## **SUMMARY: LANGUAGE POLICY AND PLAN**

The official Language Policy and Language Plan of Stellenbosch University were approved by the Council of the University in 2002. The following summary is provided in the interests of brevity, but must be read in conjunction with, and is subject to, the full Language Policy and Plan. The full version is available at <http://www.sun.ac.za/taal>.

### **A. Language Policy**

1. The University is committed to the use and sustained development of Afrikaans as an academic language in a multilingual context. Language is used at the University in a manner that is directed towards its engagement with knowledge in a diverse society.
2. The University acknowledges the special status of Afrikaans as an academic language and accepts the responsibility to promote it. At the same time, it takes account of the status of English as an international language of communication and of isiXhosa as an emerging academic language.
3. The University distinguishes between the use of the three languages in the following manner:
  - Afrikaans is by default the language of learning and teaching at undergraduate level, while English is used to a greater extent at the postgraduate level;
  - isiXhosa is promoted as an emerging academic language. The University creates opportunities for students and staff to acquire communication skills in isiXhosa.
4. The institutional language of the University is, by default, Afrikaans, while English is also used, depending on the circumstances, as an internal language of communication. All three languages are used, where possible, for external communication.

### **B. Language Plan**

1. The Language Plan distinguishes between the implementation of the policy in learning and teaching situations and in the support services and management.
2. Choices between various language options may be made in learning and teaching situations, depending on the language abilities of the lecturer and the composition of the students and programme. These language options are arranged in a hierarchy. Reasons must be provided for deviating from the default option (see point 4 for details).

In extraordinary and compelling circumstances, the University may deviate from the language specification of a module or programme, on condition that any such deviation must be reviewed at the end of each semester to determine whether its continuation remains justified. The deans manage this process, reporting on it to the Executive Committee (Senate). The Language Committee must be informed of any deviation from the language specification of a module or programme and must be given the opportunity to enquire about such deviation, where necessary.

3. Three general guidelines apply with regard to the language of learning and teaching in class:
  - Modules in which a language is taught are conducted mainly in the language in question (e.g. isiXhosa is taught mainly in isiXhosa, Mandarin in Mandarin) and tasks, tests and examinations are set and answered accordingly.
  - Question papers in all other modules are set in Afrikaans and English and students may answer in Afrikaans or English.
  - Except in cases where the aim of the module is language acquisition or the study of the language, students may ask questions and expect answers in Afrikaans or English.
4. Departments choose and implement the various language specifications as follows (the above three points apply generally for all options):

### **A Specification\***

#### *Rationale*

Applies as the default mode for all undergraduate modules. No reasons need to be given for exercising this option.

#### *Characteristics*

- Teaching is mainly in Afrikaans.
- Study material, such as textbooks, notes, transparencies, and electronic learning and teaching material, may be in Afrikaans and/or English.
- Study framework is in Afrikaans and English.

### **T Specification (bilingual classes)**

#### *Rationale*

Is used for classes where

- students' language competence requires greater use of English
- a programme offered is unique to the University
- multilingualism is important in the context of a specific occupation
- the lecturer does not yet have an adequate command of Afrikaans.

#### *Characteristics*

- Teaching is in Afrikaans for at least 50% of the time.
- Textbooks and reading matter are in Afrikaans and/or English.
- Study notes, transparencies and electronic learning and teaching material are fully in Afrikaans and English, or alternately in Afrikaans and English.

### **E Specification (English as the main medium of instruction)**

#### *Rationale*

Is used only in highly exceptional circumstances for

- programmes unique in South Africa
- programmes in which students do not have adequate language skills (foreign or English-speaking students)
- modules in which the lecturer does not have a command of Afrikaans
- regional co-operation and strategic aims that necessitate English.

#### *Characteristics*

- Teaching is primarily in English.
- Textbooks and reading matter are in Afrikaans and/or English.
- Notes are in English with core notes in Afrikaans.
- Transparencies and electronic learning and teaching material are in English.

