary for a Grade A* obtains a percentage uniform mark of 90. A student who gets a mark halfway between the Grade D threshold and Grade C threshold achieves a percentage uniform mark of 55.

We do not provide a percentage uniform mark when the candidate's result is Ungraded, No Result, Pending or To Be Issued. The table below shows the percentage uniform mark range for each grade:

[†] In the case of the Cambridge International AS Level qualification, where there is no Grade 'a*', the percentage uniform mark range for Grade 'a' is 80–100.



The percentage uniform mark is stated at syllabus level only. It is not the same as the actual total mark that the candidate achieves on the syllabus. This is because the percentage uniform mark depends on both the actual total mark for the syllabus and the position of the grade thresholds (which may vary from one exam series to another and from one syllabus to another). The percentage uniform mark is also different from the actual mark because it is always calculated out of 100.

The key messages for students are:

- the percentage uniform mark shows you whether you are in the middle of a grade, or near either the top or the bottom
- it does not affect the grade you receive, but gives you more information about it
- it will appear on your statement of results but not on your certificate.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Are percentage uniform marks the same as the Uniform Mark Scale (UMS) used by UK exam boards? Our percentage uniform mark scale uses the same approach as UMS. However the UMS is not always shown as marks out of 100, whereas our percentage uniform marks are always out of 100.

Do percentage uniform marks appear on Cambridge certificates? No. They are published on the statement of results to supplement the grade issued at syllabus level.

Explanatory Notes

This is a General Certificate of Education (GCE) statement of results for Advanced Subsidiary Level (AS Level) and Advanced Level (A Level) Cambridge International Examinations (CIE) to be used by the candidate. Results will be confirmed by the date of completion.

GCE AS Level results are reported on a 5-point scale of grades: A, B, C, D, E or U, with grade A being the highest and grade U the lowest. The lowest grade awarded is a GCE AS Level grade of E. A grade of U indicates that the candidate has not achieved a grade of E or above.

GCE A Level results are reported on a 5-point scale of grades: A, B, C, D, E or U, with grade A being the highest and grade U the lowest. The lowest grade awarded is a GCE A Level grade of E. A grade of U indicates that the candidate has not achieved a grade of E or above.

The last Advanced Subsidiary or Advanced Level grade awarded is the grade at which the result was awarded for the syllabus.

The statement of a language syllabus (Spanish, French or German) will show the candidate's result in the language of the syllabus. Candidates who are UNGRADED in the language component will have no result of their speaking performance printed on their statement of results or certificate.

UNGRADED indicates a standard below that required for grade U for GCE AS Level and grade E for GCE A Level.

NO RESULT indicates that a result cannot be issued because of absence for the whole or part of the examination in the syllabus or because of a candidate not being a valid candidate for the syllabus.

PENDING indicates that a result cannot be issued at present but will follow in due course.

The Percentage Uniform Mark for GCE AS Level and GCE A Level is provided as a guide to the grade for a syllabus. The Percentage Uniform Mark is not the final mark awarded for the syllabus. It is a common scale for all subjects to show whether the candidate's performance is close to the top, bottom or middle of the grade. The final grade is a Percentage Uniform Mark which the candidate's result is compared to the final or final.

Only syllabuses in which GCE AS Level grades (A to E) and GCE A Level grades (A to E) are awarded will be reported on certificates.

CAMBRIDGE ASSESSMENT – INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION

A GUIDE TO A* - G AND 9-1 GRADES

Cambridge IGCSE is graded A* - G, Cambridge O level is graded A* - E. Both grade sets are well established, widely used systems that universities, parents and schools know to trust. In August 2017, some GCSE results in England will be reported on a different, 9-1 grading scale. On this scale, 9 is the top grade.

UK GCSEs and Cambridge IGCSEs have been reported on an A* - G grading scale for almost 30 years and offer a good level of differentiation between students' performance. The grading scale is understood and accepted by universities and employers around the world.

ARE CAMBRIDGE CONTINUING TO USE A* - G GRADING?

Yes. We asked Cambridge schools worldwide for their views on our grading scale. The majority of our schools told us that they want to retain A* - G grades, because they are so well understood. We will continue to consult with Cambridge schools.

WHAT ARE 9-1 GRADES?

9-1 grades have been introduced by the UK government for GCSEs in state schools in England. Under this system, 9 is the top grade. You can see how the A* - G grades compare with the 9-1 scale in the infographic on the right. See table below

Students in England will receive 9-1 grades for GCSE English, English Literature and Maths, in August 2017. 9-1 grading in other subjects will follow in later years.

A* - G GRADE FACTS AND FIGURES

Our A* - G grading is used in over 145 countries in over 6000 schools around the world

Over 800 000 Cambridge IGCSEs are awarded A* - grades by Cambridge every year

All students in England taking GCSEs in 2017 will receive A* - G grades in all but three subjects

WILL STUDENTS OUTSIDE ENGLAND RECEIVE 9-1 GCSE GRADES?

Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland are not adopting 9-1 grading. Some other exam boards offering international GCSEs plan to introduce 9-1 grades.

Will students applying to university with A* - G graded IGCSEs be treated differently to students with 9-1 grades?

No, universities have made it clear that they will treat students with 9-1 grades and students with A* - G grades equally. Some UK universities require a C grade at GCSE in Maths and English. Under the 9-1 grading system some universities will use the new grade 5 as an equivalent while other will use grade 4.
