- Senate
 - Senate voted for the New Deputy Vice Chancellor for Research, Innovation and Postgraduate Studies
- Bursary and Loans
 - Bursary and loans discussed plans and areas in which funding needs to be concentrated. There is a lot
 of talk on assisting students who do not automatically fall within the bracket that requires immediate
 financial assistance.
- Umoja Summit Planning Committee
 - The planning committee concluded organisation of the summit which set to be held on the 29th of July at STIAS in Stellenbosch. The theme of the year is centred around climate change, and the role of African leaders in addressing it. Speakers from across the country have been invited to attend.
- Institutional Advisory Committee on Internalisation (IACI)
 - IACI Launched the SDG hub which as it is a virtual centre for tracking of Stellenbosch's data towards sustainability. A programme was launched for students to join, and create projects for the SDG hub. The goal would be for students to see this work
 - IACI discussed intentions bringing students from more African countries.





Term Overview
