# Vingers op die klawers

Prof Nina Schumann is een van Suid-Afrika se voorste pianiste en ook uitstekend in klavieronderrig, as 'n mens so luister na haar studente by die US Konservatorium. Maar daarbenewens is sy ook artistieke direkteur van die Stellenbosch Internasionale Kamermusiekfees (SIKMF) – haar geesteskind wat vanjaar vir die tiende keer (van 5 tot 14 Julie) by die Konservatorium gehou word.

**My werk by die US wissel ...** tussen die gewone en die ongewone. In die eerste kategorie val my onderrig wat óf in groepsverband (akademiese klasse) óf op een-tot-een-basis (praktiese lesse) is. Ek het 'n groot aantal administrasie wat vir die klavierafdeling, asook die Stellenbosch Internasionale Klaviersimposium en die SIKMF gedoen moet word. So ek probeer om my dag te verdeel: ondernig van 08:30 tot 13:00, gevvolg deur administrasie en ook self klavier oefen. Die ongewone gebeur so 'n paar maande voor die simposium en die kamermusiekfees wanneer artistieke reëlings tot 'n punt kom en die finale logistiek uitgevoer moet word.

**Ek het nooit gedink ek sal regtig van klasgee hou nie ...** As jy 'n kunstenaar is, bly jy maar selfsgutig en 'n mens loop altyd die gevaar dat jy lesgee met die idee in jou agterkop dat jy eerder sou wou oefen. Maar ek is elke dag met respek bewus van die enorme verantwoordelikheid wat 'n mens teenoor die studente moet hê. Dit verg ondervinding om die studente as mens te laat ontwikkel sonder om te veel in te meng. Vir my is dit wonderlik om studente se groei te aanskou.

**By die kamermusiekfees ...** is ek die artistieke direkteur, wat beteken ek identifiseer alle kunstenaars en uitgenooide gaste en stel die musiekprogramme saam. Ek geniet dit verskriklik, want elke jaar vra ek die kunstenaars wat hulle graag sal wil speel, ek kry dan 'n enorme lys en luister vir 'n week na al die werke. Ek leer baie in die proses – van werke wat ek nog nooit van gehoor het nie tot my instink van watter programme sal werk. Dan doen ek ook administratiewe dinge, soos om die oudisies uit te werk en die legkaart van 'n skedule op te stel.

**Ek is mal oor ...** die kreatiewe en opvoedkundige sy van die kamermusiekfees, van die spanning om op die verhoog te loop met minimale repetisietylde, tot die ongelooflike impak wat die fees op die deelnemers het. Ook is daar die kameraderie van die feesfakulteit en die enorme respekte vir



mekaar wat 'n mens laat voel dat jy deel is van 'n wêreldgemeenskap. Die fees is altyd my gelukkigste tyd van die jaar!

**Ek oefen in blokke ...** met die belofte dat ek drie uur se oefen per dag sal inpas. Dit werk natuurlik nie altyd so uit nie. Soms doen jy minder, soms meer, maar vir my is die dae van sewe uur per dag oefen ongelukkig verby. Ek probeer 'n sekere aantal konserste per jaar handhaaf en probeer ook al meer konserste in verskillende kombinasies doen: van solo en concerto tot kamermusiek. Oorsese reise en CD's opneem probeer ek inpas volgens die Universiteit se kalender. Gelukkig is die Universiteit ondersteunend van die kreatiewe uitsette.

**Vrye tyd is ...** om te leer om soos enige normale mens 'n naweek met die kinders te spandeer. My oudste, Antonio, is nou ses jaar oud en ek kry dit nou eers reg om nie skuldig te voel as ek nie die naweek ook werk nie. Ek en my man, Luis Magalhães (ook 'n konsertpianis en verbonde aan die Konservatorium), hou van rolprente kyk en ons probeer muurbal speel so veel ons kan.

