STRUCTURED MASTERS

Orthopaedic Manipulative Therapy : The course has been developed according to the guidelines of the **International Federation of Manipulative Physical Therapists (IFOMPT)**. The program aims to equip students with advanced knowledge and skills with emphasis on evidence based practice.

Course duration: Two years part-time
(Course commencement: February)
Contact sessions: 3 times per year (each 2 weeks)
Time spent on:
Theory 240 hours
Practical skills 150 hours
Clinical 160 hours

- Lecturing staff and clinical placements are accredited according to criteria recommended by the OMTG of SASP and the Division of Physiotherapy, Stellenbosch University.
- Physiotherapists with advanced qualifications and skills in a particular field of OMT are co-opted for tutoring on the programme.

Admission Criteria:

- A four-year bachelor's degree in Physiotherapy, or an equivalent qualification approved by Senate; **and**
- Registered as a Physiotherapist/ Physiotherapy student with the South African Health Professions Council; **and**
- Provide evidence of successful completion of (OMTI) course; **or**
- Appropriate clinical experience & continuing professional education.



RESEARCH MASTERS

(Students are encouraged to work within the divisional research focus area)

Course duration: Two year part-time or one year full-time.

Admission Criteria:

- A four-year bachelor's degree in Physiotherapy, or an equivalent qualification approved by Senate;
- and**
- Registered as a Physiotherapist/ Physiotherapy student with the South African Health Professions Council.

(Students are encouraged to work within the divisional research focus area)

Course duration: Minimum two year duration
