## Dear EMS student

The new academic year is around the corner!

We are writing to you to convey important information about the Faculty's teaching and learning offering in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester starting 15 March. We also want to highlight the COVID-19 Protocol for students. This is an extremely important document that you must study before classes begin. All students will be expected to follow the protocol.

## SEMESTER 1 OF 2021: TEACHING AND LEARNING OFFERING

The Faculty of Economic and Management Sciences will use the Augmented Remote Teaching, Learning and Assessment (ARTLA) approach for its undergraduate offering. This means that a combination of face-to-face (f-t-f) and online learning opportunities will be provided synchronously (i.e. in real time) and/or asynchronously (not in real time). The Excel sheet on the EMS website (<u>www.sun.ac.za/ems</u>) provides details for each undergraduate module as well as a summary of the definitions used in the Excel sheet.

In short:

- Most modules will follow an augmented (options 1 3) approach. If more than one column is
  indicated in the Excel sheet, it means that the module's teaching and learning offering will
  include a combination of the various formats, as indicated in the definitions.
- Most of the assessments (and specifically the main assessments) will be **invigilated (sit down** face-to-face) assessments on the Stellenbosch campus.
- Most students will have the opportunity for face-to-face contact with the lecturer on a
  rotational basis. For smaller classes this can be once a week for example and for larger classes
  it might be slightly less often. More synchronous contact opportunities will be possible via inperson consultations / MS Teams / Adobe connect as well during appointments and other
  scheduled timeslots.
- The class size, number of timetable slots, venues assigned, and module content will influence decisions regarding the nature and frequency of contact time.
- Lecturers will communicate via SUNLearn to indicate contact opportunities, so please consult your SUNLearn pages regularly. Please note that you must **not** come to class in person unless you have been instructed to do so by your lecturer via SUNLearn.

## **COVID-19 PROTOCOL FOR STUDENTS**

The Faculty has developed a comprehensive set of student protocols (together with SU's protocol) to safeguard staff and students on campus.
