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4.2 Akademiese personeel / Academic staff

4.2.1 Ou en Nuwe Testament / Old and New Testament (ONT)

Die fokus van Ou en Nuwe Testament is op betroubare, verantwoordelike Bybel-interpretasie. Teologiese eksegesis van die Bybel moet verreken word teenoor akademiese en geloofs-gemeenskappe (in Afrika en elders) waar die Evangelie geïnterpreteer word. Daarom moet daar kennis geneem word van die Bybelse skrywers (toe) en lesers (vandag) wanneer Griekse en Hebreeuse Bybeltekste geïnterpreteer word. In voortsetting van die Bybelse teks self is dié interpretasie gemik op die heling van die kerk, gemeenskap en skepping.

The focus of Old and New Testament is reliable, responsible Bible interpretation. Theological exegesis of the Bible is accountable to the rest of the academic scholarly community and to communities of faith (in Africa and abroad) where the interpretation of Scripture takes place. Therefore the Hebrew and Greek texts of the Bible need to be interpreted taking cognisance of the world of the Biblical authors (then) and readers (now). In continuity with the Biblical text itself, the goal of this interpretation is the liberation of the church, the community and creation.

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4.2.2 Sistematiese Teologie en Ekklesiologie / *Systematic Theology and Ecclesiology (STE)*

Sistematiese Teologie bestudeer Christelike geloof en Christelike etiek. In die Christelike geloof word die inhoud van die Christelike tradisie - dikwels opgesom in leerstellings en belydenisse oor God (insluitend God se openbaring en kennis van God, God se skepping, God se voorsienigheid, God se beeld, die mensdom), Jesus Christus (insluitend sy persoon, lewe en verlossingswerk), en die Heilige Gees (insluitend die lewe-gewende werk van die Gees, die kerk, die sakramente, die uiteinde van die skepping) - bestudeer in die lig van kontemporêre vraagstukke, eise en ervarings.

In Etiek word die fundamente van Christelike moraliteit nagevors. Dit word dikwels opgesom in vrae oor wat moraliteit is en hoe dit gevestig kan word, wat 'n morele gemeenskap is, hoe morele mense optree, wat is morele aksies in die lig van spesifieke etiese vrae en of Christene getrou moet wees aan 'n spesifieke vorm van moraliteit.

Ekklesiologie is die teologies-wetenskaplike studie van die geskiedenis en reg van die kerk. Die Afrika- en Suid-Afrika-konteks en die Gereformeerde tradisie kry besondere aandag. Ekklesiologie fokus op 'n teologiese wyse op die geskiedenis en reg van die kerk, daarom word modules in Kerkgeskiedenis en Kerkreg aangebied. Wat Kerkgeskiedenis betref, val die aandag op die kerk- en teologiegeskiedenis vanaf die tyd van die vroeë Christene/ kerk tot en met die meer resente tyd. Die Suid-Afrikaanse konteks en die gereformeerde tradisie ontvang spesifieke klem binne 'n ekumeniese raamwerk. In Kerkreg word gefokus op hoe ons teologiese denke oor die kerk gestalte kan vind in die orde in en vir die kerk.

Ecclesiology focuses theologically on the history and polity of the church, therefore modules are taught in Church History and Church Polity. In Church History attention is given to church and theological history from the time of the early Christians/church until our present age. The South African context and the Reformed tradition receive special attention within an ecumenical framework. In Church Polity the focus is on the way in which our theological thinking about the church (our ecclesiology) can take on form in the order within and for the church.

Systematic Theology studies Christian Faith as well as Christian Ethics. In Christian Faith the content of the Christian tradition - often summarised in confessions and doctrines concerning God (including God's revelation and knowledge of God, God's creation, God's providential care, God's image, humankind), Jesus Christ (including his person, life and work of salvation) and the Holy Spirit (including the life-giving work of the Spirit, the church, the sacraments, the ends of creation) - is studied in the light of contemporary questions, claims and experiences.