## **A & E Specification (separate 'streams' in Afrikaans and English)**

### *Rationale*

Used only in most exceptional circumstances when academically and financially justifiable and attainable for

- modules with large numbers of students
- regional co-operation and strategic goals
- programmes offered by satellite technology or interactive telematic education.

### *Characteristics*

The characteristics of the A and E options respectively apply here.

- \* For both of these options, academic language proficiency in Afrikaans and English is essential for successful study.
5. Afrikaans is the default language of communication for the support services and management. All official documents of the University are available in Afrikaans. 'Default' does not, however, mean 'exclusively': important policy documents are available in English and communication with staff is also conducted in English. Guidelines are provided for the language to be used at meetings. Documents relating to the service conditions for staff are available in Afrikaans, English and isiXhosa.
  6. Written communication with students is conducted in Afrikaans and English, and, where possible, recruitment is also conducted in isiXhosa. Oral communication is conducted in Afrikaans or English, according to the language of preference of the student.
  7. The corporate image of the University reflects the Language Policy and Plan.
  8. A Language Committee is appointed by the Council to implement the Language Policy and Plan.
  9. The Language Centre assumes the responsibility for the provision and/or co-ordination of the relevant language support required for the effective implementation of the Language Policy and Plan.

## **NON-RACISM**

Stellenbosch University admits students of any race, colour, nationality or ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programmes and activities generally accorded or made available to students of the University. The University does not discriminate on the basis of race, colour, nationality or ethnic origin in the implementation of its educational policies, its scholarship and loan programmes, or its sport programmes.

1. In this publication, any expression signifying one of the genders includes the other gender equally, unless inconsistent with the context.
2. Before making a final choice of modules (subjects), every student should closely consult the relevant timetables. Should it then become apparent that two modules fall in the same time slot on a particular timetable, the University will not allow registration as a student in both of them for the same year/semester, since they will be an inadmissible combination.
3. The University reserves the right to amend the Calendar at any time. The Council and the Senate of the University accept no liability for any inaccuracies there may be in the Calendar. Every reasonable care has been taken, however, to ensure that the relevant information to hand as at the time of going to press, is given fully and accurately in the

Calendar. Notifications regarding bursaries or the amendment of bursary conditions are announced through the official channels of the University and also sent to the deans of the faculties concerned.

4. In the event of uncertainty or a dispute regarding information in Part 2 of the Calendar, the final interpretation will be based on the Afrikaans version.
5. Parts 1, 2 and 3 of the Calendar contain general information applicable to all students. Students are urged to note with special care the content of the Provisions relating to Examinations and Promotions in the "University Examinations" chapter of Part 1 of the Calendar. In all instances, the onus rests on the students to inform themselves properly of the conditions for the allocation of bursaries.

# Section ONE: Orientation and General

## TERMINOLOGICAL PRELIMINARIES

### 1. Number

In this Part 2 of the University Calendar, any expression signifying the singular includes the plural, and vice versa, unless inconsistent with the context.

### 2. The term “programme”

In this Part 2 of the University Calendar, the terms “programme” and “programmes” are short for “instructional programme”/“programme of study” and “instructional programmes”/“programmes of study” respectively, unless inconsistent with the context (the Department of Education recently introduced a concept of ‘instructional programmes’ to replace the concept of ‘courses (of study)’).

### 3. The term “holder”

The term “holder” means “bursary holder, bursary loan holder and/or merit award holder”, unless inconsistent with the context.

### 4. The phrase “Stellenbosch University”

The phrase “Stellenbosch University” means the same as “University of Stellenbosch”, and is abbreviated as “SU”.

## 1.1 A WIDE RANGE OF BURSARIES AND BURSARY LOANS

Students and prospective students of the University are eligible for a wide range of bursaries and/or bursary loans. Roughly speaking, these fall into four broad types. Thus, there are -

1. merit awards for Stellenbosch University students, granted solely on the basis of scholastic or academic achievement.

Particulars of merit awards for SU first-year students appear in 1.5.1 below. For merit awards for senior undergraduate students of Stellenbosch University (second-year students and further, but not postgraduates), see 1.6 and 1.7 below.

