In addition, the fellow will assist in expanding ISTP be networking with other humanitarian organisations interested in improving the quality of their surgical workforce.

- Postgraduate qualification in a surgical specialty including anaesthesia or obstetrics
- At least two to three years relevant work experience in the field of Global Surgery or Humanitarian Surgery in low and middle income countries (LMICs), and in fragile states.
- Experience with humanitarian medical organisation highly desirable



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- Experience in LMIC academic surgery, surgical training, curricular development, assessment highly desired
- Excellent written and verbal English communication skills
- Experience with publishing research is preferred
- Ability to function in a multicultural environment, manage projects, and work independently
