## Diploma- en Gradeplegtighede | Diploma and Graduation Ceremonies

### Interessanthede van die plegtighede

Die prosesjie, almal in akademiese drag, word so opgestel dat die mees junior lede eerste instap, maar die mees senior lid (gewoonlik die Kanselier of Visekanselier) lei die prosesjie uit na die plegtigheid.

By middeleeuse universiteite was die *cappa clausa*, 'n moulose mantel wat bo-oor 'n toga gedra is, die eerste vorm van akademiese drag. In die 16de eeu het Oxford en Cambridge weggedoen met die mantel en het akademiese drag bestaan uit die toga met moue, 'n kap met 'n lang 'stert' om die skouers en 'n hooftooisel. Strng riglyne het die ontwerp en kleure van akademiese drag bepaal. Hierdie tradisie het dus uit Europa oorgespoel na Suid-Afrika. Om ook erkenning te gee aan die Universiteit Stellenbosch se rol as integrale deel van die Afrika-vasteland, is die ampsdraers se togas herontwerp en met eenvoudige Afrika-motiewe geborduur.

Die taal verryk ook hierdie seremonie met interessante terme. Graduandi (persones wat op die punt staan om 'n graad te ontvang) stap met 'n kap oor die arm na die verhoog. Sodra die graad toegeken is, word die kap om die skouers van die graduati (persones wat pas 'n graad ontvang het) gehang. U kan elke fakulteit se kandidate uitken aan die kleur van die eerste graad se kap. Die honoursgraad se kap het 'n dubbele streep, die magistergraad s'n is swart met 'n geel satynvoering en die doktorsgraad s'n is maroen met geel satyn binne. Kandidate wat doktorsgrade ontvang, dra rooi togas.

### Interesting ceremonial details

The procession, wearing academic dress, is set up so that the junior members walk in first, although the most senior member (usually the Chancellor or Vice-Chancellor) leads the procession out after the ceremony.

The *cappa clausa*, a sleeveless cloak that was worn over a toga, was the first form of academic dress in mediaeval universities. Oxford and Cambridge got rid of the cloak in the 16th century and academic dress then consisted of a toga with sleeves, a hood with a long 'tail' around the shoulders and a headdress. Strict guidelines determined the design and colours of academic dress. This tradition therefore came to South Africa from Europe. So as to acknowledge the role played by Stellenbosch University as an integral part of the African continent, the togas of the office-bearers were redesigned and embroidered with simple African motifs.

The language used also enriches the ceremony with interesting terms. Graduands (people who are on the point of receiving a degree) walk to the stage with the hood draped over their arm. As soon as the degree has been conferred, the hood is draped around the shoulders of the graduates (people who have just been awarded a degree). The candidates of the various faculties can be recognised by the colour of the hood for the first degree. The hood for an honours degree has two stripes, while that for a master's degree is black with a yellow satin lining. The hood for a doctorate is maroon with a yellow satin lining, while candidates receiving doctorates wear red togas.

### Inkukacha enomdla malunga nemisitho

Umkhosi wemithika, onxibe umthika wemfundo, weniwi ngohlobo lokuba amalungu asematscha ahamba kuqala, nangona elona lungu liphezulu kakhulu (lidla ngokuba yiTshansila okanye okanye liSekela-Tshansila) likhokela umkhosi wemithika ukuphuma emva komsthiko.

I-*cappa clausa*, isambatho esingenamikhono esasinixtywa ngaphezu kwsinxibo somsitho (i-toga), sasiluhlobo lokuqala lesinxibo somthika wemfundo kwijjunivesithi zamandulo. I-Oxford ne-Cambridge yahlukana neso sambatho kwinkulungwane ye-16 nomthika wemfundo owawunesinxibo esinemikhono, umxakatho 'onesisila' eside emagxeni nesinxibo sasentloko. Yimiylelo engqongqo emiselwe uyilo nemibala yomthika wemfundo. Esi sithethe ngoko sezsa eMzantsi Afrika sisuka emaNtla. Ukuze sothulele umnqwazi iYunivesithi yaseStellenbosch ngendima eyidlalileyo njengenxene egqibeleyo yelizwekazi laseAfrika, izinxibo zomsitho (ii-toga) zamagosa olawulo zaphinda zayilwa ngokutsha zahonjiswa ngeemihombiso yesiAfrika.

Ulwimi oluseteyiswayo nalo luchumisa umsitho ngamagama enza umda. Abathweswa izidanga baya eqongeni bethe bhije imixakatho ezingalweni zabo. Sakuba sinikeziwe isidanga, umxakatho uthiya hatya emagxeni abo banikezwe izidanga. Abathweswa izidanga beefakhalthi ezahlukeneyo bangabonwa ngombala womxakatho kwsidanga sokuqala. Umxakatho wesidanga seeonazi unemigca emibini, ngelixa owesidanga semastazi umnyama unomaleko otyheli wesatini. Umxakatho wesidanga sobugqirha umaruni unomaleko otyheli wesatini, ngelixa abathweswa izidanga zobugqirha nabo benxiba izinxibo zomsitho ezibomvu.

## EREGRADE | HONORARY DEGREES

**Die graad Doktor in die Wysbegeerte (DPhil), honoris causa, aan  
The degree Doctor of Philosophy (DPhil), honoris causa, to**

### MAX DU PREEZ

vir die inlui van 'n nuwe era vir Afrikaanse joernalistiek deur sy beginselvaste en waagmoedige ondersoekende joernalistiek, sy onwrikbaarheid as kritiese stem vir geregtigheid in die Suid-Afrikaanse samelewing, en sy voortgesette geloofwaardigheid as morele kompas op ons reis om ons demokrasie te beskerm.

Joernalis en kommentator Max du Preez dien as die nasie se gewete oor verskillende politieke stelsels heen. Van die apartheid-regime tot diegene wat deesdae die jong Suid-Afrikaanse demokrasie in gevaar stel – geen onreg ontsnap sy pen nie.

In die 1970's sluit Du Preez hom by *Die Burger* en later *Beeld* aan, maar is vroeg ontnugter deur die bondgenootskap tussen die Afrikaanse media en die destydse regerende Nasionale Party. Poste by Engelse publikasies daamá bevredig nie sy soeke na morele regverdiging nie. Sy ervaring as 'n afgevaardigde op die Dakarberaad in 1987 spoor hom uiteindelik aan om die onafhanklike koerant *Vrye Weekblad* as 'n alternatiewe Afrikaanse stem in die Suid-Afrikaanse medialandskap te stig.

*Vrye Weekblad* was 'n keerpunt – vir Afrikaanse teenstand teen apartheid én vreeslose verslaggewing in tye van onreg. Du Preez was die teiken van vele staatspogings om die koerant uit die weg te ruim, waaronder amptelike waarskuwings, onmoontlike finansiële eise, 'n bomaanval op die koerantkantore, en lastersake. Tog het hy en sy span voortgegaan om 'n nuwe nuusagenda te bevorder – in 'n verfrissende Loslitafrikaans.

Nadat *Vrye Weekblad* in 1994 sy deure moes sluit, gaan die jukskeibrekerjoernalis voort om maghebbers met die waarheid te konfronteer, dié keer by die SAUK. Hy vervaardig die ondersoekende joernalistiekprogram *Special Assignment* en die weeklikse *Special Report on the Truth Commission* gedurende die verhore van die Waarheid-en-versoeningskommissie. Deesdae dui sy raak ontledings as onafhanklike kommentator steeds vir Suid-Afrikaners die rigting aan om ons duur verworwe demokrasie te beskerm.

Du Preez se waagmoedige joernalistiek het hom al verskeie eerbewyse besorg, soos dié van die Suid-Afrikaanse Vereniging van Joernaliste, Harvard se Nieman-genote, die Suider-Afrikaanse Buitelandse Verslaggewerskorps en die Suid-Afrikaanse Nasionale Redakteursforum.

Dikwels omstrede dog altyd geloofwaardig – Max du Preez se uitsonderlike aktivisme vir die waarheid verdien erkenning van die Universiteit Stellenbosch.

for having ushered in a new era for Afrikaans reporting through his principled, uncompromising and courageous investigative journalism, serving as a critical voice for justice in South African society, and remaining a moral compass in our quest to safeguard our democracy.

Journalist and commentator Max du Preez has served as the nation's conscience across political orders, having held the mirror up to both the perpetrators of apartheid pre-1994 and those putting the young South African democracy at risk since the dawn of freedom.

Du Preez joined *Die Burger* and later *Beeld* in the 1970s, but soon became disillusioned with the alliance between the Afrikaans media and the then ruling National Party. Subsequent stints at English media titles did not still his quest for moral justification. His experience as a Dakar summit delegate in 1987 eventually prompted him to establish the independent newspaper *Vrye Weekblad* as an alternative Afrikaans voice in the South African media landscape.

