

## Appendix B: Admission criteria and registration

### 1) Admission criteria

Stellenbosch University does not typically state recommendations (e.g. five years' industry experience, etc.) that are taken into consideration when considering an applicant for admission. Instead, it states additional requirements that an applicant must fulfil if they have a certain profile, e.g. if a candidate is in full-time employment. The same set of additional requirements apply to all the Doctoral Degrees in the SU PQM as follows:

1. A candidate who is in the employ of an organisation external to the University must, prior to admission to a programme of study for the doctorate, furnish proof in writing that he has obtained such employer's permission
  - a. to register for the said programme of study for the doctorate; and
  - b. to abide by the University's rules concerning the publication of dissertations.
2. In cases where the prospective student does not meet the admission requirements of the programme but does have relevant work experience and/or other academic merit, the department may request the student to submit a portfolio of evidence to the Departmental RPL/CAT (Recognition of Prior Learning/Credit Accumulation and Transfer) Committee for consideration. The prospective student may also be requested to complete additional academic modules (e.g. a research methodology module) before the application can be considered.
