

CORNELLE YOUNG

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Cornelle has been part of Stellenbosch University's Department of Nursing and Midwifery lecturing staff on an ad hoc basis since 2009, teaching Research Methodology to undergraduates on the common teaching platform of the University of Western Cape, as well as supervising Masters students at Stellenbosch University. In 2014 she was appointed as a full-time contract lecturer, and her duties included teaching Ethos and Professional practice on the Postgraduate Diploma programme to all the postgraduate students until the closure of the legacy programs in 2020. Her duties since then still includes teaching Ethics to the structured Masters' students in their first year, with continued supervision of Masters students.

After appointed to a permanent full-time position in 2017, she had the added duties of teaching Human Resource Management on the Postgraduate Diploma in Nursing and Health Services Management. In 2020 she became the program manager for this course and developed the curriculum for the new 2022 Postgraduate Diploma in Health Services Management. She will be responsible for teaching the core module of Praxis for all the Postgraduate Diplomas in the Department, and the specialty modules of Human Resource Management and Risk Management and Finances in the new 2022 curriculum.

Cornelle has completed her D Litt et Phil degree in Mixed Methodology on the topic of Quality of Work Life of Nurse Educators teaching at South African Universities. The thesis was completed with a Mixed Methodology, and also relates to the topic of Industrial Psychology.

She has successfully supervised a total of eleven Masters degrees for Stellenbosch University, and one for Unisa, with two of the Stellenbosch students obtaining the Elsevier award for highest marks obtained for their theses. Cornelle manages supervision of both Quantitative and Qualitative Masters studies, and is currently supervising six Masters' students and co-supervising three PhD students. with mixed methods approaches. Cornelle has marked seven Master's degree theses in the M Cur as well as the M Phil programmes of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences at Stellenbosch University. Furthermore, she has been asked to mark Masters' theses for the Northwest university.

Cornelle regularly review abstracts for conferences, such as for the early Career Conference Grants for the Association of Commonwealth Universities in the United Kingdom of Britain, for Sigma Tetha Tau International conference presentations, as well as for local conferences for the Forum of University Deans of South Africa (FUNDISA)/Nurse Educators Association (NEA) and for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) conference at Stellenbosch University. Cornelle also serves on the regional Western Cape board for the South African Association of Health Educators (SAAHE), with duties towards perusing abstracts for presenters for their annual conference, and serving on their Media Portfolio. Other interests and associations is being a member of the Deans Advisory Committee for Environmental Sustainability (DACES) on the campus, and a committee member for the new Sigma Teta Tau International Society, Chi Omnicron at Large in the Western Cape.