*Vrye Weekblad* was the beginning of a new era – both for Afrikaner resistance against apartheid, and for fearless reporting in the face of injustice. Du Preez found himself the target of many government attempts to shut the paper down, including official warnings, impossible financial demands, the bombing of the newspaper offices, and lawsuits for defamation. Yet, along with his team, Du Preez continued to set a new news agenda – in a refreshingly informal Afrikaans.

After the closing of *Vrye Weekblad* in 1994, this maverick journalist carried on speaking truth to power, this time at the SABC. He produced the investigative journalism programme *Special Assignment* and the weekly *Special Report on the Truth Commission* during the Truth and Reconciliation Commission hearings. Today, his no-nonsense analysis as independent commentator continues to guide South Africans in protecting our hard-won democracy.

Du Preez's courageous journalism has garnered many accolades, including from the South African Society of Journalists, Harvard University Nieman Fellows, the Foreign Correspondent Corps of Southern Africa, and the South African National Editors' Forum.

Often controversial, always credible, Max du Preez's outstanding activism for the truth is worthy of Stellenbosch University's highest honour.

*Knowledge discovery and anomalies: Towards a dynamic decision-making model for medical informatics*

Worldwide healthcare organisations need to make quality care accessible to all. This requires well-informed and nimble decision-making from large amounts of data. In this study, a knowledge discovery framework for data-intensive research focusing on the field of biomedical informatics was developed. Within this framework, data were represented as integrated, heterogeneous information networks, and then mined using machine learning algorithms to extract information. Modelling data from this sector as an information network allowed new insights into the structure of the data. The proposed method revealed unexpected, potentially interesting relationships that will make the data easier to understand by medical practitioners.

*'n Genregebaseerde benadering tot die ontwikkeling van skryfvaardighede in Afrikaans as tweede taal op universiteitsvlak*

In dié studie is die genregebaseerde benadering vanuit die sistemies-funksionele linguistiese perspektief voorgestel ter ontwikkeling van skryfvaardighede in studente se tweede taal op universiteitsvlak. Eerstens is onderzoek ingestel na die aard en eienskappe van tekste vanuit die responsgenre, wat deel vorm van 'n skryfkursus in Afrikaans as tweede taal. Tweedens is die wyse waarop die ontleding van tekste in die responsgenre in 'n Afrikaanse taalverwettingsmodule gebruik kan word vir die ontwikkeling van tweedetaalskryfvaardighede onderzoek. Derdens is die konsep van voorsienbaarhede betrek om sodoende taalvoorsienbaarhede in die konteks van 'n kursus vir Afrikaans as tweede taal te identifiseer.

*Substance use and self-harm at an urban South African hospital: Implications for suicide prevention, service delivery and future research*

This mixed-methods study explored the relationship between substance use and self-harm among patients who presented for treatment at an urban hospital in South Africa. Findings showed that the assessment and management of substance use should be integral to the care of self-harm patients, and that suicide prevention should focus on reducing hazardous use of alcohol, tobacco and illicit drugs. In addition to providing epidemiological data about the associations between self-harm and acute and chronic substance use, this study provided novel insight into self-harm patients' understanding of how their substance use was implicated in their self-injurious behaviour.

*Social work services provided by non-profit organisations to adult methamphetamine users: An ecological perspective*

Substance abuse is a widespread social problem in South Africa and the increased use of methamphetamine has made South Africa one of the countries with the highest number of methamphetamine users in the world. Little research, however, is available on how service

providers and service users experience social work services for adult methamphetamine users. This study intensively explored and critically analysed the nature, scope and utilisation of social work services offered by non-profit organisations to adult methamphetamine users. It offers rich material for publication and cogently recommended closer collaboration between government and non-profit organisations to address methamphetamine addiction effectively.

*A critical analysis of media discourse in reports after catastrophic flooding in Malawi in 2015*

This study investigated media discourses representing various aspects of a catastrophic flooding disaster of 2015 in Malawi. Overall, the findings showed how the media representation of the event was not neutral; rather, various actors were socially constructed in strongly stereotyped ways. The study contributes to an understanding of the general linguistic and visual discursive tendencies that local print and international media use in portraying a natural disaster, particularly when it occurs in a relatively remote country of the 'global South'. In addition, it fills a gap in semiotic studies that focus on the interplay between verbal texts and visual images in reporting on natural disasters.

*The management of family routines by single, Xhosa-speaking mothers with young children*

Single-mother families are often psychologically vulnerable, yet family routines can be vital resilience resources that promote better physical and mental health. In this grounded-theory study, 26 single, Xhosa-speaking mothers who live in abject poverty were sampled from several informal settlements outside of Cape Town. The study's aim was to understand how these women manage their family routines after transitioning into parenthood. Semi-structured interviews and naturalistic home observations demonstrated the profoundly dynamic nature of the management process, highlighting key pre- and postpartum contextual obstacles, as well as powerful strengths in single-mother families.

*Investigating the semiotic landscape of the house museum in Stellenbosch, South Africa*

The study recognised that there is a significant lack of inclusive museological institutions in Stellenbosch encompassing the histories and cultures of its diverse communities. A comparative analysis of the Stellenbosch Village Museum and the Kayamandi Creative District House Museum interrogated what these museums reveal about the broader historical and sociocultural contexts in which they exist, and the appropriateness of each as house museum models in a post-apartheid context. The study found that to foster inclusivity, Stellenbosch's museums could embrace innovative museological practices that encourage cross-cultural exchange by sharing the histories and cultures of their previously marginalised communities.

*Internal migration in post-apartheid South Africa: The case of the Western and the Northern Cape*

Internal migration deserves as much attention as cross-border migration. In South Africa, during the late apartheid years, the policies of influx control and, in the former Cape Province, coloured labour preference, deeply influenced the divergent migration streams of those classified at the time as black African, coloured, Asian and white. During the 20 years after 1994, three shifts in migration streams within the Western and Northern Cape stand out: destination areas remain urban and metropolitan while mobility has slowed down; the most mobile population group remains black African, especially from the Eastern Cape; and significant migration within these provinces continues.

*Factors influencing the public communication behaviour of publicly visible scientists in South Africa*

This study explored the factors that influence if and how South African scientists engage with public audiences. A sample of highly visible scientists was chosen, who were interviewed to gain a better understanding of how public science communication is shaped by scientists' discipline, career stage, age, gender, personality and population group, as well as by their communication attitudes, skills and home institutions. The study highlighted how South Africa's unique history and social challenges inspire scientists to engage with society. Public science engagement emerged as a contested activity, driven by conflicting demands and constraints and characterised by diverse risks and rewards.

KANGALAWE, Hezron Romanus Rangawe (History)

*Plantation forestry in Tanzania: A history of Sao Hill forests, 1939–2015*

This study used plantation forests from the colonial to the postcolonial period as a lens to explore Tanzania's past from 1939 to 2015. The study wove together the varied factors that led to the establishment of the Sao Hill plantation from early efforts towards ameliorating the micro-climates of white commercial farms. A key focus was on postcolonial afforestation and resettlement under African socialism, Ujamaa, between 1973 and 1976. After a World Bank loan and, from the late 1980s, economic liberalisation caused some of the land owners to use 'weapons of the weak' to resist the means used by the state to take their customary land.

*Syntactic categories and the verb-argument complex in Parakuyo Maasai*

The study investigated issues pertaining to the properties of verbal affixes in Parakuyo Maasai that give rise to different realisations of the external and internal arguments. A range of argument realisations was examined, licensed by verbs with specific lexical-semantic, event semantic and morpho-syntactic properties introduced by the particular verbal suffixes in exploring the interfaces of morphology and syntax in Parakuyo grammar. The investigation of the verbal affixes and argument realisation was comprehensively accounted for by invoking pertinent perspectives from information structure and aspectual types in the events denoted by the verbs.

*The ghost of memory: Literary representations of slavery in post-apartheid South Africa*

This study examined representations of slavery at the Cape in selected post-apartheid literature. Via the theoretical concepts of cultural haunting, collective memory and re-memory, it explored the lasting social and psychic effects of traumatic, often repressed, slave histories. A central idea is that slavery haunts the present moment and the study argues that the publication of these narratives at this particular point in time can be read as imaginative responses to such haunting. The study focused on the surfacing of slave memories, the authors' need to revisit their ancestors' pasts of slavery or slave ownership and the way in which the legacies of slavery resonate with concerns of present-day South Africa.

*Configuring 'Maasainess': Contested textual embodiments*

This study explored and theorised the notion of 'Maasainess' as a cultural identity claimed, appropriated, redefined and performed in fiction, autobiography and music. An important aspect of this study was the broad range of texts from different cultural contexts discussed in order to register the perspectives of both Maasai and non-Maasai authors and musicians. It thus achieved an inclusive and nuanced overview of the subject, which demonstrated that 'Maasainess' defies confinement in reductive stereotypes circulating in the global imaginary. It proposed that the nomadic lifestyle of the Maasai offers a more appropriate discursive tool to understand the dynamism of 'Maasainess'.

