

Maritime Security Capacity Building: Towards Best Practices

A SAFESEAS book workshop organized by Cardiff University and hosted by the Security Institute for Governance and Leadership in Africa (SIGLA), University of Stellenbosch, Stellenbosch, 8.-10.11.2017

Objectives

The primary objective of this workshop is to discuss the drafts of the book chapters that present the core outcomes of the project SafeSeas. The goal is to improve the drafts, but also to cross-fertilize insights gained from each case in order to distil best practices. These best practices will form the policy report linked to the book which will be launched in March 2018. The secondary objective is to identify areas of future collaboration and the potential of a project Safeseas II.

Working Format

Deadline: Drafts (even if rough) should be completed by **Friday 27th of October.** Please send drafts by that date to Robert McCabe (at McCabeR@cardiff.ac.uk), who will then circulate papers via email to all participants.

Presentations: Each chapter has an allocated slot of 45 min (see agenda below). Presenters should present the core insights from their chapter in a **maximum of 20 min. Focus on five questions:** 1) How are maritime security challenges addressed in practice? 2) Who are the lead actors? 3) How are actors coping with the multi-agency challenge and coordinate? 4) How do actors work with external capacity builders? 5) What are the challenges that can be identified?

Discussing: Discussants have a **maximum of 7 minutes**. They should focus on two questions: 1) what are the core lessons from the case in terms of how the sector is organized and capacity building is done? 2) what dimensions of the case study require improvement? This is followed by a general discussion (15-20 min.)

Powerpoint: Please use power point sparingly, for a presentation there should be a maximum of 6 slides, for a discussant a maximum of 2. Please send Robert McCabe a copy of the slides by email, the latest on the 7.11.2017, or bring a USB and ensure that the slides are installed before the workshop starts.
