Portfolio Committee

Collaboration

- House Committee Encouragement and pointers for the Welcoming period were shared such as how to engage with newcomers and be advocates for sustainability in the Welcoming period

Major Projects

 - Multiple consultation meetings were had with a team from Days For Girls to plan the year's projects
 - The year plan for this project consists of steps for each month to keep the project possible in more achievable steps