*Setting art apart: Inside and outside the South African National Gallery (1895–2016)*

This study explored practices of exclusion in the South African art world, asserting that the National Gallery in Cape Town has, since its colonialist inception, reinforced cultural difference and ghettoisation rather than interrelation and cultural exchange. The archives of the colonialist and apartheid enterprises reveal through their glaring omissions the Gallery as complicit with a nationalist government in enforcing the tenets of segregation. As such, the Gallery mirrors a city and country indifferent to the art of their people. Tracing the art museum's nationalist evolution, the study anticipates shifts in agency over the institution's power to shape cultural identities.

*Lexical-semantic and morpho-syntactic properties of English loanwords in Sukuma*

The study investigated the lexical-semantic and morpho-syntactic properties of English loanwords in Sukuma, a Tanzanian African language, in the domains of the determiner phrase (DP), inflectional phrase (IP) and verb phrase (VP) invoking the broad framework of generative syntax, complemented by perspectives from language typology. The study demonstrates that English loanwords in Sukuma exhibit lexical-semantic and morpho-syntactic properties similar to inherent Sukuma words. In the DP domain, English loan nouns are modified to conform to the Sukuma nominal morphology. In regard to

the IP and VP domains, the study gives evidence that English loan verbs are modified for integration into the complex agglutinative Sukuma verbal morphology.

*Rethinking protected area co-management in the Makuleke region, South Africa*

The study examined the conservation policies that underpin the protected area co-management arrangements between the Kruger National Park (KNP) and the Makuleke community in an area called the 'Pafuri Triangle' in the northern section of the Kruger National Park. The study examined how this co-management arrangement emerged following the successful land claim process initiated by the Makuleke community and their NGO partners. The study examined the power relations and governance dynamics between the Makuleke community and Kruger National Park, and the at times contradictory logics and imperatives of the conservation of bio-diversity and the socio-economic development of the Makuleke region.

**MUNYISWA, Isaiah (Philosophy)**

*Citizenship as a human well-being capability*

This study developed an account of citizenship as an architectonic human well-being capability. On this account, citizenship is a necessary condition for the achievement of a range of other valuable human functionings. The study further developed a set of criteria for measuring human well-being and thus succeeded in operationalising the capability approach in a new direction. The study makes a valuable contribution to contemporary political philosophy by developing a normative conception of citizenship as a requirement for human flourishing, as opposed to citizenship as a purely legal status or a formal set of rights.

*Eco-communitarianism: A poetics of the environment in East African literature*

This study makes an original contribution to the field of postcolonial ecocriticism (environmental studies in the humanities). The study explored the persuasive value of literary devices, particularly personification, ekphrasis, metaphor and irony, and interrogated how narration performs environmental activism and affects emotions, so as to potentially change reader/spectator attitudes towards the environment. Finally, the study argued that the narratives (from different genres: fiction, poetry and drama) unveil an underlying ecological consciousness amenable to African communitarianism, termed 'eco-communitarianism.'

**NAKIJOBA, Sarah (General Linguistics)**

*Pragmatic markers in L1 Luganda-L2 English bilingual spoken discourse: A relevance-theoretic approach*

Pragmatic markers (PMs) are expressions which facilitate spoken interaction by guiding a hearer towards an interpretation intended by the speaker. Interactions involving L1 Luganda-L2 English bilinguals are characterised by spontaneous code switching, in which certain Luganda PMs are used in English utterances as though they were native

PMs, and vice versa. The study examined the contextual, operational and domain status of PMs as code-switched elements, assessed their procedural roles in facilitating interaction within their contexts, and investigated whether the procedural roles they play as embedded elements in bilingual discourse are similar to, or different from, the roles they would play in related monolingual contexts.

*A history of peasant tobacco production in Rovuma region, Southern Tanzania, c. 1930–2016*

This study is a contribution to the broader East African historiography of environmental and agrarian change, joining an existing academic conversation on the African peasantry, the rise of peasant protests, the tension and accommodations between state and peasants, and the ecological impact of one-crop 'flue-cured tobacco' farming in Tanzania. It examined the role of the state in the control of African tobacco from the 1930s to the 1950s. In addition, it traced the changing fortunes of local peasant cooperatives in the control of tobacco production between the mid-1950s and early 1970s. Finally, it assessed the post-colonial socio-economic and environmental impact of tobacco between the 1970s and mid-2010s.

*Informality and governmentality: An ethnography of conversion entrepreneurship in Harare*

This experimental visual ethnography, using smart phones in Harare, Zimbabwe, developed the concept of 'conversion entrepreneurship' to illustrate the innovative agency of informal entrepreneurs operating in both the formal and informal spheres of a dead economy. It illustrates how 'conversions' are economic transactions by entrepreneurs targeted at areas of institutional incongruence. These innovations are facilitated through social embeddedness, including entrepreneurial groups, mobile phone payment systems and social networking applications as well as church 'cell' groups. The study connects conversion entrepreneurs to technologies of governance and shows how enterprises have become frontiers for political resistance against the kleptocratic Zimbabwean state.

*Social workers' reflections on implications of neoliberal tenets for social work in South African non-governmental organisations*

Social work is swayed by socioeconomic political forces that challenge its commitment to social justice. Neoliberalism has infiltrated social welfare globally as well as in South Africa. This impact is often discreet, emerging through managerialisation, marketisation, deprofessionalisation and consumerisation. Critique of the impact of neoliberalism has primarily been limited to academic circles. Therefore, the aim of this study was to explore the implications of neoliberal tenets for NGOs in South Africa as experienced by frontline social workers and managers. The challenges, needs and successes of the South African NGO and social worker are presented in this ground-breaking dissertation.

*Moral bio-enhancement: An ethical and philosophical investigation*

This study investigated the ethical and philosophical challenges posed by the possibility of biomedically improving human morality. The primary ethical concern is that moral bio-enhancement, by making it more likely that we would choose to do, and be, good, would threaten moral autonomy, and thus morality as such. The study provides an analysis and application of a coherence theory of autonomy to ascertain the status for moral autonomy of various outcomes of moral bio-enhancement interventions. The conclusion was that in certain cases, moral bio-enhancement could produce an increase, rather than a decrease, in the level of autonomy experienced by individuals.

*Globality: The double bind of African migrant writing*

This study considered the political implications of contemporary African migrant writing in the arena of world literature. Forever interpellated by the domain of the world literary marketplace, there is a discernible worldly causality that exceeds its enunciatory modality. Because of this, this study was particularly interested in the spiritual dimension of the narratives, more abstract than the concrete presence of globalisation's physiognomy and physical border crossings. It argued that the narratives offer discursive and imaginative space from which to consider some of the economic implications of migrant life framed by global capitalism. In this way, the texts are answering a call for a capaciousness of African writing in content and form.

**SIMON, Francine (English Studies)**

*Experimental explorations of selected women's innovative poetry written in English, with a focus on 'the Gurlesque'*

This study explored innovative poetry by selected contemporary English-language women poets who write between poetic traditions of lyric expressivity and forms of experimentalism. Via both a critical component and an original poetry collection (*Thungachi*, published by uHlanga, 2017), the study used notions such as the affidamento, nomadic consciousness, the innovative necessity and Gurlesque re-workings of camp and kitsch to consider the possibilities and constraints that arise when the lyric expressivity associated with the voice of the confessional 'I' is placed under the embodied pressure of a raced female identity that inclines towards the disruption of cultural, linguistic and gendered decorum.

*Poësie op die podium: 'n Ondersoek na die sosiale rol en betrokkenheid van performatiewe kultuurvorme, met spesifieke verwysing na Afrikaanse gedigte en lirieke*

In hierdie interdissiplinêre studie is ondersoek ingestel na Afrikaanse podiumpoësie en die subvorme daarvan, soos gedigvoorleesings by literêre geleenthede, toonsettings van gedigte, lirieke, bundels van sangers, kompetisies soos bekgevegte, kletsrym, asook poësie in verhoog-en filmproduksies. Die geskiedenis van podiumpoësie is verken, met inbegrip van die Amerikaanse, Nederlandstalige, Afrika- en Suid-Afrikaanse invloede op die Afrikaanse kultuursistem. Voorbeeldtekste word bespreek met spesifieke verwysing na identiteitskonstruksies,

*The purpose of MNCs in China and Brazil's foreign policy towards developing states in Africa*

While most relevant literature has been concerned with the relations between multinational corporations (MNCs) and the host states in which they operate, this study looked at the other dimension, namely home state–MNC relations. The research question guiding this study was: What is the purpose of multinational corporations in China and Brazil's foreign policy in Africa? Using a comparative most similar research design, it was found, counter-intuitively, that Brazil's MNCs were more dependent on their home state than Chinese MNCs. The study compared China and Brazil's home state–MNC relations on the basis of four indicators of structural power: credit, security, production and knowledge.

