Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS)



Professor Elmi Muller, an internationally renowned surgeon, is the new Dean of the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS) at Stellenbosch University. She is an Al-rated researcher who performed the first HIV positive to positive kidney transplants in the world in 2008 and today serves on several international bodies in recognition of her pioneering work. In addition to her MBChB and MMed (surgery) degrees, she also a holds a PhD in surgery and an MBA. She is the first woman to lead the FMHS since its establishment in 1956. Prof Elmi Muller is married to Stephanus, a musicologist. They are parents to Willem and Johan.



Professor Nicolaas Claudius (Nico) Gey van Pittius VI, BSc (PU), BSc Hons (PU), MSc (PU), PhD (Stell), LLB (UNISA), LLM (Stell), MBA (Stell), MPhil (Stell); M. ASSAF, M. Akad.SA is currently Vice Dean of Research and Internationalisation in the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS), Stellenbosch University (SU). Professor Gey Van Pittius leads an extensive portfolio that includes all aspects of research, postgraduate research studies and (MSc PhD internationalisation, and innovation (including intellectual property and technology transfer). He is also a full Professor of Molecular Biology in the Division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics of the Department of Biomedical Sciences at Stellenbosch University and a core member of both the Department of Science and Technology (DST)/National Research Foundation (NRF) Centre of

Excellence in Biomedical Tuberculosis Research (CBTBR) and the Medical Research Council Centre for Tuberculosis Research (CTR), both hosted by Stellenbosch University. He is a South African National Research Foundation (NRF) B-rated (*internationally acclaimed*) researcher and was an elected member of both the 'Suid-Afrikaanse Akademie vir Wetenskap en Kuns' (South African Academy for Science and Arts, in 2006 at the early age of 33 years) and the Academy of Science of South Africa (ASSAf) (in 2010, at the age of 37 years). He is the Chair of the Provincial Health Research Committee (PHRC) of the Western Cape and a member of the National Health Research Committee (NHRC). He is also a member of several other national and international scientific societies and committees, such as the American Society for Microbiology (ASM) and the International Union against Tuberculosis and Lung Disease (IUATLD).

Dr Liela Groenewald is head of the Doctoral Office in the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences at Stellenbosch University. She was previously tenured as Senior Lecturer in Sociology and worked as adjunct faculty and consultant to various higher education institutions in South Africa. She specialises in academic planning and quality assurance, programme management and development, staff development, student support, and online delivery of higher education. Her research focused on public management, social responsibility / ESG, and the intersection between the formal sector and poor communities

Presenters' Professional Biographies



Dr John Mark Bwanika is a medical doctor and E-health specialist. He is the co-founder and director of operations at Rocket Health Africa. He is also a research fellow with the National Institutes of Health (NIH) Fogarty Global health fellowship. Rocket Health is a leading indigenous digital health and Telemedicine Company in East Africa that started in 2012. It is the leading digital health partner for Uganda's most critical public health programs and digital health research, serving over 3 million beneficiaries in the last five years. Since 2019, Rocket Health has been running an integrated healthcare service that comprises 24/7 medical teleconsultation services, last-mile delivery of medicines and other pharmaceutical products, community laboratory

sample pickups, and a state-of-the-art stationary clinic. These are also complemented by the first-of-its-kind e-commerce site for healthcare products and services. The paying public access the Rocket health services using their funds or insurance premiums. Rocket health is the sole telemedicine partner for eight (12) leading health insurance providers in Uganda and East Africa. As part of the COVID-19 response, Rocket Health has grown to be the leading community information disseminator, telemedicine provider and last-mile respondent for COVID testing and medicine delivery- serving over 1 million people.



Professor Gerhard Walzl is a clinician scientist trained in internal medicine, pulmonology, and immunology in the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS), SU and leads the Stellenbosch University Immunology Research Group. His research focused on the immunology of Mycobacterium tuberculosis (MTB) infection and host biomarkers, including diagnostic markers, markers of TB treatment response and characteristics of protective immunity against MTB. His team recruited participants with well-characterised MTB infection and disease phenotypes to study immune responses at the disease site through bronchoscopy. His research spans the divide between clinical and basic sciences in a high TB prevalence area. I have played a leading

role in several international multisite projects funded by BMGF, EDCTP and the NIH. His team developed field-friendly diagnostic tests critical to the well-being of South Africans and others worldwide. He leads international, multidisciplinary research projects has published more than 250 peer-reviewed articles, submitted six patent applications that were all granted and had an NRF-rating of B1, an h-index of 56 in Scopus, and 68 in Google Scholar. He was an invited speaker at more than thirty international conferences and supervised more than fifty trainees during the past ten years.



Dr Lungiswa Nkonki is a senior lecturer in the Department of Global Health, Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences (FMHS) at Stellenbosch University. Between 2013 and 2019, she served as a panel member on the Competition Commission of South Africa's Private Healthcare Market Inquiry. She is a member of the South African Young Academy of Science (SAYAS) and an Editorial Board member for PLOS Global Public Health and South African Journal of Science. Her research interests include economic evaluation of healthcare interventions – particularly the cost-effectiveness of community-based interventions improving maternal, child and adolescent health outcomes, measuring inequality in health outcomes, social determinants of health, maternal

and child health, health systems research, universal health coverage, and private healthcare. She worked as a specialist scientist at the Medical Research Council.
