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Constitutional Responsibilities

As the Postgraduate Students portfolio holder, I have the following constitutional responsibilities:

Other roles I must play include be in charge of all university-wide postgraduate academic problems. Talk with the committees of the Postgraduate faculty. Keep in touch with the Postgraduate Funding Office. Ensure the creation of a setting that supports academic excellence. Oversee developing or improving educational activities for the university and the neighbourhood. Promote postgraduate studies to undergraduate students and make them aware of them. In conjunction with the Vice President for External Affairs, maintain communication with internal and external research and financing organizations. In the second term, after welcoming and orientation.

A Post Graduate Event was held on May 18, 2023, in the Club House at Die Stel hosted by the SRC Postgraduate Portfolio in association with the Post Graduate Office. 'All things Convocations' designed to inform graduate students about the convocation and its purposes, you may already be aware of the fact that many graduate students are unaware of what convocation is and what it does. As a result, we have made the decision to plan an event to provide them the information they need. The event took place on May 18, 2023. Their guest speaker for the evening was Dr Rudi Buys, the Vice-President of SU's Convocation, who shared his insights and experiences about the importance of the Convocation. The purpose was to provide postgraduate students a chance to network with fellow postgraduate students and alumni who have direct experience with convocation and learn more about convocation and the event was a success.
