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#### 7. Portfolio Feedback

#### Ms Ngxikwe gave the following feedback:

 TSC and Societies council in Stellenbosch had a camp and they are keen on collaborating in future. Also, the TSC asked why do they not sit in on the forums

#### Ms Andri gave the following response:

They do sit in the TSRC as they are the Tygerberg representative.

#### Ms Ngxikwe asked the following question:

• She asked the SRC members on how does the societies council amend or change their constitution.

#### Mr sibande also added the following response:

 He said societies council should check the student constitution that guides all structures within the student populace

#### Mx Quthu added the following input:

 They also agreed with Ms Ngxikiwe on drafting a new constitution, seeing that societies do not follow the guidelines of the societies council and that some societies have their own constitution.

#### Ms Malan gave the following response:

 She said the constitution of council should be binding on all societies and not on chairpersons and she also said that societies council should look into having a forum.

#### Ms Qabaka gave the following response:

#### Ms Malan added the following input:

- Sibande answered by saying that the study centres are small and not clean. He also added that they not allowed to use lecture halls as these a lot of stealing of equipment on campus because campus security is far from the lecture halls.
- He added that Dr Choice said there will be no emergency accommodation for Tygerberg students and that the student populace of Tygerberg should make other provisions.

#### Mr Wagener added the following response:

 The TSR should liaise with the prims to utilise the rec halls or dining halls as study centres.

#### Ms Qabaka added the following response:

- Then the dean responded to say these shops are charged hefty by the retail services.
