Die Fakulteit Geneeskunde en Gesondheidswetenskappe van die Universiteit Stellenbosch het 'n lang en trotse geskiedenis van geneeskunde en gesondheidswetenskappe navorsing wat strek oor 'n tydperk van meer as 60 jaar. Van 'n nederige begin, het die Fakulteit gegroei tot een van die top gesondheidswetenskappe fakulteite op die Afrika-kontinent, 'n leidende navorsingsintensiewe instelling met uitgebreide internasionale samewerking, bykomend tot sterk nasionale en plaaslike vennootskappe. Ons visie is om gesondheid en gelykheid te bevorder in Suid-Afrika en elders, en ons doen dit, onder andere, met ons navorsing, deur middel van die ontdekking, deel en oordrag van kennis wat gesondheid en ontwikkeling bevorder. Die Fakulteit se strategiese navorsingsfokusareas (nl Infeksiesiektes, Nie-oordraagbare Siektes, Geestesgesondheid en Neurowetenskappe, Geweld, Beserings, Trauma en Rehabilitasie, Moeder- en Kindergesondheid, en Gesondheidsisteme Versterking) is uniek belyn met beide plaaslike en internasionale gesondheidsprioriteite en deur middel van hierdie temas en die gepaardgaande navorsingsgroeperings, eenhede, sentrums en instellings binne ons Fakulteit, streef ons daarna om die belangrike gesondheidsuitdagings vir die Afrika-kontinent aan te spreek. Dit verseker dat die Fakulteit se navorsingsaktiwiteite 'n verskil maak aan die gesondheid en welstand van ons samelewing as 'n geheel.

PROF CLAIRE PENN

Title: Advice to the young South African scientist



Professor Claire Penn is a Professor and Chair of Speech Pathology and Audiology, and Director of the Health Communication Research Unit of the University of the Witwatersrand. Prof Penn is a National Research Foundation A-rated scientist who conducts research on health communication, including adult and paediatric HIV/AIDS interactions (verbal and non-verbal), ARV pharmacy interactions, informed consent in clinical trials, genetic counselling interactions, interpreting practices, interprofessional communication, efficacy of communication training for HIV counsellors, cultural beliefs and understanding of diseases. She was awarded the Order of Mapungubwe in Silver in 2007 for her excellent contribution to the field of speech and language pathology, especially in the area of linguistics, sign language, child language, aphasia and head injury and for producing ground-breaking research in understanding the complexities of human communication. She has been a visiting scholar to several international institutions such as Macquarie University in Sydney, Australia, and Case Western Reserve University in the United States, and Adjunct- and Honorary Professor to Edith Cowan University (Australia) and University of Groningen (Netherlands), respectively. In 2008 Prof Penn was named Shoprite Checkers / SABC 2 South Africa Woman of the Year for Science and Technology and in 2010 she was joint winner of the Department of Science and Technology Distinguished Woman Scientist award, amongst others.

AJ Brink State of the Art Lecture 1

Prof Helena Kuivaniemi (Division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics)

Title: From single-gene diseases to large scale collaborative studies on complex disorders



Prof Helena Kuivaniemi was born and raised in Finland and graduated from the University of Oulu with MD and PhD degrees. She received postdoctoral training at Rutgers Medical School, New Jersey, USA, and then held faculty positions at Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia, Wayne State University School of Medicine in Detroit, and at Geisinger Health System in Danville, USA. Prof. Kuivaniemi is a human geneticist with experience in studying both rare and common human diseases. Before joining the FMHS at Stellenbosch University in 2016 she worked on abdominal aortic aneurysms for nearly 20 years focusing on genetic studies to identify susceptibility loci. She has over 200 publications. At FMHS, Prof. Kuivaniemi is involved in neurogenetic and psychiatric genetics research projects. During the past 2 years she has also helped to put together over 20 grant applications to international funding agencies including the National Institutes of Health in the USA and the Wellcome Trust in the UK.

Prof Jonathan Carr (Division of Neurology)

Title: A novel gene (PTRHD1) resulting in a Parkinsonian Syndrome



Prof Jonathan Carr trained at the University of Cape Town, and subsequently did a residency in Neurology at the Mount Sinai Medical Centre in New York. After completing an MSc in the genetics of Juvenile Myoclonic Epilepsy, he started working at Tygerberg Hospital and the University of Stellenbosch in 1993, where he has been ever since. On the background of a long-standing history in interest in movement disorders, he did a fellowship at the University of British Columbia in 1999, and subsequently spent sabbatical leave working on fMRI at the Scottish Brain Imaging Research Centre of the University of Edinburgh, and obtained his Ph.D. in 2009. He currently serves on the Africa Task Force committees of the Movement Disorder Society, and is associate editor of the journal Parkinsonism and Related Disorders. He is the author of more than 50 peer-reviewed articles, and is a member of the consortium, Genetic Epidemiology of Parkinson's disease, GEO-PD.

