## File

The file module enables a teacher to provide a file as a course resource. Where possible, the file will be displayed within the course interface, otherwise students will be prompted to download it. The file may include supporting files. For e.g. a HTML page may have embedded images or Flash objects. Note that the students need to have the appropriate software on their computers in order to open the file.



## A file may be used:

- To share presentations given in class
- To include a mini website as a course resource
- To provide draft files of certain software programs so students can edit and submit them for assessment.
- Step 1: Turn editing on
- Step 2: Drag and drop the file onto the course section where you'd like it to appear
- Step 3: If necessary, edit the title of the file by clicking the pencil icon

## LONGER METHOD

- Step 1: Turn editing on
- Step 2: + Add an activity or resource
- Step 3: Select File
- Step 4: Add a name and description for file

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Step 5: Add content using the +Add icon or drag and drop

- Step 6: Select Appearance, choose from the dropdown box what type of display it should be:
  - Automatic if you want Moodle to sort it out
  - o Embed if you want to show the file as part of the Moodle page
  - o Force download if you want to force the user to save the file
  - Open if you want to show the file in the browser, but without the Moodle page decorations
  - Pop-up/New window if you want it to pop-up or in a new window
  - In frame if you want to use a horrible bit of non-strict HTML that should never be allowed in polite company.
- Step 7: Save and return to course Save and display Cancel
