In order to ensure a successful year for the Special Needs Portfolio, meticulous planning, both in administrative and financial terms, is required. As a result, the main priority of my Ist term in office has been the preparing of a budget and the forming of a Subcommittee for the Portfolio.

Portfolio Overview

The following is the function of the Special Needs Manager within the SRC leadership structure and the student body, as per the 'student leadership job description' document of the SRC:

"The main function of this role is to entrench representation and advocate for the issues of students with disabilities within the SRC structure. In addition, it is also about furthering their integration into the SU campus and general society at large. Achieving the above imperative entails working with various structures that seek to represent matters of minority communities on campus, such as the Disability Unit, Equality Unit and Transformation Office."

In addition to the above, I believe that the acquisition of knowledge and insight regarding the grievances and recommendation of Maties with special needs in terms of facilities and support available is of utmost importance. I shall, therefore, be working closely with the Dis Maties Council and the Disability Unit to plan possible means of improving channels through which grievances and recommendations can be obtained and documented, allowing for effective strategies to be implemented and plans drafted in future.

The following goals have also been outlined as part of the Special Needs Portfolio year plan:

- Ensuring students are provided a platform to engage in self-advocacy
- Facilitating communication and providing input so that students with disabilities are at the centre of decisions that affect them
- Full participation in campus life and academic activities are granted to every disabled student
- Ensuring all aspects of the disabled student are considered when decisions are made
- Promote inclusivity in language, structure, and facilities

Term I Overview

Dis Maties Council

During the course of 2022, I submitted a proposal to the former SRC Manager for Special Needs regarding the re-establishment of the defunct Dis Maties Council. The purpose of this Society is to assist the SRC Manager for Special Needs, the Disability Unit and other university structures in addressing the grievances, and acting on the suggestions of the student body regarding special needs and the facilities available, or not available, to the students who require the afore-mentioned. The society will allow for greater communication between the student body and relevant university structures. This proposal was first submitted by me in March of 2022 and has involved extensive meetings with stakeholders, specifically the Disability Unit and the former SRC Manager for Special Needs and SRC Vice-Chairperson and Policy Officer. Since my appointment, I have been working closely with interested stakeholders to have the Dis Maties Council approved as a society by the Societies Council. A meeting to discuss preparations regarding the establishment of the society was held on the 31st of January 2023.

Special Needs Subcommittee

I have appointed students to serve as members of the Special Needs Committee. The purpose of this committee is to assist the Manager for Special Needs with various aspects of the portfolio including administration, financial planning and the management of social media accounts and marketing. To ensure an effective committee and efficient communication, I opted to limit the size of the committee to three people, including myself. The membership of the committee includes the Deputy Speaker of Student Parliament and a member of the Second Year Committee of Harmonie Residence. This allows for access to a larger student base and a greater range of perspectives regarding Special Needs on the various campuses of Stellenbosch University.

Special Needs Budget

I managed to secure a donation from DTConsult, a leading business restructuring and insolvency firm in South Africa, to the value of R10,000. This amount serves as a supplement to the budget assigned to the Special Needs Portfolio by the SRC during 2022. This amount is represented in the Special Needs Portfolio Budget as submitted to the Treasurer of the SRC on the 31st of December 2023.