Next, there are -

2. rebates for certain Stellenbosch University students.

For particulars, consult 1.5.3. There are also -

3. special bursaries for Stellenbosch University students, awarded on the basis of achievements other than scholastic or academic.

See further at 1.5.2 (first-year students) and at 1.6.7 (undergraduate seniors). Finally, there are -

4. a great many bursaries/bursary loans for undergraduate and postgraduate students of Stellenbosch University.

**In Section TWO, we give the names of these bursaries/bursary loans by faculty, and the page numbers where the particulars of these bursaries/bursary loans can be looked up.**

**The particulars of these bursaries and bursary loans appear, in an alphabetical list, in Sections THREE and FOUR respectively.**

The academic requirements for these bursaries/bursary loans are not necessarily as stringent as those for the merit awards.

**For other forms of recognition of academic merit, please see Sections FIVE, SIX and SEVEN.**

## **1.2 FINANCIAL NEEDINESS AND THE VARIOUS FORMS OF FINANCIAL SUPPORT**

Stellenbosch University believes that people who have the potential to make a success of academic studies should as far as practicable be given the appropriate opportunities. This is why we strive to provide as much support as we possibly can to those who gain admission to the University as students but lack the financial means required.

The financial neediness of its students is thus a factor to which the University is very much alert. Unfortunately, though, we do not have unlimited funds at our disposal. This means that students cannot look for financial support to the University only. Nor is the fact that a student has applied for a bursary and/or a bursary loan a guarantee in any sense that he will be granted such bursary or bursary loan.

The University provides only two forms of financial support for its students that they can be “sure” of, namely -

- merit awards (1.5.1 (for first-year students) and 1.6 (for undergraduate senior students)); and
- the “three children” rebates (see further 1.5.3 below).

In the granting of these awards and rebates, financial neediness is not among the factors taken into consideration. More information on financial neediness is to be found in 1.3.2.3 below.

In the first and last instance, therefore, each student of Stellenbosch University is personally responsible for making financial provision for the settlement of his student fees account.

## **1.3 SOME PROCEDURES AND CONDITIONS FOR BURSARIES AND BURSARY LOANS**

### **1.3.1 How to Apply for Bursaries and/or Bursary Loans**

#### *1.3.1.1 The correct procedure*

Any application for a bursary and/or a bursary loan can be considered by the University only if the applicant has followed the correct procedure:

- Obtain the prescribed application form(s) from the Head: Undergraduate Bursaries and Loans, **Admin Block A, Private Bag X1, Matieland 7602.**

#### *1.3.1.2 Failure to qualify for consideration*

- Applications received after the closing date (30 June for prospective students and 31 July for senior students) will be considered during a second phase, at a later stage, depending on the availability of funds for these late applications.
- Any application which is incomplete in whatever way will not be considered.
- Special students or students who are not registered for the minimum prescribed credits for their degree programmes in a relevant academic year will not be considered.

### 1.3.2 Qualifying for Bursaries and/or Loans

#### 1.3.2.1 *The two sets of factors in the University's allocation of bursaries*

Since the University's financial resources are not unlimited, it bases the allocation of bursaries and/or loans on both academic and financial factors. Central to the academic factors is the individual's potential to make a success of university studies. Central to the financial factors is the individual's financial neediness.

**Please Note:** All bursaries and bursary loans that are awarded to students may only be used for class fees, accommodation, meals and books. **No bursary or loan money may be used for travelling expenses, lodging with parents/guardian or equipment, e.g. computers, cameras, stationery or white laboratory coats.**

#### 1.3.2.2 *Academic factors*

##### 1.3.2.2.1 Minimum academic requirements

Students of the University, whether registered or prospective, must meet the minimum academic requirements for admission.

##### 1.3.2.2.2 First-year and EDP students

First-year students and EDP students (that is to say, students in one of the extended degree programmes) who have been admitted to the University as students on the strength of their results in the final school examinations (or equivalent examinations) are eligible for financial support (the University takes such admission to be sufficient proof of their capacity to make a success of university studies).

