



Addendum to the Rector’s Management Report to Senate and Council, June 2022:

### Fourth round of hybrid-learning funding nominations

Since June 2020, there have been three opportunities for SU faculties to nominate selected offerings for hybrid-learning (HL) funding, which resulted in the development of [various HL programmes, modules and learning units](#).

A fourth opportunity opened in the first week of May 2022. The latest nomination round will focus on **postgraduate programmes** such as diplomas and master’s degrees specifically intended for **underserved markets** (including for the learn-and-earn market, i.e. students who have already entered the job market and, thus, prefer flexible offerings with sustained periods of online learning).

The development of offerings nominated in the previous nomination round is also well under way:
