

PROF CLIFTON E BARRY III

Title: Oxazolidinones for the treatment of TB: past, present and future



Professor Clifton E. Barry III received his Ph.D. in organic and bio-organic chemistry in 1989 from Cornell University, studying the biosynthesis of complex natural products. Following postdoctoral research in the chemistry department at Johns Hopkins University (1989 to 1992), Dr. Barry joined the Intramural Research Program of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases' (NIAID's) Rocky Mountain Laboratories in Hamilton, Montana. In 1998, he was tenured as chief of the Tuberculosis Research Section (TRS) in the Laboratory of Clinical Infectious Diseases of NIAID. The TRS is a multidisciplinary group of research scientists comprised of biologists, chemists and clinicians who share a common focus on TB. TRS projects focus on understanding the scientific issues that facilitate the development of drugs that will make a difference in the outcome for TB patients globally. TRS scientists are highly interactive worldwide in this endeavor and as a result of its outstanding collaborations TRS is the most highly cited TB research group in the world according to Thomson Reuters. Dr Barry has authored over 250 publications in the scientific literature and has an h-index of 77. In addition to TRS laboratories in Bethesda, TRS works closely with the International Tuberculosis Research Center located in Masan, South Korea; with Chinese colleagues at the Henan Provincial Chest Hospital in Zhengzhou, China; and with colleagues at Stellenbosch University (SUN) and the University of Cape Town (UCT) in South Africa. Dr. Barry holds honorary appointments at UCT and SUN and has a growing laboratory in the Institute for Infectious Disease and Molecular Medicine.

Dr Kerrin Begg (Division of Health Systems and Public Health)

Title: A National Quality Strategic Framework for South Africa – an Imperative for NHI



Dr Begg attained her MBChB at the University of Cape Town in 1994, a Diploma in Child Health in 1996 and a Diploma in Obstetrics in 1997. She obtained her Fellowship in Public Health Medicine (CMSA) in 2002. Her interests lie in health strategy, health policy, health systems strengthening, health leadership and management, mentorship and coaching, performance processes, organisational design and organisational culture. Dr Begg is currently Programme Co-ordinator for the newly launched Postgraduate Diploma in Healthcare Management, and Senior Lecturer in the Division of Health Systems and Public Health, at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences at Stellenbosch University. She served as Activity Lead for the Quality Improvement and Data component of SUCCEED (Stellenbosch University Collaborative Capacity Enhancement through Engagement with Districts), a response to the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) call for South African University-based technical assistance aimed at improving the quality and sustainability of HIV/AIDS and related services in South Africa under PEPFAR through targeted capacity strengthening.

Dr Novel Chegou (Division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics)

Title: Biomarkers for Tuberculosis: Towards the Development of Field-Friendly Pointof-Care Tests.



Dr Chegou is currently a Senior Researcher in the Immunology Research Group, Division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics, Department of Biomedical Sciences, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, at Stellenbosch University. He was trained as a Medical Laboratory Scientist at the Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Buea, in Cameroon. After working briefly as a laboratory scientist in hospital laboratories, he moved to South Africa, where he enrolled as a BSc. Honours student here at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences in the 2005 academic year. His BSc Honours studies were then followed by MSc (upgraded to PhD), Ph.D (2009) and post-doctoral studies in the field of Tuberculosis Immunology. Dr Chegou is an Infectious disease immunologist and his research work focuses particularly on tuberculosis immunology. He is currently working on biomarkers for the diagnosis of tuberculosis disease, biomarkers of protective immunity against Mycobacterium tuberculosis and biomarkers for monitoring of the response to tuberculosis treatment amongst others. He is particularly interested in the development of simple, field-friendly point-of-care diagnostic tests for the rapid diagnosis of TB disease as well as monitoring of the response to treatment in resourceconstrained settings. He has co-authored 48 publications in peer-reviewed international journals, many conference presentations, and is listed as an inventor on seven patent applications on diagnostic biosignatures for tuberculosis disease. He is an NRF rated scientist.

Dr William Griffith (Private Practice)



Dr William Griffith is a graduate and faculty member of The International Masterson Institute. He is Clinical Director of The Masterson Institute for Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy South Africa. Dr Griffith has been teaching and practicing psychology for the last 15 years. He was a faculty member in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Pretoria, Consultant Clinical Psychologist at Weskoppies Psychiatric Hospital and lectured part time at the Department of Psychology at the University of Pretoria and University of the Western Cape. He entered private practice in 2006 and specialises in psychopathology and psychotherapy with children, adolescents and adult patients diagnosed with psychotherapy for suitable candidates. William has presented at numerous national and international conferences and has published nationally and internationally.

Dr Mike Urban (Division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics)


Title: Running to stand still: keeping up with developments in genetic and genomic diagnostics



Dr Michael (Mike) Urban is a paediatrician and sub-specialist Medical Geneticist and is currently head of the Clinical Unit of Medical Genetics and Genetic Counselling at Tygerberg Hospital and Stellenbosch University.. He completed undergraduate and paediatric training at the University of the Witwatersrand, and worked in paediatrics and neonatology. After completing sub-specialty training in Medical Genetics at the National Health Laboratory Service in Johannesburg he has practiced in medical genetics in Cape Town for over a decade. He has research interests in fetal alcohol syndrome, and in the appropriate clinical use of genetic and genomic testing in a developing country environment. His PhD explored fetal alcohol syndrome prevalence and risk factors in a range of South African environments.

Prof Jacques Janson (Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery)

Title: Replacing the Anterior Mitral Valve Leaflet with Autologous Jugular Vein in a Sheep Model



Prof Jacques Janson is Professor and Head of the Division of Cardiothoracic Surgery, Stellenbosch University and Tygerberg Hospital, a division which has one of the largest pediatric thoracic surgery programs in the country. He obtained his MBChB (University of Stellenbosch), MMed (Thor) cum laude (University of Stellenbosch), FCS (Cardio) (SA) (College of Cardiothoracic Surgeons of South Africa) and PhD (University of Stellenbosch) in 2016. Prof Janson has performed over 2000 open heart surgeries and over 700 major thoracic surgeries. He started a mitral valve repair program at Tygerberg Hospital in 2005 which is currently one of the largest programs in the country. He is also a leading team member of the Trans-catheter Heart valve program with Cardiology who performed the first transcatheter heart valves in Tygerberg Hospital. His research interest is in heart valve surgery and developing a living biological tissue valve from autologous vein. His PhD studies focused on the replacement of an anterior mitral valve leaflet with autologous jugular vein in a sheep model. He is interested in new surgical techniques in Cardiothoracic Surgery, such as the new technique for repair of a dislocated sternoclavicular joint using a sternal tension cable system which he published in the Annals of Thoracic Surgery in 2013, and are exploring techniques which could improve patient outcome.