##### 1.3.2.2.3 Full-time, complete programmes

Undergraduate students of the University must be registered for full-time, complete programmes.

##### 1.3.2.2.4 Senior students

Senior students - that is, students in a second or further year of study - are required to have passed not less than two-thirds of the credits of their previous year of study.

**Senior students who have passed less than two-thirds of their credits of the year thereby are disqualified on academic grounds from being considered for any financial aid.**

#### 1.3.2.3 *Financial neediness*

##### 1.3.2.3.1 Full financial particulars

If an applicant has the academic potential to study successfully, the University will consider his financial neediness. To form an accurate picture of the applicant's financial position, the University requires the following document(s) concerning the finances of his parents/guardian/spouse:

##### 1.3.2.3.1.1 Employees

the parents'/guardian's/spouse's latest salary advice(s) or, where applicable, a letter from the employer declaring the parents'/guardian's/spouse's income; or

##### 1.3.2.3.1.2 Ex-employees, etc.

if the parent/guardian/spouse is a pensioner, or has taken a severance/early retirement package, or is dependent on revenue from interest, documents in proof of this fact; or

##### 1.3.2.3.1.3 Owners of businesses, farms, etc.

if the parent/guardian/spouse runs a business or farm of his own, the latest, properly audited statements of such business or farm.

#### 1.3.2.3.2 The means test

With these financial particulars to hand, the Undergraduate Bursaries and Loans Section then assesses the application in terms of the University's means test. The means test measures the extent of the applicant's financial neediness. This means test is administered, irrespective of persons, to applicants for any financial aid for which financial neediness is a precondition. Students are granted financial support, regardless of race and gender, in direct proportion to the extent of their neediness as measured by the means test. The applicant is generally regarded as financially needy if the gross family income is less than R20 000 per month and the family, therefore, does not qualify for a loan at a bank.

### 1.3.3 How Applicants Learn the Results of Their Applications

#### 1.3.3.1 *Prospective first-year students and registered students*

All proposed awards of bursaries to prospective students are finalised during September. The Undergraduate Bursaries and Loans Section then informs each applicant in writing of the outcome of his application soon hereafter.

### 1.3.4 Transfer of Bursary Monies to Student Fees Accounts

#### 1.3.4.1 *Transfer*

In the case of merit awards and of bursaries/bursary loans for local full-time studies which are received and administered by the University, the University transfers the monies concerned into the holders' student fees accounts.

#### 1.3.4.2 *Disbursement of merit award monies*

If a merit award holder's student fees account shows a credit balance, the University is prepared to disburse -

- one-half of the credit balance to the holder at the end of the first semester; and
- the other half of the credit balance to the holder at the end of the second semester.

*Please note:*

If a student holds a merit award together with a bursary or bursary loan of the University, credit will not be disbursed to him.

#### 1.3.4.3 *Instructions of Companies*

If a holder's student fees account shows a credit balance at the end of the year, the University will -

- credit the amount in question against the holder's account for the next year, or
- disburse the amount in question to the holder,

in strict accordance with the instructions of the companies of the merit award or bursary.

### 1.3.5 Senior Merit Awards

See 1.6 and 1.7 below.

### 1.3.6 Further General Provisions Relating to Bursaries/Bursary Loans

#### 1.3.6.1 *Reduction or cancellation*

A bursary and/or bursary loan may be cancelled or reduced at any time if the holder's conduct, diligence or progress is unsatisfactory or if he discontinues his studies, or if the standard of his class work or his examination results are, in the University's opinion, not adequate.

The amount of the bursary loan is determined by a financial means test. If the student receives any other bursary or bursaries (e.g. a SU merit award), the amount of the bursary

loan will be reduced accordingly or even cancelled. This reduction or cancellation of the bursary loan is done automatically and students and parents will not be notified about this beforehand.

#### *1.3.6.2 Repayment on non-completion*

If the holder of a bursary and/or bursary loan fails to complete his programme, the University may demand repayment by him of the amount disbursed to him.

### **1.4 FINANCIAL SOURCES OF MERIT AWARDS AND OF SPECIAL BURSARIES**

The bursaries referred to in 1.5 and 1.6 below are awarded from -

- funds voted by the Council of the University; and
- interest on unconditional donations and bequests received from time to time from persons and organisations well-disposed towards the University.

### **1.5 MERIT AWARDS AND SPECIAL BURSARIES FOR FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS**

#### **1.5.1 Merit Awards**

##### *1.5.1.1 Aggregate of 85% or more*

To candidates who obtain the National Senior Certificate in the performance categories 85%+, 90%+ and higher with the monetary value of the bursary awarded in the performance category 85% – 89.9% not less than 40% of the normal basic study fees for the year of the programme concerned, and with the percentages for the subsequent performance categories uniformly higher. The marks achieved for the subjects Life Orientation and Additional Mathematics will not be considered in the calculation of the average percentage obtained for the National Senior Certificate.

First-year students who wrote their matriculation examinations at another education department (e.g. Independent Examination Board), must bring their matriculation certificates to the Bursaries and Loans (Undergraduate) Section when applying for the bursary.

#### **1.5.2 Sport Bursaries**

First-year students who have superior sporting achievements to their credit are eligible for a range of special bursaries. Please contact the Sport Bureau: tel. (021) 808 4642.

#### **1.5.3 “Three Children” Rebate**

The University gives a 10% rebate on tuition fees where three or more children from the same family are studying at the University simultaneously.

### **1.6 MERIT AWARDS AND SPECIAL BURSARIES FOR SENIOR STUDENTS**

#### **1.6.1 Definitions**

##### *1.6.1.1 “Senior undergraduate students”*

For the purposes of this Part 2 of the University Calendar, the phrase “senior undergraduate students” means “senior students of the University who are taking undergraduate or postgraduate bachelor’s degrees - e.g. LLB as a second bachelor’s degree – but not honours degrees”.

For LLB as a second bachelor’s degree, see also 1.6.3.2 below.

##### *1.6.1.2 “Senior Merit Awards”*

For the purposes of this Part 2 of the University Calendar, “Senior Merit Awards” means the same as “merit awards for senior undergraduate students”.

## **1.6.2 Further General Provisions**

Subject to all relevant provisions of paragraph 1.3 above, the further general provisions for, and the particulars of, such Senior Merit Awards shall be as set forth in 1.6 and 1.7.

### **1.6.3 Requirements and Procedures**

#### *1.6.3.1 Students eligible*

Candidates for the Senior Merit Awards shall -

1.6.3.1.1 be senior undergraduate students of the University (as defined in 1.6.1.1);

1.6.3.1.2 be full-time students of the University;

1.6.3.1.3 take an appropriate degree programme;

1.6.3.1.4 take the full number of modules prescribed for the year of study concerned; and

1.6.3.1.5 obtain a weighted average of not less than 75% over a full academic year.

**For illustration of the way in which weighted averages are calculated, see 1.7 below.**

#### *1.6.3.2 LLB*

For the purposes of these Senior Merit Awards, students in the programmes for LLB as a second bachelor's degree shall be deemed to be undergraduate students (excluding final-year students who come into consideration for NRF and SU Postgraduate Merit Bursaries. *Please note:* Students have to apply formally for the latter bursaries at the Office for Postgraduate Bursaries).

#### *1.6.3.3 Postgraduate Students*

Students of the University registered for honours degrees, master's degrees or doctorates shall not be eligible for these Senior Merit Awards.

Postgraduate students are referred to the extensive list of bursaries in Section THREE.

#### *1.6.3.4 Which year of study*

For the purposes of these Senior Merit Awards, each candidate's weighted average is calculated with reference to the preceding year of study.

#### *1.6.3.5 When to apply in writing*

The said senior students of this University are eligible for these Senior Merit Awards automatically and therefore need not apply for them in writing while attending their programmes of instruction, provided that such applications in writing shall be required, however, if such students have interrupted their studies and resume them in a subsequent calendar year.

In June of the specific academic year during which senior students are entitled to a merit bursary, **the onus rests on them to verify whether their accounts reflect their bursaries.** If the latter are not reflected, they must notify the Section for Bursaries and Loans (Undergraduate) **before the end of October;** otherwise they forfeit their claim to a merit bursary.

### **1.6.4 Scale for Merit Awards**

With the exceptions provided for in 1.6.6 below, Senior Merit Awards shall be granted to second-year, third-year, fourth-year, fifth-year and sixth-year students in terms of the following scale:

Senior merit awards are granted as a percentage of the normal basic study fees for the year of the study programme concerned in the performance categories 75%+, 80%+, 90%+ and 95%+, with the monetary value of the bursary awarded in the performance category 75 - 79% not less than 25% of the normal basic study fees for the year of the study programme concerned, and with the percentages for the subsequent performance categories uniformly higher.

### **1.6.5 Fourth-year Students**

The fourth-year students who are eligible shall include students in inter alia the following programmes: BA in Visual Arts, BChD, BTh, BDram, BEng (F), BMus, BEd (Gen Ed), BOccTher, BScAgric, BSc Food Sc, BScFor, BScPhysio, LLB as a first bachelor's degree, LLB as a second bachelor's degree (excepting final-year students who are eligible for NRF and SU Postgraduate Merit Bursaries) and MB,ChB.

### **1.6.6 Fifth-year Students**

The fifth-year students who are eligible shall include students in the following programmes: MB,ChB and LLB.

## **1.7 SENIOR UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS: CALCULATING THE WEIGHTED AVERAGE**

### **1.7.1 Credit Values**

When senior undergraduate students' weighted averages are calculated for the purpose of Senior Merit Awards, account is taken of the respective credit values of the candidates' various subjects.

In the University Calendar, the credit value of a module in a subject is typically stated after its designation, in brackets.

For instance, the credit value

- of Sociology 114 (10) is 10;
- of Sociology 212 (6) is 6; and so forth.

Only students who take the full number of modules prescribed for the year of study concerned are considered for Senior Merit Bursaries.

## 1.8 IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR POSTGRADUATE APPLICANTS

- 1.8.1 Postgraduate candidates who already have a qualification on the same or higher level than the one they are seeking support for, are not eligible to apply for bursaries administered by Stellenbosch University.
- 1.8.2 Postgraduate students who register in the second semester will only receive half of the original amount allocated for bursaries administered by Stellenbosch University.
- 1.8.3 Where a particular bursary allows for postgraduate students to apply for renewal, such an application should reach the Office for Postgraduate Bursaries by the predetermined closing date and be accompanied by a recommendation from the supervisor/promotor. Renewal applications normally require a progress report by the supervisor/promotor.

1.3 The applicant is financially needy if the family does not qualify for a loan at a bank and/or cannot contribute sufficiently to the student's study costs.

1.4 Students receive financial support irrespective of race or gender, in direct relation to their level of financial neediness as determined by the means test.

**2. The application of funds**

2.1 Bursaries and/of bursary loans may only be used for tuition fees, accommodation (on campus or private), meals and textbooks.

2.2 Any credit in the student's account will be paid over to NSFAS at the end of the financial year.

**3. Interest rate**

3.1 Interest for 2011 will be charged at 4.4% from 1 April.

**4. Reward mechanisms**

4.1 If a student passes 100% of the subjects registered for in a specific year, he qualifies for a bursary of 40% of the allocated amount at the end of the academic year as a non-repayable bursary.

4.2 If the student passes 75% of the registered subjects, the bursary component is 30%.

4.3 If the student passes 50% of the registered subjects, the bursary component is 20%.

4.4 If the student passes 25% of the registered subjects, the bursary component is 10%.

**5. Repayment**

5.1 The loan part is repayable from the year following a student's completion of his

studies or discontinuation thereof.