# Ingrid Jonker tref steeds

Bykans 50 jaar ná haar dood gryp Ingrid Jonker steeds die verbeelding aan. En ondanks vele werke oor haar wat reeds verskyn het, word elke nuwe boek met groot geesdrif ingewag.

Die saksgrootte biografie *Ingrid Jonker*, deur prof Louise Viljoen van die US se Departement Afrikaans en Nederlands, is geen uitsondering nie. En die resensente het dit baie goed ontvang. Op die Versindaba-webwerf skryf Daniel Hugo so oor die boek: "Dit is 'n wonderbaarlike boek wat enige tyd net so goed of selfs beter is as enige Kannemeyer-biografie van vyf keer die omvang".

*Ingrid Jonker* word in Engels deur Jacana uitgegee as deel van 'n reeks oor bekende Suid-Afrikaners. Die Jonker-boek is die eerste oor 'n skrywer.

Viljoen het sowat agtien maande lank – "tussen ander goed deur" – aan die boek gewerk. "Gelukkig is daar al baie oor Ingrid geskryf en ek kon ook


dokumente van Jack Cope (een van Jonker se minnaars) in die Nasionale Engelse Letterkundige Museum in Grahamstad bestudeer," sê sy.

Cope se seun, die skrywer Mike Cope, het lank gelede geskryf die kombinasie van sensualiteit, rebelsheid en vroeë afsterwe het daartoe bygedra dat Jonker, jare nadat sy die see ingestap het, steeds die verbeelding aangryp.

"Maar," sê Viljoen, "as die gedigte nie ook van waarde was nie, sou die belangstelling in Jonker nie so groot gewees het nie. As navorsing was sy versigtig oor hoe sy met brieve en dagboeke omgegaan het."

"Dokumente is nie onskuldige tekste nie. Daar is altyd 'n mate van selffabrikasie in dagboeke en brieve. Die skrywer presenteert hom/haarself deur sy/haar skrywe – veral in die geval van brieve aan 'n minnaar/minnares. 'n Mens moet nooit verlei word om te dink 'n dokument gee die hele

waarheid weer nie. Wanneer iets neergeskryf word, is dit reeds 'n vertolking van gebeure."

## Matie athlete honoured with National Order

Matie Paralympic athlete Ilse Hayes has done SU proud once again. She was awarded the Order of Ikhamanga in Silver for "her courageous and relentless pursuit of excellence and incredible physical endurance".

National Orders are the highest awards that the country, through its President, bestows on its citizens. The Order of Ikhamanga recognizes those who excel in the fields of sport, literature, journalism, arts and culture.

Hayes, who is visually impaired, participates in the 100m, 200m and

long jump and has won two gold, two silver and one bronze Paralympic medal in 2004, 2008 and 2012. She works as the Sports Coordinator at SU's After School Programme at Lentelus, which forms part of the HOPE Project.

"The award is also great motivation for me to train harder and push myself even more," says Hayes, who is currently training for the International Paralympic Committee Athletics World Championships in Lyon, France, in July.

She concludes that being awarded the highest accolade by the president once again proves that having a disability does not have to hold you back – you can accomplish anything.

## Western Cape learners contribute to scientific publication about ants

Ant data collected by Grade 10 learners from the Western Cape for SU's limbokane Outreach Project were published in an international peer-reviewed scientific journal, *PLOS One*.

The limbokane Outreach Project is managed by the DST-NRF Centre for Invasion Biology (C•I•B) at SU. The Centre is a national network of researchers and students working on biodiversity and biological invasions in South Africa.

Since 2006, learners from 18

secondary schools have been taking part in a research project that monitors ant variety across the Western Cape. As part of their practical work the learners do vegetation surveys twice a year and set pitfall traps around their school grounds to collect ants.

limbokane project manager, Dorette du Plessis, says to date they have identified 175 morphospecies (species distinguished on the basis of their form and structure) in the various collection sites.

"Ants are important to the environment because they act as ecosystem engineers. In the Western Cape, they take the fynbos seeds into their nests to feed on its nutritious sugary coating. The nest then provides protection to the seed until it germinates," she explains.