In Ethics the foundation of Christian morality is researched. It is often summarised in questions about what morality is and how it can be founded, what constitutes a moral society, how moral people behave, what moral actions are in view of specific ethical questions, and whether Christians should adhere to a particular form of morality.

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4.2.3 Praktiese Teologie en Missiologie / *Practical Theology and Missiology* (PTM)

In PTM probeer ons verstaan hoe die Woord en aksies van God vorm kry in die woorde en daede van die mens op aarde. Ons probeer verstaan wat dit beteken om deur God gestuur te word na die wêreld waar ons leef en werk. Hoe oorsteek ons die grense van kultuur, ras, klas, geslag, plek en ouderdom om diegene in nood te bereik? Teologie is woorde en getuienisse oor God. Wanneer ons God hoor en sien, begelei God ons na die nood van ons naaste. Wat is hierdie nood? Wat veroorsaak hierdie nood? Hoe spreek ons dit aan? Hoe rus ons leiers, lidmate en gemeentes toe om betrokke te raak by God se sending na die wêreld?

Praktiese Teologie werk in die lig van hierdie vrae met kwessies rondom kerklike bediening, die lewe in geloofsgemeenskappe in verskillende kontekste en transformerende aksies in die samelewing (ontwikkeling).

Die homiletiese proses van die kerkdienste ingebed in liturgiese rituele vorm die ontmoetingspunt tussen God en die mensdom. Ons fokus op spirituele ontwikkeling, pastorale sorg, diakonale uitreik, missionale betrokkenheid, inkulturasie en kontemporêre jeugkwessies.

In the discipline group Practical Theology and Missiology we try to understand how the Word and acts of God take shape in the words and deeds of man in the world. We try to understand what it means to be sent out by God to the world where we live and work. How do we cross the boundaries of culture, race, class, gender, place and age to reach those in need? Theology is witness and words about God. When we see and hear God, God guides us to the needs of our neighbours. What are these needs? What causes these needs? How do we deal with them? How do we equip leaders, members, congregations, to become involved in God's mission to the world?

In the light of these questions, Practical Theology deals with the issues of church ministry, the life of faith communities in different contexts, and the transformative actions within society (development).

The homiletical process of the church service embedded in liturgical rituals forms the meeting point between God and humankind. We also focus on spirituality development, pastoral care, diaconal outreach, missional involvement, inculturation, as well as contemporary youth questions.