*Tracing objects of measurement: Locating intersections of race, science and politics at Stellenbosch University*

The use of Fischer's hair colour table, Martin's eye colour table and Von Luschan's skin colour table at Stellenbosch University revealed several narratives about racial classification in South Africa. These objects changed from tools of measurement to dormant objects exuding powerful ideas. Initially employed to measure biological differences between populations, they were imbued with a strong racist slant. As they faded out of focus, the knowledge they embodied had solidified in broader South African society where race had become common sense. Their controversial re-emergence in 2013 revealed that the spectre of race is still haunting South Africa.

## EREGRADE | HONORARY DEGREES

**Die graad Doktor in die Opvoedkunde (DEd), honoris causa, aan  
The degree Doctor of Education (DEd), honoris causa, to**

### BRIAN PERCIVAL O'CONNELL

vir sy onvermoeide werk om sy instelling as een van die bestes in Afrika te vestig, sy toewyding aan die volle spektrum van Suid-Afrikaanse onderwys, en sy visionêre leierskap in die sektor in die geheel om te sorg dat onderwys nooit weer net 'n bevoorregte paar beskore is nie.

Professor Brian Percival O'Connell is 'n formidabele leier op alle vlakke van die Suid-Afrikaanse onderwyssektor.

Hy begin as onderwyser in Ravensmead en vorder tot die eerste superintendent-generaal van Wes-Kaapse onderwys in die demokratiese bedeling. Hier jaag hy skoolonderwys van gehalte na deur onder andere die verskillende apartheidsonderwysdepartemente saam te voeg en toesig te hou oor die Wes-Kaapse implementering van die eerste Witskrif oor Onderwys en Opleiding ná apartheid.

Aan't worstel met die veranderinge van 'n Suid-Afrika ná apartheid, het 'n drastiese daling in studentegetal die UVK in 'n finansiële verknorsing gedompel. Oortuig dat die instelling se tyd verby is, het die nuwe regering besluit om die instelling met Peninsula-technikon te laat saamsmelt. O'Connell voorkom in dié tyd gewelddadige teenstand teen die staat. Deur gesprek oortuig hy die regering van die waarde van die UVK-handelsmerk, wat bekend is vir sy bydrae tot die vryheidstryd. Deur onvermoeide werk ontwikkel hy die UVK tot die vooraanstaande hoëronderywystinstelling van vandag – werk wat hom in 2013 die Belgiese titel van Bevelvoerder van die Orde van Leopold besorg vir sy bydrae tot sterker bande tussen die UVK en België, maar veral ook tot 'n algehele sterker UVK-teenwoordigheid in plaaslike en internasionale verband.

O'Connell dien boonop die samelewing in die Suid-Afrikaanse Kwalifikasieowerheid, as voormalige voorsitter van die Nasionale Toegangskonsortium Wes-Kaap en die Gemeenskapskas, en huidige voorsitter van die Instituut vir Geregtigheid en Versoening.

Dit is vir die Universiteit Stellenbosch 'n eer om Brian O'Connell as visionêre onderwyskundige en denkleier van formaat te erken.

for his tireless efforts establishing his institution as one of Africa's best, his commitment to the full spectrum of education in South Africa, and his visionary leadership in the sector as a whole, ensuring that education will never again be the privilege of only a few.

Professor Brian Percival O'Connell is a formidable leader at all levels of South African education.

Starting out as a teacher in Ravensmead, he progressed to become the first post-apartheid superintendent general of Western Cape education. Here, his quest for quality South African schooling included amalgamating the different apartheid education departments and overseeing the province's implementation of the first post-apartheid White Paper on Education and Training.

In relation to higher education, O'Connell rose through the ranks to finally become rector of the University of the Western Cape (UWC) – a position he held from 2001 until his retirement in 2014. Under his leadership, UWC evolved into a leader in Africa. Its consistent ranking among the continent's top ten universities underlines the significance of O'Connell's determination to prevent a merger with Peninsula Technikon in the early 2000s.

Grappling with the changes of a post-apartheid South Africa, a dramatic drop in student numbers had plunged UWC into financial trouble. Believing that the institution was beyond rescue, the new government scheduled UWC to be merged with Peninsula Technikon. Guarding against violent opposition to the state, O'Connell through engagement convinced government of the value of the UWC brand, revered for its contribution to the struggle. Working tirelessly, he developed UWC into the eminent higher education institution it is today – work that in 2013 earned him Belgium's title of Commander of the Order of Leopold for not just strengthening ties between UWC and Belgium, but also raising UWC's profile locally and abroad.

O'Connell has also served society in the South African Qualifications Authority, as a former chair of the National Access Consortium Western Cape and the Community Chest, and present chair of the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation.

Stellenbosch University is honoured to acknowledge Brian O'Connell as a visionary educationist and thought leader of note.

for her outstanding contributions to human rights and international criminal justice as a judge in international tribunals, her academic rigour producing seminal criminal law and international criminal law reference works, and for enriching Stellenbosch University's law offering through her long-standing relationship with the institution.

Highly esteemed in international academic and judicial circles, Belgium-born Baroness Christine van den Wyngaert has harnessed her eminence to add significant value to Stellenbosch University (SU).

This former University of Antwerp law professor's various criminal law and international criminal law publications have a global audience, and many serve as standard references at universities worldwide. In addition, she is revered for her extensive judicial experience. As an ad hoc judge in the International Court of Justice, her dissenting opinion in *Democratic Republic of Congo v. Belgium* enabled an improved understanding of the role of international criminal justice in ending impunity for human rights atrocities. Her subsequent service in the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia was followed by her election in 2010 as an International Criminal Court (ICC) judge, where she now serves in the appellate division. Upon retiring from the ICC this year, she will join the Kosovo Specialist Chambers in The Hague. For her stature as academic and international judge, she received the title of baroness from the king of Belgium, was elected vice-president of the International Association of Penal Law, received a golden medal from the Flemish government as well as the Human Rights League (Belgium) prize.

Since 1997, she has been a key value-adding partner of SU's Faculty of Law. She was instrumental in helping the Faculty establish international criminal law as a distinct postgraduate module – a first for South Africa – and has ensured a substantial collection of core materials for the law library. This, along with her mentorship, has helped position SU as a preferred destination for advanced studies in international criminal law in South Africa and Africa. As an SU honorary professor, her local annual seminars greatly benefit law postgraduates.

Generously sharing her international criminal law expertise, Baroness Christine van den Wyngaert has enriched SU's law offering to students from South Africa and beyond. Stellenbosch University salutes her.

#### Doktor in die Wysbegeerte Doctor of Philosophy

ARCHER, Edward (Microbiology)

*Interaction of pharmaceutical & personal care products (PPCPs) and endocrine disrupting contaminants (EDCs) with microbial communities in South African wastewater treatment works and environmental waters*

The contamination of environmental surface waters by organic micro-pollutants is a global concern. This study added novel aspects in the field of environmental monitoring of South African surface waters through the use of urban water profiling to assess the impact of these pollutants on human and environmental health. Novel research for the African continent is presented in the field of wastewater-based epidemiology, to ultimately serve as an early warning for disease and an alternative approach to trace substance abuse. The expertise developed will contribute to risk aversion and the optimisation of wastewater treatment systems.

*Arthropod community assembly: The influence of plants, birds and fire in Fynbos vegetation*

What determines the composition of arthropod communities in fynbos vegetation? For common arthropod species, plant community composition was one of the main factors, whereas the distribution of rare species was strongly influenced by dispersal limitation and random factors. Top predators, especially birds, also played a role in structuring arthropod communities, mainly by consuming intermediate predators, such as spiders, and conspicuous, generalist herbivores. Finally, arthropod diversity and abundance were strongly depressed by fire, but increased rapidly as the vegetation recovered. The early stages of recovery were dominated by generalist herbivores, but specificity increased with succession.

COETZEE, Beatrix (Genetics)

*Genome and transcriptome sequencing of Vitis vinifera cv Pinotage*

This study focused on the genome and transcriptome sequencing of Pinotage, a South African-bred grapevine cultivar, using next-generation sequencing and bio-informatic analysis. The Pinotage draft genome assembly was produced and the Pinotage/Pinot Noir variant density assessed. Genes involved in the stress response network were shown to be a major gene class differing between Pinotage and the reference, Pinot Noir. The genetic contribution to the distinctive 'old-vine character' of wines produced from old vineyards were studied with transcriptome sequencing. Differential gene-expression analysis between young and old vines suggests a general trend towards delayed ripening in older vines.