The combined efforts of this 10-year monitoring programme have led to three papers in important journals, namely the *Journal of Insect Conservation*, *BioScience* and *PLOS One*.

## Universities share best practices in transformation

There is unanimity among the Western Cape's four public universities on the need for higher-education transformation and the benefits of sharing experiences in this regard.

This much was clear from a "Transformation: Best Practices" workshop of the Cape Peninsula University of Technology (CPUT), the University of Cape Town (UCT), the University of the Western Cape (UWC) and SU recently.

The day-long meeting took place at Asara Estate outside Stellenbosch on 25 April, and was also attended by the Cape Higher Education Consortium (Chec), the Human Rights Commission (HRC), and the Institute for Justice and Reconciliation (IJR).

The CPUT delegation was led by Manager of Institutional Transformation, Social Cohesion and Diversity, Makhwenke George Mvalo, UCT by Deputy Vice-Chancellor Prof Crain Soudien, UWC by Executive Director of Human Resources Amanda Glaeser, and SU by Vice-Rector for Community Interaction and Staff, Prof Julian Smith. UCT Vice-Chancellor Dr Max Price participated in the morning session, while his SU counterpart, Prof Russel Botman, was present throughout the day.

The four university delegations each made a presentation on transformation at their own institutions. This was done with a view to learning from each other.

A number of the participants proposed that the workshop as regional initiative should be taken forward in some form.

## US se nuwe Olimpiese swembad beskik oor jongste tegnologie



Bouwerk aan die US se nuwe 50m-swembad sal einde Junie voltooi wees.

Die nuwe Olimpiese standaard swembad by die US is tans in aanbou en vorder goed om na verwagting teen 30 Junie voltooi te word.

Dié 50m-swembad van tien swembane, met 'n breedte van 2,5m elk, en 'n diepte van ongeveer 2,2m voldoen volledig aan nasionale en Olimpiese standaarde vir swim asook vir watersportsoorte soos waterpolo en onderwaterhokkie.

"Die projek van R11,6 miljoen sal 'n groot aanwinst wees vir watersport op Stellenbosch. Die vorige 33m-swembad het glad nie aan hierdie standaarde voldoen nie en dit het watersport aan die US gekniehalter," sê Chris Munnik, Hoofdirekteur: Fasiliteitsbestuur aan die US.

Die projek word deur die US befonds, met 'n ruim bewilliging van die Remgro Groep. In terme van die ooreenkoms met Remgro sal 'n gedeelte van die swembad se kapasiteit ook vir 'n bepaalde tyd weekliks tot beskikking van die Stellenbosch Akademie vir Sport (SAS) wees wat dit vir die oefening en opleiding van sportlui sal kan gebruik. Dié ooreenkoms geld vir 10 jaar.

Hoewel die nuwe swembad deel

uitmaak van die groter meesterplan vir 'n nuwe akwasiële sentrum met paviljoene, 'n verdere 50m-swembad, duiktenk vir skuba- en ander swemfasilitete, word slegs die een nuwe swembad tans aangebou in die plek van die bestaande ou swembad met die res wat moontlik later sal volg as fondse beskikbaar is.

Die gras-skuinstes aan weerskante van die bestaande ou swembad word vir eers behou waar toeskouers tydens byeenkomste op verskuifbare paviljoene sal kan sit. Dit sal later met permanente paviljoene vervang kan word.

Die nuwe swembad beskik oor die heel nuutste tegnologie soos elektromagnetiese tydhoub-toerusting, meganiese verhitting en verkoeling ondersteun deur sonpanele, die heel nuutste tipe wegspingsblokke, infrastruktuur vir onderwaterkameras, stroboskopiese onderwater-strookbeligting vir passaangee tydens oefeninge, asook golfbeheer-infrastruktuur.