5.2 Repayment starts only when the annual salary of the person who has completed his studies is R30 000 or more.

5.3 The repayment rate starts at 3% of an annual salary of R30 000 and rises in a linear way to 8% of R63 000 per year.

5.4 Special legislation makes provision that employers can recover the amount due directly from the salary of the person who has completed his studies and pay it over to NSFAS.

## **STELLENBOSCH UNIVERSITY BURSARY LOAN SCHEME**

### **1. Basic conditions and procedure**

Any field of study. Bursary loans for undergraduate students who are South African citizens. Loans are allocated on grounds of neediness and merit and students take a **full** academic load for a given year and must pass two thirds of their credits taken every year. The applicant is needy when the family do not qualify for a bank loan and/or cannot contribute a payment towards the student's studies. Students receive financial assistance in spite of race or gender on level of neediness as laid down by die means test.

The amount of the bursary loan is determined by a financial means test. If the student receives any other bursary or bursaries (e.g. a SU merit bursary), the amount of the bursary loan will accordingly be reduced or even cancelled. This reduction or cancellation of the bursary loan is done automatically and students and parents will not be notified about this beforehand.

### **2. The application of funds**

Bursaries and/or bursary loans can only be used for tuition fees, accommodation (on campus or private), meals and books.

### **3. Interest rate**

The interest on bursary loan amounts shall be fixed from year to year at prime minus a percentage of prime. In the year 2008, the rate shall be prime - 4% (the prime rate minus four per cent) for the entire year.

### **4. Incentives**

Students must take a full academic load for a given year to qualify for partial conversion of their loan into a bursary. For a given year, in terms of the incentives, the scheme shall convert into a bursary -

- 4.1 30% of the loan amount if the holder studies 100% successfully (in other words, if he obtains 100% of the prescribed credits for the subjects that he has registered for in the academic year concerned);
- 4.2 20% of the loan amount if the holder studies 80-99% successfully (in other words, if he obtains 80% to 99% of the prescribed credits for the subjects that he has registered for in the academic year concerned); and
- 4.3 10% of the loan amount if the holder studies 65-79% successfully (in other words, if he obtains 65% to 79% of the prescribed credits for the subjects that he has registered for in the academic year concerned).

A bursary loan holder who studies less than 65% successfully does not, however, qualify for any discount, nor for the continuation of the bursary loan.

## 5. Students in Extended Degree Programmes

### 5.1 General

Holders who take an approved extended degree programme shall be charged interest at prime minus 4% per annum from the date of allocation up to the end of the repayment period, except if they study successfully as set out immediately below.

### 5.2 Passing the first three years

If such holders pass the first three years of study, they shall qualify for discount as in paragraph 4.

### 5.3 Completion within four years

If such holders study successfully and complete their programme within four years, the scheme rewards them for their academic success in the following ways:

1. One-half of the bursary loan amount of their fourth year plus one-half of the interest payable for their fourth year shall be converted into a bursary; and
2. from the end of their fourth year, up to the end of their repayment period, they shall be charged interest at the reduced rate of prime minus 6% (six per cent).

## 6. Adjustment of rates and percentages

The rate of the interest payable on the loan amount (e.g. prime minus 4%), and the percentage for the conversion of the capital amount plus interest (e.g. 30%, 20% or 10%) into a bursary, are both constant in respect of a given year. Both of these figures may be adjusted in subsequent years, however, depending on various factors - for instance (i) increases or decreases in the prime lending rate, (ii) the availability of funds, (iii) estimates of neediness in general and (iv) views about students' success rate in general.

## 7. Exemption from interest for postgraduate study

Holders of an undergraduate bursary loan shall pay no interest if they proceed to postgraduate study, except if the postgraduate study is of such duration as to render an extra levy applicable to them - namely, interest at prime minus 4%.

## 8. Repayment

### 8.1 Term

Holders shall repay their bursary loan debt over a period of years equal to that for which they have received the bursary loan.

### 8.2 Penalty interest

If a holder falls in arrears with the repayment of his bursary loan, interest for the remainder of the repayment period shall be charged at the full prime rate.