COUZINIE, Simon Gwenael (Geology)

*Evolution of the continental crust and significance of the zircon record: A case study from the French Massif Central*

This study reconstructed the evolutionary path followed by the segment of continental crust today exposed in the eastern part of the French Massif Central, a portion of the Variscan belt of Western Europe, with the aim of investigating the potential flaws in the isotopic record of crustal evolution contained within zircon. This was achieved by combining conventional petrological observations of magma addition and in situ anatexis with both radiogenic ( $U:Pb$ ;  $Lu:Hf$ ) and stable ( $O$ ) isotope data derived through micro-beam analysis of zircon. The results demonstrate that both the addition of mantle material to the crust and relatively low temperature partial melting of the crust may go unrecognised using solely the information derived from zircon studies.

DAVIS-REDDY, Claire Lee (Botany)

*Assessing vegetation dynamics in response to climate variability and change across sub-Saharan Africa*

Satellite observations were used to examine how climate influences vegetation productivity and phenology, in order to (i) assess recent shifts in vegetation across sub-Saharan Africa (SSA) and (ii) improve model simulations of vegetation. Latitudinal patterns of change were detected, with significant increases in productivity and growing season length over the northern hemisphere tropics ( $0-10^{\circ}N$ ) and subtropics of the southern hemisphere ( $20-35^{\circ}S$ ), and decreases over the southern hemisphere tropics ( $0-20^{\circ}S$ ). This research contributes to understanding landscape-scale vegetation responses that provide an important benchmark for assessing future vegetation change. It highlights that improving vegetation models is a research imperative.

*Rationalising the solid-state properties of dithiadiazoyl radicals using a combined theoretical and experimental approach*

A series of theoretical and experimental analyses was carried out to establish a methodology for predicting the preferred configurations of new 1,2,3,5-dithiadiazoyl (DTDA) radicals. These are known for their magnetic properties when in monomeric configurations, whereas dimerisation leads to loss of magnetic ordering. Known DTDA were initially investigated to determine the role of intermolecular interactions in dimerisation, which was used as a basis for computational studies to predict the preferred configurations of pairs of DTDA radicals. Finally, two new DTDA radicals were synthesised and characterised, and were found to have intermolecular interactions that agree remarkably well with the prediction.

DU TOIT, Therina (Biochemistry)

*The metabolism of  $11\beta$ -hydroxyandrostenedione by steroidogenic enzymes yields metabolites contributing to the androgen pool in prostate cancer*

Adrenal precursor steroids contribute to the production of potent androgens in the prostate, with dire downstream consequences in castration-resistant prostate cancer. This study provided a new perspective on adrenal precursor steroids, showing the metabolism, including the production and impeded inactivation of steroid hormones in prostate cell models, contributing to in vitro evidence of the potency of these steroids in the context of prostate cancer. Novel steroid hormones were quantified, for the first time, in plasma and tissue of prostate cancer patients, highlighting the importance of accurate quantification in both the research and clinical settings.

*Oriented 123-TQFTs via string nets and state sums*

Topological quantum field theories are an area of active research in topology and mathematical physics. They are invariants of spaces that satisfy certain cutting-and-gluing relations of a categorical nature. A generations-and-relations framework was used to study two approaches to three-dimensional topological quantum field theory. Firstly, the graphical formalism of string nets on surfaces due to Kirillov, Levin and Wen was generalised in order to construct linear maps associated with topology-changing cobordisms. Secondly, the Turaev-Viro state-sum model was used and the action on the generating cobordisms was explicitly computed. Finally, the study proved that both approaches are equivalent.

GROENEWALD, Hendrikus Wilhelm (Physics)

*Non-commutative quantum mechanics in three-dimensional fuzzy space and its applications*

Various models of spatial non-commutativity have been proposed as candidates for describing space-time on length scales comparable to the Planck length. This study investigated the consequences of imposing so-called fuzzy-sphere commutation relations within non-relativistic quantum mechanics. The bound and scattering states of the square well potential were studied, and significant deviations from the standard commutative behaviour were observed at high energies. It was found that non-commutativity introduces an upper limit on the particle's kinetic energy and that it imprints on the thermodynamic behaviour of confined fermionic gasses through the appearance of incompressibility at a certain maximum particle density.

*Design and development of novel irreversible GSK-3 $\beta$  inhibitors to address Alzheimer's disease*

The enzyme GSK-3 $\beta$  is known to be a potential target for anti-Alzheimer's chemotherapy. Three series of compounds were designed as inhibitors of GSK-3 $\beta$  using computer-aided molecular docking. The synthesis was not straightforward and required attempting various routes. Ultimately, two of these series were successfully synthesised and fully characterised using techniques such as x-ray crystallography and NMR. The compounds were tested for activity against GSK-3 $\beta$ . There was a ten-fold difference in activity between the two series. In addition, time-dependent studies suggested that a covalent interaction was indeed likely to have been formed.

*Preparation of novel functional polymeric nanoparticles and various applications*

Poly(styrene-co-maleicanhydride-co-divinylbenzene) nanoparticles were synthesised via stabiliser-free radical dispersion polymerisation. The nanoparticles could be tuned in diameter from 100 to 1 000 nm. The reactivity of the maleic anhydride residues was used to introduce various functionalities. The nanoparticles appeared to be useful for the stabilisation of (inverse) Pickering emulsions. Those inverse Pickering emulsions were subsequently used for the synthesis of Janus particles, where gold nanoparticles were exclusively deposited on one hemisphere of the nanoparticles. The inverse Pickering emulsions could also be used for the entrapment of live bacteria. Preliminary experiments were conducted into encapsulation of modified bacteria, followed by their triggered release.

*Polymeric delivery of miRNA therapeutics*

MicroRNAs (miRNAs) are essential in the regulation of protein expression by cells. From a therapeutic point of view, the role of miRNAs can be manipulated to increase or decrease the expression level of specific proteins in relevant cells. Two different polymeric delivery systems for miRNA therapeutics were designed and synthesised for potential application in cardiovascular diseases. Both systems possess an amphiphilic character, where one component is able to complex the miRNA therapeutic via ionic interaction. The miRNA delivery systems are readily taken up by cells, are non-toxic and show moderate to good activity in model assays.

**KIMENE KAYA**, Boniface Dimitri Christel (Physics)*New developments in the nuclear binary cluster core in the heavy nuclear region*

The atomic nucleus is a complex many-body interacting system, which exhibits properties of an underlying correlation among nucleon states. The clustering model is one of the most reliable models that predicts these strongly correlated subsystems of nucleons closed to the threshold decay of nuclei. The binary cluster model gives a simple description of the cluster structure and decay properties of super-heavy nuclei within the nuclear chart. A fresh approach is presented to describe clustering phenomena based on a relativistic self-consistent microscopic formulation of nuclear clustering in the unexplored heavy nuclear region.

**MABIN**, Clova Airth (Zoology)*Carcinus maenas in South Africa: Status, impacts and management*

This thesis considered the invasive European shore crab *Carcinus maenas* in South Africa. Firstly, it undertook an assessment of the current population status, highlighting a contraction in range. It then implemented the first management of a marine alien species in Africa during which more than 36 000 crabs were removed from Hout Bay Harbour. This intervention offered a rare opportunity to experimentally assess the trophic impacts of this crab in the field. Unexpectedly, no ecological impact was detected. Finally, genetic techniques were used to reconstruct the crabs' invasion history, demonstrating that populations established following admixture between native and invasive populations.

**MARAIS**, Laurette (Computer Science)*Generalised acceptance conditions for symmetric difference non-deterministic finite automata*

Finite automata are formal models of computation, and the choice of final states in the model may influence both the languages that may be accepted by a given model and the size of the model. The issue of the choice of final states for so-called symmetric difference nondeterministic finite state automata (XNFA) was investigated. Choosing two sets of final states (accepting and rejecting) led to the definition of self-verifying XNFA, and bounds on the state complexity were established. A further generalisation to multiple sets of final states showed that these \*-XNFA lead to more succinct instances for various language operations.

**MITCHELL**, Megan Mitchell (Physiological Sciences)*Metabolic reprogramming and cancer resistance: An investigation into the metabolic control of cancer-associated fibroblasts on breast cancer cell survival*

Cancer-associated fibroblasts (CAFs) present within tumours play a role in enhancing tumourigenicity and the metastatic capability of cancer cells. However, the mechanisms underlying these interactions remain to be fully elucidated. It was hypothesised that glucose-deprived breast cancer cells could influence CAFs, leading to enhanced survival, chemo-resistance and migration of breast cancer cells. The data suggested that the 'activation' of CAFs contributes significantly to the pro-survival and pro-metastatic abilities of glucose-deprived breast

cancer cells. Furthermore, the results contribute significantly to the understanding of these molecular mechanisms.