Die bane vir onderwaterhokkie word in die teëlwerk ingebou en toue vir waterpolo word voorsien. Die swembad sal oor al die nodige doelhokke en ander toerusting wat vir hierdie watersporte benodig word, beskik.

recognises South African citizens who have contributed to the struggle for democracy, nation-building, building democracy and human rights, justice and peace as well as for the resolution of conflict.

At STIAS, Mangena is working on a book publication, *On our Own*, in which he "examines South African politics in exile and how that had an impact on the relationship of political parties inside the country".

## Vestiging van opleidingsinstituut erken

Pieter Kloppers, Direkteur: Sentrum vir Studentegemeenskappe by die US, en dr Munita Dunn, Adjunkdirekteur: Sentrum vir Studentegemeenskappe, is onlangs deur die Association of College and University Housing Officers – International (ACUHO-I) vereer vir die werk wat hulle verrig het om 'n opleidingsinstituut vir personeel gemoed met studentehuisvesting in Suid-Afrika te vestig. Hulle het toekennings ontvang vir hul leierskap, diens en bydrae tot die opleiding en professionalisering van studentehuisvestingspersoneel.

Die opleidingsinstituut Student Housing Training Institute (SHTI) is gegrond op die Amerikaanse model van die National Housing Training Institute (NHTI). Dit bied aan personeel gemoed met studentehuisvesting die

geleentheid om 'n teoretiese onderbou op te doen. Die kursus, wat vyf dae se intensieve opleiding in verskeie modules behels, is vir die eerste keer in 2011 by die US aangebied.

In 2012 is daar naas die basiese kursus ook 'n gevorderde kursus aangebied en dieselfde is vanjaar gedoen. Nadat die geleentheid drie keer by die US aangebied is, sal dit nou na Pretoria skuif waar die Universiteit van Pretoria die gasheer sal wees vir die volgende drie jaar.

"Daar is 'n duidelike behoefte aan so 'n kursus," sê Kloppers en Dunn. "Dit dien ook as 'n netwerkgeleentheid en die deelnemers leer baie by mekaar."

Volgens Kloppers het die aanbieding van die kursus in Stellenbosch goeie blootstelling vir die US verseker en was die deelnemers veral dol op die

AmaMaties Hub. "As studentebehuisingsreg loop, loop die US beter," het hy bygevoeg.

Dr Ludolph Botha, Senior Direkteur: Studente- en Akademiese Steun, het hulle bedank en gelukgewens met die baie suksesvolle program van die instituut wat hulle vir die derde agtereenvolgende jaar gereel en aangebied het.

## US-genetikus beste wetenskapskommunikéerder

Die genetikus dr Leon van Eck van die US is die algehele wenner van die Young Science Communicators-kompetisie van die Nasionale Navorsingstigting (NNS) en die Suid-Afrikaanse Agentskap vir die Bevordering van Wetenskap en Tegnologie (SAASTA).

Dié ná-doktorale navorsers het gewen met 'n artikel oor die verhouding tussen Brasiliaanse neute, bye en orgidieë. Die beoordelaars het Van Eck eenparig as die algehele wenner aangewys, en sy opstel "Jungle Fever: Brazil Nuts, Bees and Orchids" het ook die kategorie vir nuusartikels gewen.

Sy artikel oor die besonderse interaksie tussen bye en orgidieë, en hul verrassende verband met die Brasiliaanse neutbedryf, is as "fassinerend, toeganklik en vermaaklik" beskryf.

Die kompetisie moedig jong wetenskaplikes aan om hul werk te kommunikeer deur middel van nuusartikels, radiotekste of video's. Altesam 60 inskrywings van regoor Suid-Afrika is ontvang in die drie kategorieë.

Volgens Van Eck was hy nog altyd geïnteresseerd in die natuurlike omgewing, veral in die interaksie tussen plante en hul omgewing. Hy het al op 'n keer tot 400 orgidieë in sy eie kweekhuis versorg, maar het nou afgeskaal "tot 'n meer beheerbare 20 plante".

"Ek het 'n sagte plekkie vir orgidieë, nie net vir hul skoonheid nie, maar ook oor hul fassinerende evolusionêre aanpassingswysses. Die interaksie tussen bye en orgidieë is regtig iets besonders en is deel van 'n delikate ekologiese sisteem," sê hy.

Hierdie prys is 'n inisiatief van die African Innovation Foundation.

Die span het erkenning ontvang vir hul innoverende benadering tot nutriëntherwinning, 'n metode wat afval en vlieglarwes gebruik om natuurlike dierevoer te produseer.

Dr Elsie Pieterse, dosent in die Departement Veekundige Wetenskappe aan die US, is verheug dat hulle die prys gewen het. Sy het verduidelik wat presies hulle by die US se Mariendahl-proefplaas doen: "Ons gebruik verskillende soorte afval, soos voedsel waarvan die raklewé verstryk het, vrugtepulp en -afval, afvalkos uit hotelle, universiteitskoshuise en die Neelsie, asook afval van die slagpale. Ons identifiseer dan verskillende insekte wat geskik is om daardie afval

said. However, unlike the executive and legislative branches of the government, the Judiciary in South Africa has "over the years looked very much like a unit within or an extension of the Department of Justice and Constitutional Development", Mogoeng said.

The Office of the Chief Justice was established as a national department located within the Public Service in 2011. The next phase will include its establishment of the Office as an independent entity, similar to the Auditor-General.

# Disaster risks and education

Every two years, the United Nations convenes a global consultation related to disasters and disaster risk reduction known as the Global Platform for Disaster Reduction. This year, it took place from 21 to 23 May in Geneva, and Africa's Periperi U Consortium, of which SU forms part, was there. Dr AILSA HOLLOWAY explains the role of higher education in disaster risk reduction.

In a unique contribution to the 2013 United Nations Global Platform event, Africa's Periperi U Consortium organised a seminar on 24 May in Geneva which focused explicitly on the role of higher education in building capacity related to disaster risk reduction. This event, *Forging knowledge foundations: Framing resilient futures*, was hosted by the Technical University of Mozambique and SU's Disaster Mitigation for Sustainable Livelihoods Programme (DiMP), the Periperi U secretariat, in association with the UNISDR.

The Periperi U seminar's thrust argues that building disaster resilient futures goes well beyond a limited view of risk-averse construction that is confined to bricks and mortar. It underlines the crucial role played by higher education in establishing the human capital foundation for advancing disaster risk-related policy and practice.

The forum also aimed at opening up a conversation between institutions of higher learning committed to educational innovation in applied disaster risk scholarship and the diverse range of professional and institutional constituencies engaged in disaster risk reduction.

The Periperi U seminar also represented an extraordinary opportunity to challenge entrenched perceptions about limited African capability in the disaster risk management field. The programme profiled a broad range of innovations – in disaster risk-related curricula, postgraduate research and disaster risk reduction practice from "Algiers to Antananarivo". These include the introduction of seven new disaster risk management Master's degrees since 2008 – with a further three Master's programmes poised to launch this year. They are also reflected in more than 80 professional short courses

carried out by consortium partners that have reached more than 2 000 people on risk-related topics as diverse as "Public health in complex emergencies" and "Economic valuation methods and disaster risk reduction".

Perhaps even more important, the Periperi U seminar signalled the remarkable capacity of African higher education institutions to self-mobilise at local, national and continental levels, transgressing geographic and disciplinary boundaries, as well as differences in language. For instance, although consortium members teach in at least seven languages (including Afrikaans, Arabic, English, French, Kiswahili, Malagasy and Portuguese), they have aligned their disaster risk-related scholarship efforts at continental and international levels.

This seminar's emphasis on closer cooperation between government, private sector, civil society and higher education stakeholders is also reflected in a wide-ranging participation – from the United Nations agencies and International Red Cross Movement to the African Union and other regional groupings, such as the East Africa Community. Such support signals a welcome, albeit belated, recognition in the disaster risk field, that higher education institutions play a crucial role in risk-averse development.

Encouragingly, it also seems that there is growing realisation that, in Africa, their active engagement is key to sustaining the provision of skilled human capital to support national and subnational efforts in disaster risk reduction, and central to contextually relevant disaster research to inform innovation, sustainable development and social upliftment.

# Ancient secrets

Prof Salima Ikram of the American University in Cairo was recently invited to Stellenbosch University by Prof Sakkie Cornelius, Chair of the Department of Ancient Studies, as part of a project to study ancient Egyptian animal mummies in the Iziko Museums of South Africa in Cape Town. STEPHANIE NIEUWOUDT spoke to her.

Prof Salima Ikram was nine years old when she decided to become an Egyptologist. "I bumped against the life-sized statues of Rahotep and Nofret (ca 2500BC), a royal couple in the Egyptian Museum in Cairo. Those were the days before they were placed behind glass. I said, 'I am sorry, I am sorry'."

"And from that moment on I knew I wanted to be an Egyptologist. Before that I wanted to work with the Minoans, but they lost me to that experience. Most Egyptologists get bitten by the bug when they are young."

It was also during her youth that she visited a room with animal mummies in the Egyptian Museum and was fascinated. In later years she found the room to be locked, but due to her persistence the room has been re-opened, and she set up the Animal Mummy Project.

She says she is interested in mummified animals because "they are an incredible source of information about religion, technology, the environment, trade and economy".

Dogs were big business in ancient Egypt – they were bred, they were fed,

and they were mummified, for which expensive oils and other embalming necessities were needed which were often imported at great expense.

Because large dog catacombs are found close by remains of temples in Saqqara and Tuna el-Gebel, it is believed that priests were responsible for animal husbandry and that they also sold the animal for votive purposes.

It is estimated that there might be as many as 8 million dog mummies at Saqqara.

Animals were mummified for a number of reasons: they were seen as deities, they were beloved pets who had to enter the afterlife, and they had to be food in the afterlife. Dogs inspired many cults, and they were used for hunting, as guardians and as herd dogs.

"While ancient Egyptians referred to cats as only The Cat, dogs had names, because they responded to a name," said Ikram.

Dogs portrayed in hieroglyphics have collars around their necks – a clear indication that they were pets.

During her talk (entitled "Man's Eternal Best Friend: Dog and Human Burials in Egypt") at the autumn

meeting of the Classical Association of South Africa (Western Cape Branch) in Stellenbosch, Ikram showed a number of photographs depicting mummies. One of these really pulled the heartstrings: it showed a grown man and, at his feet, the mummified remains of his dog.

Ikram said that it was possible that this dog died because it pined for its master. Many a tomb also has the name of the dog – the Egyptians believed that writing down a being's name would ensure that it would live forever in the afterlife.

One of the dog deities most frequently seen on tombs is the super-canine Anubis. He has the body of a man, but his head is a mixture of the jackal, dog, wolf and fox. He is the god of embalming and as the "opener of the way" he guided the deceased safely from the world of the living to the world of the dead.

Although Egypt has seen some political instability these past few years, Ikram says she is not afraid that those in power will destroy heritage sites in the same way as the destruction that took place in Mali. However, she is concerned about the number of heritage pieces finding its way out of the country.

"The police force is not as active as it should be and the archaeological sites are not sufficiently protected. Although land grabbing and looting has always occurred, it is now more successful than before. I am also concerned diplomatic bags may be misused. Being a country bordered by the Red Sea, some areas of the border are also more permeable than others."

According to Ikram, about 70% of ancient Egypt is still undiscovered. "Thousands of years ago Egypt was a good place to live. It is still a good place and through the centuries cities have been built up on ancient sites."

Egypt is indeed an exciting place to be if you are interested in literally digging up history.

by die Universiteit, en dit is vir hulle 'n raaisel hoe hierdie skedel gebruik is in die onderrig van 'n dissipline soos Antropologie in die sosiale wetenskappe.

