Summary of Invitation	The CTL hereby invites you to a lunch-hour “padkos session” as part of the AUXIN Project. The AUXIN Project aims to create growth opportunities for SU lecturers.
Title and Name of Presenter	Prof. Lesley Le Grange
Short Biography	Lesley Le Grange is Distinguished Professor in the Department of Curriculum Studies. He has 200 publications to his credit and serves on editorial boards of eight peer-reviewed journals. Lesley has delivered 150+ academic presentations (50+ as invited speaker), and is recipient of several academic awards and prizes. He is chairperson of the Accreditation Committee, and member of the Higher Education Quality Committee (HEQC) of the Council on Higher Education (CHE) in South Africa. Lesley is Vice-President of the International Association for the Advancement of Curriculum Studies (IAACS), Fellow of the Royal Society of Biology (UK) and a rated social scientist.
Blurb	The decolonisation of education is not a new conversation and not only a South African one. However, following the student protests of 2015 & 2016 we have witnessed a renewed interest in decolonisation in relation to higher education. Evidence of this is the proliferation of literature on the topic, conferences with decolonisation as its theme, special issues of journals on the topic, and so forth. We can infer from all of this that decolonisation of the university curriculum has become a hotly debated and contested terrain in South African higher education. It has produced both evangelists and sceptics. In my presentation, I hope to provide some clarity on the topic/debate. I shall specifically discuss: why the need for decolonisation; what is meant by decolonisation, and probable pathways for decolonising the university curriculum.

Titel van Aanbieding	Dekolonisasie van die universiteitskurrikulum: Wat, waarom en hoe?
Opsomming van Uitnodiging	Hiermee nooi SOL u graag na 'n etensuurpadkossessie as deel van die Auxin-projek. Die Auxin-projek het dit ten doel om groeigeleenthede vir US-dosente te skep.
Titel en Naam van Aanbieder	Prof. Lesley Le Grange
Kort Biografie	Lesley Le Grange is Uitgelese Professor in die Departement Kurrikulumstudie. Hy het tot op hede 200 publikasies gelewer en dien op die redaksie van agt eweknie-geëvalueerde vaktydskrifte. Lesley het tot dusver 150+ akademiese aanbiedings gedoen (50+ as genooide spreker) en het verskeie akademiese toekennings en pryse ontvang. Hy is voorsitter van die Akkreditasiekomitee en lid van die Hoër Onderwys Gehaltekomitee (HOGK) van die Raad vir Hoër Onderwys (RHO) in Suid-Afrika. Lesley is Vise-President van die Internasionale Vereniging vir die Bevordering van Kurrikulumstudie (IVBKS), Genoot van die Royal Society of Biology (VK) en 'n gerekende navorser in die Sosiale Wetenskappe.
Opsomming ("Blurb")	Die dekolonisasie van onderwys is nie 'n nuwe gesprek nie en ook nie net 'n Suid-Afrikaanse een nie. As gevolg van die studenteproteste van 2015 en 2016 het ons egter 'n hernude belangstelling in dekolonisasie met betrekking tot hoër onderwys beleef. Bewys hiervan is die toename in literatuur oor die onderwerp, konferensies met dekolonisasie as tema, spesiale uitgawes van vaktydskrifte oor die onderwerp, ensovoorts. Ons kan hieruit aflei dat die dekolonisasie van die universiteitskurrikulum 'n hoogs debatteerbare en betwiste terrein in Suid-Afrikaanse hoër onderwys geword het. Dit het beide evangeliste en skeptici na vore laat tree. In my voorlegging hoop ek om duidelikheid oor die onderwerp / debat te gee. Ek sal spesifiek die volgende punte aanraak: waarom die behoefte aan dekolonisasie; wat word met dekolonisasie bedoel, en moontlikhede vir die dekolonisasie van die universiteitskurrikulum.