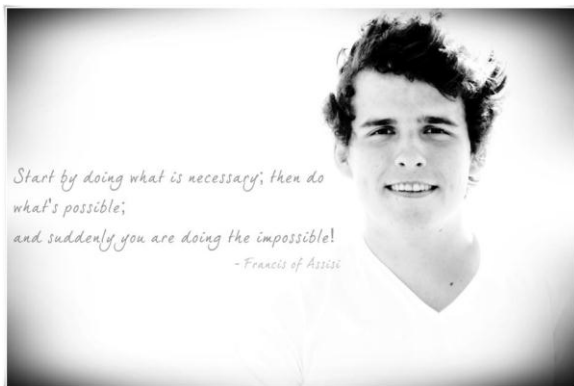

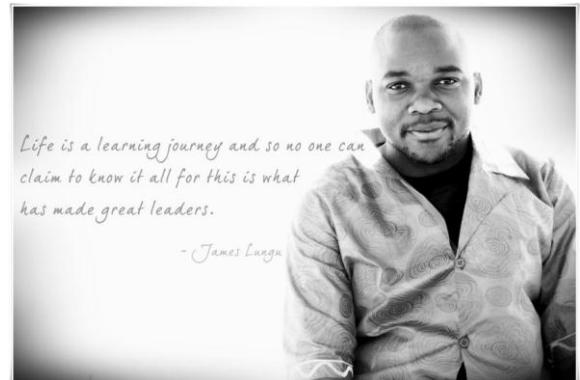

5.6 Opdragte, toetse en eksamens / *Assignments, tests and exams*

- Lecturers will indicate which assignments have to be done, when these should be handed in and what format they need to be in.
- Each assignment must have the required signed declaration that it is the student's own work.
- All assignments should be handed in on time. The Faculty Board accepted the arrangement that assignments that are handed in late will be penalised with 5% per day.
- Plagiarism, the use of someone else's work without proper acknowledgement thereof, is a serious offence. The Faculty has a zero tolerance policy in respect thereof. Students who commit plagiarism are penalised and their names entered in a register. In serious cases it is referred to the university. It is the responsibility of the student to know the Faculty and the University's full policy on plagiarism - ignorance will not be accepted as an excuse.
- If a student cannot write a test for some reason, he/she should contact the lecturer in advance to make alternative arrangements. In the case of illness, a medical certificate must be presented.
- All regulations of the University regarding examinations also apply to the Faculty of Theology.
- **It is the responsibility of students to confirm test, exam schedules and venues.**
- **It is also the responsibility of students to ascertain results and make special arrangements if needed for second opportunity tests, Dean's concession exams or application for re-admission.**

- Remember that exams are organised by the central examination office and fall outside the jurisdiction of the Faculty. If anything goes wrong, you're on your own!

5.7 Master's theses and doctoral dissertations and examinations

The date for submission for examination of theses and dissertations is before or on 1 September 2013 with a view to graduation in December 2013 and before or on 1 December 2013 for graduation in March 2014.

Doctoral results have to be confirmed at the Faculty Board meetings on Thursday 21 February 2013 for the March 2012 graduation ceremony and on Tuesday 5 November 2013 for the December 2013 graduation ceremony. Consequently, examinations have to be finalised before these dates.

5.8 Beurse / bursaries

Students, especially those from disadvantaged communities, are also strongly encouraged to apply to the University's Undergraduate and Postgraduate Bursary Offices for financial assistance. The Faculty also offers limited financial assistance - application forms are available at Reception.

Bursaries/Loans of the DRC Curatorium

The DRC Curatorium has the following bursaries:

Study loans	The DRC Curatorium has a bursary fund for theological students who want to go into ministry. Awards from this fund are made on a loan basis, but when the student has finished his/her studies, and he/she is ordained in a congregation, half of the loan is written off as a bursary. During the study period no interest is calculated.
Travel bursaries	Awarded to students who live further than 500km from Stellenbosch, at a rate of R1.50 per km to a maximum of R2 500.
Merit bursaries	Awarded to students with an year aggregate of of 70% or more. Bursaries are also awarded to students who achieve a good mark in the annual Bible knowledge exam.
Emergency fund	This fund is available for financial assistance to needy students in crisis situations.
Postgraduate students	Awards are made to postgraduate students: (a) Non-recurrent awards are made to candidate ministers who want to further their studies directly after they have been admitted to ministry. (b) Non-recurrent awards at the conclusion of postgraduate study (R1 500 for MTh and R2 000 for PhD).

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8. Fakulteitstruktuur en komitees / Faculty structure and committees

The three core committees of the faculty are Community Interaction, Programme Committee and Research and Publications. These committees plus the Administration Committee and Coram Deo (the committee for spirituality) convene and send reports to the Faculty Committee. The Faculty Committee considers the reports and makes recommendations to the Faculty Board, which then convenes to make decisions. The Faculty Board is the body that co-ordinates all academic activities of the Faculty. It is the central decision and policy making body in the Faculty. This cycle is repeated quarterly.

The punctual submission of committee reports to the Faculty Secretary is therefore very important. It is the responsibility of the chairpersons of the different committees to submit the written reports. Reports should consist of:

1. *Recommendations and Matters of Notification (published in the same form in the Faculty Board Agenda);*
2. *Full reports, i.e. Argumentations, motivations etc. (published as addenda in the Faculty Committee Agenda).*