**MOLLER**, Leandra (Microbiology)*The effect of different soil yeasts on the growth and physiology of lupin and wheat*

Blue lupin (*Lupinus angustifolius*) is used in break-crop and crop-rotation systems to reduce nitrogen input during wheat (*Triticum aestivum*) cultivation. To improve growth of both crops, three soil yeasts, *Hansenula zaeae*, *Papiliotrema laurentii* and *Saitozyma podzolica*, were evaluated for plant growth-promoting properties. The effect of these yeasts on germination, vigour, growth and photosynthesis was tested. While two yeasts failed to positively affect both plants, *P. laurentii* increased blue lupin germination and wheat vigour. Additionally, this yeast improved both plants' growth and photosynthesis. These findings indicate that *P. laurentii* may serve as a bio-fertiliser of blue lupin and wheat.

**NARSINGH**, Uaadhragh (Polymer Science)*Block and graft copolymers as flocculants for wastewater treatment*

Wastewater is turbid due to suspended particles that are usually negatively charged. These particles can be made to aggregate by multivalent cationic ions, but effective settlement of the aggregates only takes place in the presence of polymers that cause flocculation to occur. Cellulose-based graft copolymers and poly(ethylene oxide)-based triblock copolymers were designed and synthesised via various synthetic protocols. Especially the graft copolymers were found to be very effective in flocculating a model suspension of clay particles. Graft copolymers with an optimised level of grafting with polyacrylamide outperformed the current gold standard among commercially available flocculating agents.

**NKABYO**, Henry Ane (Chemistry)*Reversible photo-induced isomerization of cis-[M(L-S,O)2] complexes of palladium(II) and platinum(II) with N,N-dialkyl-N'-acyl(aroyl)thiourea ligands (L): Key to the isolation of novel geometric trans-[M(L-S,O)2] and trans-[M(L-S,N)2] isomers*

A rare light-induced switching phenomenon displayed by palladium and platinum complexes of a particular class of sulphur and oxygen containing ligands, between two stable geometric forms or isomers, *cis* and *trans*, was done. A solution of the normally more stable *cis*-isomer readily changes to the *trans*-isomer under the influence of intense polychromatic or blue-green laser light irradiation. This process is similar to that in a mammalian eye that enables sight. Essentially, these metal complexes act as molecular switches that are activated by light. The process is fully reversible, with the *trans*-form returning to the *cis*-form in the absence of light.

**NUWAGABA**, Savannah (Mathematics)*The eco-evolutionary dynamics of complex adaptive food webs*

Predator-prey interactions are ubiquitous on the planet. As a result, they shape the food web structure and the functioning of ecosystems. A predator-prey model with type II functional response and adaptive

body size was developed. By using adaptive dynamics, a mathematical tool that was developed to study eco-evolutionary feedbacks, the influence of the non-linear functional response on the body size evolution of predators was investigated. It was found that increasing handling time could reduce the body size of predators. A further examination was conducted on how an adaptive food web responds to perturbation and biological invasions.

**PERKINS**, Meghan Samantha (Biochemistry)*Investigating the mechanism of action of hormones used in hormone replacement therapy via oestrogen receptor subtypes, and the influence of the progesterone receptor*

Some oestrogens and progestins used in menopausal hormone therapy are associated with increased breast cancer risk, while custom-compounded bioidentical oestrogens are not. All oestrogens and progestins were found to increase proliferation and anchorage-independent growth of a breast cancer cell line. Mechanistic studies revealed that the oestrogens elicit similar biological effects via the oestrogen receptor (ER) subtypes, while testosterone-derived progestins displayed activity via only ER $\alpha$ . Some progestins increased ER-target gene expression via a mechanism requiring an association between ER $\alpha$  and the progesterone receptor on target gene promoters. These findings have important implications for the risk-benefit ratio of menopausal hormone therapy.

**RANIRINA**, Dinna (Mathematics)*Refinable vector splines and multi-wavelets with shortest matrix filters*

Over the last three decades, wavelet techniques have become increasingly popular for the decomposition into its low-frequency and high-frequency components of a given signal, with significant industrial applications in image processing, for example. Whereas the underlying mathematical theory for the wavelet decomposition of single-valued signals is well established, many analogous aspects with respect to the multi-valued case have remained unsolved. An existing scalar wavelet construction method was extended to the vector setting, resulting in explicit formulations of multi-wavelets and their associated shortest possible matrix filter sequences. The work contributes substantially to the mathematical analysis of wavelets, and yielded efficient decomposition algorithms for multi-valued signals.

**ROOS**, Wiets Gideon (Biochemistry)*An assessment of the diversity and pathogenicity of potato leafroll virus in South Africa*

The potato leafroll virus (PLRV) is a major threat to potato production in South Africa. In trials in the Sandveld region, the routinely used enzyme-linked immunosorbent assay (ELISA) could not detect low levels of PLRV as present in seed potatoes, but the reverse transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) could. High temperatures often reduce levels of PLRV below the ELISA detection limit. Whole genome sequencing revealed that South African PLRV isolates are related to Australian strains or are recombinants of European and Australian isolates, posing a unique threat to sustainable potato production in South Africa. The study therefore makes an important contribution to food security in this country.

**SMIT**, Albert Bart (Physics)*Investigating the photo-induced ultrafast insulator-metal phase transition in organic Cu(DCNQI)<sub>2</sub> salts by ultrafast electron diffraction*

Organic low-dimensional conductors are materials of interest, as exotic phenomena like transitions from a glass-like insulator to a metal-like conductor are accessible. The switching mechanisms between these phases by a laser pulse were experimentally disclosed by following the molecular motions at their primary timescales using ultrafast electron diffraction. Simulations were used to convert diffraction data to meaningful motions of atoms. An excellent signal response time of the material of a millionth of a millionth of a second was found, which has the potential to be tailored. The ability to perform complex molecular ultrafast structural dynamics experiments was exposed.

**SMITH**, Marthinus Luther (Plant Biotechnology)*Isolation and characterisation of novel enzymes producing fructo- and galacto-oligosaccharides through a metagenomic approach*

There is a great demand for new enzymatic biocatalysts with improved capabilities of producing galacto-oligosaccharides and fructo-oligosaccharides. In this study, the construction and screening of numerous metagenomic libraries for prebiotic oligosaccharide and polymer synthesising enzymes were presented. The metagenomic DNA were sampled from locations rich in substrate used for the production of the before-mentioned prebiotics. The isolation, amplification and *in silico* analysis of three novel genes encoding proteins belonging to the glycosyl hydrolase families 1, 2 and 68 were presented. Their respective polypeptides were heterologously expressed in *E. coli* and subsequently characterised biochemically, and so to their respective products.

**TEGEGNE**, Newayemedhin Aberra (Physics)*Photophysics and photovoltaic application of direct heteroarylation-derived isoindigo-based copolymers*

Organic solar cells are a potential substitute to the expensive silicon-based solar cells. In this work, organic solar cells were fabricated and characterised. A moderate power conversion efficiency was found. The electricity-generation steps were investigated using femtosecond-transient absorption spectroscopy. Exciton splitting within the polymeric material was found. This intramolecular process is essential to lower the binding energy of excitons, which is the reason for lower open-circuit voltage in such devices. Electricity-generation processes in organic solar cells occur on time scales between 100 femtoseconds and milliseconds.

**VAN SCHALKWYK**, Welmarie (Polymer Science)*Tuning polyisocyanide hydrogel stiffness*

In the field of tissue engineering, it is very important to control the stiffness of the hydrogel matrix in which cells are seeded. Polyisocyanides have shown to currently be the only synthetic polymers that lead to hydrogels with strain-stiffening properties, similar to natural polymers such as fibrin and collagen. In this project, graft copolymers were synthesised, based on a polyisocyanide backbone in order to increase

the stiffness of the resulting hydrogels. It was found that the grafts prevented bundling of polyisocyanides, which led to either no hydrogel formation or the formation of hydrogels only at higher polymer concentration.

*Homologous down-regulation of the glucocorticoid receptor is influenced by the dimerisation state of the receptor*

Glucocorticoids are used to treat inflammation and act via the glucocorticoid receptor (GR $\alpha$ ). The chronic use of glucocorticoids generates undesirable side-effects and induces ligand-induced GR $\alpha$  down-regulation, which may culminate in acquired glucocorticoid-resistance in many psychological and pathological conditions. The current study identified a novel role for GR $\alpha$  dimerisation in mediating GR $\alpha$  turnover. Moreover, the dimerisation state of the GR $\alpha$  influenced the post-translational processing of the receptor, impacting its degradation via the proteasome. Lastly, a model to mimic acquired glucocorticoid-resistance was established and tested. These results expand our understanding of factors that contribute to glucocorticoid resistance and may be exploited clinically.

