What constitutes a valid sick note?



- A valid medical certificate must include:
- Name, address and qualification of the doctor or medical practitioner
- Name of the patient
- Employment number of the patient (if applicable)
- Date and time of the consultation or examination
- Confirmation of whether the certificate is issued as a result of observation or as a result of information received from the patient
- A description of the condition in layman's terms, where the patient has given informed consent. If there is no consent, then the practitioner can indicate that in their opinion (based on an examination of the patient), the patient is unable to work

- Confirmation of whether the patient is totally unable to work, or whether the patient could perform less demanding duties ('light duties')
- The exact period of recommended sick leave
- The date of issue of the certificate
- The initial, surname and registration of the practitioner, clearly indicated
- The certificate must be signed by the medical practitioner next to their name.
- If printed stationery is used, the practitioner must delete the words that are not applicable.
- If a medical report is required, a practitioner shall issue a brief, factual report to the patient.
