The Residential School was funded by the Centre for African Studies (University of London) and the Mo Ibrahim Foundation.

⁴ The African Programme for Rethinking Development (APORDE) is a high-level training programme in development economics with the goal to build capacity in economics and economic policy-making. The course ran 6 to 21 September 2012. Talented academics, policy makers and civil society representatives from Africa, Asia and Latin America were exposed to alternatives to mainstream thinking with the objective to foster and nurture original thinking in the fields of development economics, including industrial policy, inequality, poverty, financial crises and social policy. Participants received intensive high-level training and interacted with many of the best development economists in the world and with other participants. These economists included Alejandro Nadal (El Colegio de Mexico); Ben Fine (SOAS, University of London); Bill Freund (CSID, University of the Witwatersrand); C.P.