*A molecular study of two South African decapod groups*

The molecular phylogeography and phylogenetics of freshwater decapods were examined to determine the population genetic structure and conservation management of species. Genetic results revealed contrasting patterns of population differentiation, suggesting high levels of site phylopatry for some species and marked dispersal in others species due to marked amphidromy. Phylogenetic results of the Afrotropical freshwater decapods revealed divergent patterns of cladogenesis and were characterised by distinct regionalised conservation prioritisation.

*A microscopic description of elastic scattering from unstable nuclei within a relativistic framework*

Proton elastic scattering from unstable nuclei was studied within a relativistic framework. The scattering observables were obtained by solving the Dirac equation in position and momentum space with a local and non-local optical potential, respectively. The bound state wave functions were calculated from a relativistic mean-field approximation to the governing Euler-Lagrange equations. The nucleon-nucleon interaction was described using a general Lorentz-invariant representation of the interaction matrix. Within experimental error, the model provides a consistent description of the cross-section, analysing power and spin rotation parameter at energies between 200 and 500 MeV.

*A reflective account of facilitator practice improvement in a leadership development programme in the technical and vocational education and training (TVET) sector*

The study reported on an action research project focused on how to facilitate transformative learning in addressing the need for leadership capacity building in the South African Technical Vocational Education and Training sector. The findings highlighted the relevance of facilitator development in promoting transformative learning in a leadership development context. The findings further suggested that integrating transformative learning in leadership practices encourages reflective learning: learning about the organisational environment and learning about the nature and management of relationships. The original contribution is a transformative professional development framework that demonstrates how a novice facilitator of transformative learning developed an epistemology of practice.

*An exploration of how discourses of efficiency and social justice shaped the technical and vocational education and training (TVET) sector with special reference to TVET colleges*

Post-1994, the ANC government was faced with the challenge of building an efficient and sustainable education and training system that both addressed the legacies of apartheid and offered students access to a form of education and training that would lead to employment. This study explored the influences of market-directed educational policies in shaping practices at the Technical Vocational Educational and Training (TVET) colleges. This dissertation demonstrated, conceptually and empirically, how market-directed educational policies struggled to achieve contrasting efficiency and social justice objectives within the TVET sector.

*The effects of student identities on English as a Foreign Language Learning: Motivation in Saudi university context*

A robust theoretical framework is required to investigate the role of motivation and identity in language learning. The L2 Motivational Self System, proposed by Dörnyei (2005), represents such a framework that considers the self as the focal point of language learning motivation. The study used the L2 Motivational Self System to investigate the language learning motivation of male, Saudi university students. It found that the system requires expansion because it is predicated on the primacy of the self in language learning motivation, ignoring the significance of present selves to the motivation of English students in the Saudi context.

*A phenomenological investigation into the lived experience of selected Accounting teachers in the Western Cape province*

This study investigated the lived experiences of selected Further Education and Training Accounting teachers residing in the Western Cape province of South Africa. Theoretically, it drew on Edmund Husserl's life world theory. The philosophical lenses were respectively used to craft a descriptive narrative, interpretive narrative and anticipatory interpretive narrative for each participant. The findings revealed education experiences and the participants' professional trajectories as Accounting teachers. The implications of the findings for policy-makers, curriculum designers, teacher educators and educational researchers were explored.

*Democratic citizenship education in Zimbabwe's education system and its implications for teaching and learning*

This study examined the implications of democratic citizenship education for Zimbabwean higher education. The main research question addressed was: Does the Zimbabwean higher education system contain a justifiable form of democratic citizenship education? It was found that higher education in Zimbabwe is already framed according to a limited understanding of liberal democratic citizenship education. It was argued that democratic citizenship education in becoming holds the potential to enable students and teachers to think autonomously and to respect others with whom students co-belong. Such a form of democratic citizenship education can enhance pedagogical encounters aimed at cultivating responsible individuals.

*Towards real-world biomechanical detection of fatigue, energy and injury in runners using wearable trunk accelerometry*

Over two decades ago it was acknowledged that obtaining objective data in real-life environments using wearable technology is of high priority with potential to advance performance in runners while also reducing their overuse injury risk. Thus, the global objective of this dissertation was to expand understanding by means of wearable technology with transferability to 'real-world' settings. Four experimental studies were conducted utilising both indoor and outdoor locations. Overall, this doctoral dissertation contributed to a better understanding of a runner's dynamic stability and loading in the real world, and in relation to fatigue, energy and injury by using wearable trunk accelerometry.

*The legal regulation of construction procurement as a relational construct in South Africa*

This dissertation involved an analysis of relational contract theory, created in the American private law of contract, which may potentially form a theoretical framework on which the legal regulation of government construction procurement in South African could be based. The study established that the current formalistic private law of contract, as applied to government contracts after the awarding of a contract, makes inadequate provision for the multi-faceted, constitution-based nature of the government procurement process and resultant contract. A relational procurement law based on relational contract theory was proposed as a means to address these inadequacies in providing the framework in which fairness, equity, transparency, competition and cost-effectiveness – as required by section 217 of the Constitution – can operate.

*A critical analysis of the legal environment in respect of the private equity industry in South Africa*

Private equity as an asset class is an underdeveloped field of study in South Africa. It is also not statutorily regulated like other asset classes. From an economic perspective, however, private equity could play an important role in economic growth. The candidate analysed the statutory regulation of private equity from a comparative perspective with other common-law jurisdictions as well as the possible economic impact of regulation. The candidate critically discussed the risks associated with private equity investing such as the lack of transparency and disclosure, excessive fees, conflicts of interest, and over-leveraging of acquisitions. The candidate concluded that there is a significant variation in the level and form of regulation of private equity in different jurisdictions and that an appropriate balance between over-regulation and under-regulation should be considered by the South African legislature to promote the effectiveness of private equity as an asset class.

*The integration of work and parenting: A comparative legal analysis*

The candidate analysed the extent to which law facilitates the integration of work and the demands of parenting – still disproportionately borne by women in society – through both the right to equality and specific minimum rights. The thesis contains ground-breaking comparative research into the laws of Brazil, China, Russia and India and provides two important insights: first, equality law has been ineffectual in addressing the persistent divide between women and work; second, South African law lags behind that of other developing countries. Based on these insights, the candidate made well-founded suggestions for the inclusion of extended specific rights in our legislation.

*A comparative study of the effectiveness of bidder remedies in South Africa and Nigeria*

The study, comprised of nine chapters, analytically compared the bidder remedies systems of South Africa and Nigeria, and assessed their effectiveness as mechanisms for enforcing public procurement regulation in both jurisdictions. It assessed the countries' procurement regulatory and institutional frameworks that relate to bidder remedies, and comparatively analysed the administrative, judicial and other forms of remedies for procurement within the jurisdictions. The study's overarching finding, and thesis statement, was that the design of the bidder remedies systems affects their effectiveness. Thus, it presented suggestions for improving the effectiveness of these systems; and recommended blueprints for generally designing bidder remedies systems.

*Developing the South African law of delict: The creation of a statutory compensation fund for crime victims*

The candidate evaluated the compensatory relief that South African law currently provides to victims of crime and concluded that the existing mechanisms that are supposed to further this end are unsatisfactory. The candidate thereafter sought to establish whether creating a statutory compensation fund for crime victims could be justified and appropriate in the South African legal context. After considering the current legal position, as well as the experiences of legal systems that have already introduced statutory compensation funds, it was concluded that, in principle, providing a similar form of statutory relief for crime victims is also justifiable in the local context.

## EREGRADE | HONORARY DEGREES

vir sy uitsonderlike strewe na meer verantwoordelike, inklusiewe korporatiewe oorsig, sy bydrae tot die verbetering van korporatiewe deursigtigheid en openbaarmaking, sy klem op ondernemings se sosiale impak en langtermynvolhoubaarheid, en vir sy navolgenswaardige voorbeeld van betrokke burgerskap en verantwoordelike leierskap.

Sedert professor Mervyn King in die 1980's tot die sakesektor toegetree het, het hierdie senior advokaat en voormalige regter van die hooggereghof nie net verantwoordelike burgerskap en goeie korporatiewe bestuur in Suid-Afrika help vestig nie, maar is hy ook 'n leier in die verbetering van korporatiewe deursigtigheid en openbaarmaking wêreldwyd.

Onder sy voorsitterskap het die King-komitee oor Korporatiewe Bestuur in Suid-Afrika vier invloedryke verslae uitgegee. Dié het 'n goudstaard vir goeie korporatiewebestuurspraktyke geword, en is by die noteringskriteria van die Johannesburgse Effektebeurs ingesluit. Die verslae, wat sir Adrian Cadbury in 2009 "die toekoms van korporatiewe beheer" genoem het, het vernuwing soos 'n klem op etiese leierskap, korporatiewe burgerskap, volhoubare rapportering en geïntegreerde verslagdoening bekend gestel.