Volgens 'n tegnieke verslag deur dr D.F. du Toit, voorheen verbonde aan die US Fakulteit Geneeskunde en Gesondheidswetenskappe, was die skedel die menslike oorskot van 'n vrou van gemengde herkoms tussen 35 en 50 jaar oud. Die skedel is nie uit 'n doodskis gehaal of uit 'n graf opgegrawe nie. Hoewel dit nie registrasie-identifikasiemerke gehad het nie, het die verslag bevestig dat die skedel van

'n wettige anatomiefasiliteit afkomstig was en deel was van 'n versameling wat voldoen het aan die vereistes van die Wet op Menslike Weefsels, sê prof Johan Hattingh, Dekaan van die Fakulteit Lettere en Sosiale Wetenskappe.

Hy sê die skedel en oog- en haarkleurkaarte bring talle ander kommerwekkende vrae na vore, soos: "Is hulle vir onderrigdoeleindes gebruik, en indien wel, hoe? Watter wetenskaplike paradigma het destyds bestaan wat die gebruik van sulke items vereis het?"

Die navorsingspan, geleid deur dr Mandisa Mbali, dr Thomas Cousins, prof Steven Robins en prof Kees van der Waal, sal die historiese breuke en kontinuiteteit in die sosiale wetenskappe aan die US ondersoek.

"Hierdie projek beoog interaksie met internasionale navorsers en word geïnspireer deur die idee dat begrip van die 20ste eeu se geskiedenis van die sosiale wetenskappe, en spesifiek antropologie, dit moontlik kan maak om die etiese uitdagings waarmee die wetenskap in die 21ste eeu worstel, beter te kan verstaan," sê Robins.



# Stay healthy this winter

*With winter on our doorstep, it is best to start now to arm yourself against the onslaught of colds and flu. As they say, prevention is better than cure.*

It's the thought of coughing, sneezing and feeling under the weather enough to give you the chills, then follow these simple guidelines to stay healthy this winter.

- **Regular exercise**

If you want to boost your immune system, get active. Getting your heart rate up for just 20 minutes three times a week is associated with increased immune function. Regular exercise increases the level of leukocytes, an immune system cell that fights infection.

- **Get more antioxidants in your diet**

A diet rich in antioxidant vitamins and nutrients can boost immunity to help fight infection. Top antioxidants include vitamins C and E, plus beta-carotene and zinc. To get enough of these antioxidants in your diet, experts recommend eating lots of brightly coloured fruits and vegetables, including berries, citrus fruits, kiwi, apples, red grapes, onions, spinach, sweet potatoes and carrots.

- **Adequate sleep**

Fatigue increases your susceptibility to illness. Like stress, insomnia can cause a rise in inflammation in the body – possibly because lack of sleep also leads to an increase in the stress hormone cortisol. Getting adequate sleep – usually 7 to 9 hours for an adult – is essential to good health.

- **Practice relaxation techniques**

If chronic stress suppresses the immune system, then learning techniques to reduce stress should help return your immune system to healthy – and maybe even give it an additional boost. Reducing stress lowers levels of cortisol. It also helps you sleep better, which improves immune function.

- **Sneeze and cough into your arm or a tissue**

Holding your hand in front of your mouth or nose just puts the germs on our hands, from where you can spread them to objects and other people. Instead, hold the crook of your elbow over your mouth and nose when you sneeze or cough if a tissue is not at hand.

- **Get a flu shot every year**

The best prevention strategy for flu is an annual vaccination. The vaccine is particularly important for people with chronic conditions such as diabetes, asthma, kidney problems or heart disease, people aged over 65 and pregnant women. People whose immune systems are weakened through illness or medication should also consult their family doctor.

- **Change your toothbrush every three months**

A toothbrush can be a breeding ground for germs. Most dentists recommend you change your toothbrush every two to three months. It's also a good idea to replace it after you've had a cold or flu to prevent reinfection.


