#### **Programme description**

The Doctorate in Philosophy (Physiotherapy) requires the submission of a full research dissertation that meets the requirements for doctoral studies as defined by Stellenbosch University guidelines.

The PhD is awarded in recognition of highquality, original research that makes a significant contribution to the field of study. The dissertation shall reflect original research on one central cohesive topic or theme.

At the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS), when an applicant is selected into the PhD programme, the applicant will first be registered for the preparatory Doctoral year. Full PhD registration is initiated when your research proposal has been approved by the Departmental proposal review committee. During your registration you will have access to various developmental workshops, courses and information and capacity development programs offered by Stellenbosch University.

#### **Duration of programme**

The minimum duration of PhD registration is two years, and the maximum duration is five years.

#### **Admission requirements**

You can be admitted to the degree PhD in Physiotherapy if you have obtained a Master's degree in a relevant field as deemed sufficient by Senate. Admission is subject to approval by the programme committee.