Afgesien van sy invloedryke rol in die King-komitee, word hy ook in ander forums ewe hoog geag. In diens van die land en vasteland staan hy aan die stuur van die Venootskap vir Deursigtigheid in Afrika en dien hy as 'n lid van die advieskomitee van die Universiteit van Stellenbosch Bestuurskool se Sentrum vir Korporatiewe Bestuur in Afrika. Op die groter wêreldverhoog is hy onder meer voorsitter van die Internasionale Raad vir Geïntegreerde Verslagdoening (IIRC), emeritusvoorsitter van die Wêreldwye Verslagdoeningsinisiatief (GRI), en 'n lid van die Wêreldbank se privaatsektoradviesgroep oor korporatiewe bestuur.

Met sy voorspraak vir goeie korporatiewe bestuur het hierdie bewame sakeman, skywer en mediakommentator al vele internasionale eerbewyse ontvang – mees onlangs, in 2016, 'n prys vir lewenslange prestasie van die Internasionale Netwerk vir Korporatiewe Bestuur, en die Orde van die Kremetart van die Sake-etieknetwerk van Afrika.

Die Universiteit Stellenbosch vereer graag professor Mervyn King vir sy voortreflike bydrae tot die bevordering van inklusiewe, verantwoordelike en verantwoordbare korporatiewe bestuur. Hy vergestal die tipe betrokke burger en verantwoordelike leier wat die Universiteit graag wil oplewer.

for his exceptional pursuit of more responsible, inclusive corporate governance, his contributions to improving corporate transparency and disclosure, his emphasis on businesses' social impact and long-term sustainability, and for serving as a role model of engaged citizenship and responsible leadership worth emulating.

Since Professor Mervyn King entered commerce in the 1980s, this senior counsel and former Supreme Court judge has not only helped establish responsible citizenship and sound corporate governance in South Africa, but has been at the forefront of improving corporate transparency and disclosure worldwide.

Under his chairmanship, the King Committee on Corporate Governance in South Africa has produced four seminal reports. These have become the gold standard for sound corporate governance practices and have been incorporated into the Johannesburg Stock Exchange's listing criteria. Having introduced innovations such as a focus on ethical leadership, corporate citizenship, sustainability reporting and integrated reporting, the King reports were dubbed "the future of corporate governance" by Sir Adrian Cadbury in 2009.

In addition to his influential role in the King Committee, he is held in equally high esteem in other forums. In service of the country and continent, he *inter alia* heads up the Partnership for Transparency Africa and serves as a member of the advisory committee of the University of Stellenbosch Business School's Centre for Corporate Governance in Africa. On the bigger world stage, his roles include serving as chairman of the International Integrated Reporting Council, chairman emeritus of the Global Reporting Initiative and a member of the World Bank's private-sector advisory group on corporate governance.

His corporate governance advocacy has earned this accomplished businessman, author and media commentator many international accolades – most recently, in 2016, a lifetime achievement award from the International Corporate Governance Network and the Business Ethics Network of Africa's Order of the Baobab.

Stellenbosch University is pleased to honour Professor Mervyn King for his outstanding contribution to the advancement of inclusive, responsible and accountable corporate governance. He embodies the type of engaged citizen and responsible leader the University seeks to produce.

ARSENIO DA SILVA, Berta (Development Finance)

*Understanding the financial vulnerability and the financial decisions of non-governmental organisations: An empirical study of Ugandan NGOs*

The dissertation addressed an important gap in literature on NPO financial vulnerability: financial vulnerability of NGOs in developing countries. The contributions of this work are exclusively empirical, applying the conceptual framework of the extant academic literature on NPO financial vulnerability. This study is yet another arrow in the quiver for the argument of building a well-capacitated social sector in every country, but especially so in developing economies in Africa and around the world.

GROBLER, Rikus (Business Management and Administration)

*The influence of self-efficacy and perceived organisational support on idea implementation*

The successful exploitation of new ideas is crucial to organisations. The challenge for management is to determine how to successfully and consistently translate the potentially useful ideas of employees into innovative action and results. The objectives of this study were to investigate the influence of both individual and organisational variables on idea implementation by employees in an organisation. The results showed that at the organisational level, simple, unpretentious acts of support from managers, such as genuinely listening to a person's idea and displaying confidence in a person's abilities to implement an idea, have a positive influence on idea implementation and, at the individual level, improvement of employees' interpersonal communication competence and encouragement of employees' inquisitiveness could also improve individual innovative behaviour.

KHOMO, Melvin Muizwakhe (Development Finance)

*Essays on exchange rate behaviour in South Africa*

The study was motivated by the proposition that proactive exchange rate policy and deliberate currency undervaluation can foster economic growth through exports and foreign investments. In four essays the study presented evidence of exchange rate misalignment and volatility and their effects on economic growth and exports in South Africa. The study found episodes of overvaluation and undervaluation over the period 1985–2014, largely in response to shocks experienced by the country. Periods of high exchange rate volatility were found to coincide with undervaluation episodes. Asymmetry was confirmed in the reaction of economic output and exports to exchange rate misalignment, with volatility having no meaningful impact.

LINKE, Arthur (Business Management and Administration)

*The development of an empirical enterprise risk management values scale accounting for the effect of culture in emerging market managers*

Taking risk represents the essence of business activity, and risk management is thus a cornerstone of organisational value creation. The study's key contribution is the development of the first risk management attitudes scale (and resulting constructs) through an academically rigorous theoretical and empirical process. The scale measures employees' values towards risk management critical success factors inside an organisation. It has direct benefits for both academics and managers, as utilising this scale will help in understanding the critical success factors, interpreting values towards these in the organisation, and thus improving the ability of the organisation to ultimately achieve its objectives and create value.

MÖLLER, Daniël Michiel (Business Management and Administration)

*Assessment of the willingness to pay and determinants influencing the large consumers' perspectives regarding the supply of premium green electricity in South Africa*

Coal-fired generation plants currently represent approximately 90% of the South African electricity supplier Eskom's generating capacity. Climate change, limited natural resources and pollution footprints all mitigate in favour of cleaner generating technologies. The current cost of green technologies, however, requires an understanding of the willingness of the large consumers to pay for renewable energy sources. Through the development of a theoretical model, a large-scale questionnaire and structural equation modelling, this study identified the key drivers of the willingness of large consumers to pay a premium for green electricity, thus making an important contribution to the energy policy debate.

NGWANGWAMA, Matthias Mpake (Business Management and Administration)

*An exploratory study of organisational factors associated with the effectiveness of companies in the Namibian tertiary industry*

The critical role of business in society is undisputed. Yet, the reality of non-performing organisations seems to be apparent and around us. It seems that not all business organisations achieve their intended objectives, nor do they achieve the status of high-performance organisations. Invariably, there still seems to be frequent propositions that organisations, especially those in developing countries, are poorly managed. This exploratory study investigated this topic in a developing country, a context largely recognised to lack empirical literature on organisational behaviours. The study identified organisational practices, activities, mind-sets and behaviours that appear to be associated with effective organisations in Namibia.

RATEIWA, Ronald (Development Finance)

*Financial institutions, markets and structure linkages with economic performance in selected African countries: Time-series evidence*

The study investigated the relationship between financial sector development, economic growth and the channels through which the former influences the latter in Egypt, Nigeria and South Africa. Using advanced econometric modelling techniques, the study specifically explored the interlinkages among financial institutions, markets, structure and economic growth. While there is some variation across the countries, the results show that finance matters for economic growth in the three countries. In addition, the linkages between financial systems and economic growth are both direct and indirect. The variation in results across the countries can be explained by differences in regulation, effectiveness of regulation, structure of the economy, occurrence of bank crises, quality of lending, level of indebtedness, dominance of certain sectors of the economy by a few firms and the level of financial development in each country.

*Turi Kumwe (We are together): A transdisciplinary exploration of the Burundian specialty coffee and its sustainability challenges*

Many African countries depend on exports of agricultural products. Burundi, which is dependent on the export of coffee beans, has been studied from a transdisciplinary methodology. To do her research, the candidate lived in Burundi for 4,5 years to work for a 'fair trade' coffee company. Based on analysis of the changing global coffee industry over the last 100 years, the candidate did research on how the coffee company could make improvements across the entire value chain. Her primary conclusion is that while fair trade labelling is important, it needs to be complemented by continuous learning for innovation within agricultural enterprises.

*A coaching framework to facilitate transformative learning during senior leadership transitions*

When corporate leaders are promoted to senior positions, they face significant challenges and many fail. Career transitions present an opportunity for individual learning and growth. Transition coaching is used sporadically to support transitioning leaders, but current approaches often lead to superficial learning and change. Transformative learning theory is a mature, well-researched field that offers the potential to create deep, permanent shifts in people. In this study, an innovative transformative transition coaching framework was created that combines transformative learning theory and transition coaching approaches into a novel method to support transitioning leaders by facilitating permanent changes in their worldviews and perspectives.