Prof David Meyer (Division of Ophthalmology)

Title: Intralesional Bleomycin in Ophthalmological Tumors: the Stellenbosch Experience



Prof David Meyer has been the chairman and Head: Division of Ophthalmology, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences and Tygerberg Academic Hospital since 1994. Currently he also serves as the Executive HoD, Department of Surgical Sciences. He is a fellow of both the College of Ophthalmology and the College of Family Physicians of the CMSA. His PhD research was in Pharmacology with the thesis: "A Critical Appraisal of the Etiology of Adult Human Lenticular Opacification and an Investigation into the role of Metabolic Factors in its Pathogenesis" Prof Meyer was President of the College of Ophthalmologists and Senator of the Colleges of Medicine of South Africa for 6 years. He has authored/co-authored 85 scientific peer reviewed papers and published abstracts, 23 chapters in books, book editor of 3 books, current reviewer for 34 scientific journals, member of the editorial board of 3 journals and Associate Editor for one journal. He has been the promoter for 26 Masters dissertations and 4 PhD degrees with 157 national and international lectures and congress papers/posters presented. His special clinical interests include — oculoplastic, orbit and lacrimal surgery, neuro-ophthalmology, adult strabismus and ocular oncology.

Dr Prenavum Naidoo (Department of Paediatrics and Child Health)

Title: Evaluating the Impact of an Xpert® MTB/RIF-based TB Diagnostic Algorithm in a Routine Operational Setting in Cape Town



Dr Pren Naidoo works part-time as a clinical advisor at the Desmond Tutu TB Centre (DTTC) and for the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation. She managed the HIV/AIDS and TB Programmes for the City of Cape for several years. Whilst at DTTC she has led the PEPFAR TB HIV Integration Project, a health system strengthening initiative and the Operational Research Assistance Project (ORAP). This experiential learning project developed the capacity of research teams from all nine provinces to undertake operational research to improve the quality, performance and outcomes of the TB programme. She was the principal investigator on PROVE IT (Policy Relevant Outcomes from Validating Evidence on ImpacT), a study assessing the impact of molecular diagnostic tests on TB and MDR-TB diagnosis and treatment initiation at primary health facilities in Cape Town. She is a co-chair of the Implementation and Service Delivery Working Group of the National TB Strategic Think Tank and a board member of The Networking HIV/AIDS Community of South Africa (NACOSA).

Prof Adrie Bekker (Department of Paediatrics and Child Health)

Title: Prevention and treatment of perinatal and infant tuberculosis in the HIV era



Prof. Adrie Bekker is a neonatologist in the Department of Paediatrics and Child Health at Stellenbosch University, Cape Town, South Africa. She has an interest in neonatal infectious diseases, was awarded a national research foundation C3 rating and completed her PhD at the University of Stellenbosch in 2016. Her PhD research focused on the prevention and treatment of perinatal and infant TB, which included novel pharmacokinetic (PK) work of TB drugs in neonates and infants. She is currently vice-chair of an international IMPAACT study that characterizes the PK of antiretroviral and antituberculosis drugs in low birth weight (LBW) infants. In 2017, she was awarded the prestigious Collaborative Initiative for Paediatric HIC Education and Research (CIPHER) fellowship to further her pharmacology and statistical abilities towards safe and effective dosing of antiretrovirals within this vulnerable population

Dr Angela Dramowski (Department of Paediatrics and Child Health)

Title: Small patients, big challenges: stories in paediatric infection prevention



Dr Angela Dramowski is a Paediatric Infectious Diseases specialist with a passion for infection prevention. Her doctoral research focused on the epidemiology and determinants of healthcare-associated infection in hospitalized South African children. In 2018, Angela will begin a 4-year NIH-funded research study to develop a neonatal sepsis prevention care bundle for low-resource settings. She serves on the boards of several non-profit organisations including the Infection Control Africa Network, Bettercare and TB Proof and is deputy editor of the BMC journal Antimicrobial Resistance and Infection Control.
