## PRASA Chair in Maintenance Management on track

The academic Chair in Maintenance Management in the Department of Industrial Engineering at SU is on track and running smoothly, says Prof Neels Fourie, the incumbent of the Chair sponsored by the Passenger Rail Association of South Africa (PRASA) since 2011.

"The primary goal of the Chair is to initiate and execute research into aspects of maintenance management and applicable engineering management principles best suited to the needs of PRASA/Metrorail. A formal postgraduate programme has also been established," he says.

The establishment of this Chair was the result of discussions between PRASA and SU in 2009 regarding recurring problems experienced by PRASA. In 2011, Fourie visited the main Metrorail depots across South Africa with a view to improving existing maintenance strategies and the operation of these strategies. It was then decided to initiate an on-the-floor approach to training of frontline workers, enabling them to interpret the company's values in their own workplace.

Follow-up modules will be introduced once work teams are operational. Middle management training will be introduced later, which will include a range of short courses registered by the Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA).

In addition to these training initiatives, a number of projects

have been successfully completed and will be expanded into one-day workshops that will be presented at Metrorail depots country-wide.

Dr Daniel Mtinkulu, Executive Manager: Engineering at PRASA Rail, says: "The activities of the Chair during 2011 were well received and we are looking forward to continue this in 2012."

## Transdisciplinary Summer School a **SUCCESS**

The TsamaHub, an initiative of the HOPE Project, hosted a successful Transdisciplinary (TD) Summer School at the Sustainability Institute, Lynedoch, from 13 to 17 February.

It was attended by 40 participants, including senior academics and postgraduate students from Ethiopia, Ghana, Kenya, Nigeria, South Africa and Tanzania. Some of the

lectures were presented by professors from the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam (VUA) and ETH Zurich.

The course was opened by Prof Stan du Plessis, Vice-Dean: Research in the Faculty of Economic and Management Sciences. He said transdisciplinary scholarship is characterised by flexibility, a cooperative search for knowledge and findings that are both scientifically rigorous and accepted by society.

Prof Joske Bunders, Director of the Athena Institute for innovation and communication in Health and Life Sciences at VUA, said she welcomed the opportunity to collaborate with the TsamaHub. "Transdisciplinarity enriches sciences and makes it more balanced – and it is fully accepted in the scientific community. Our papers get published, our students get jobs and our PhDs are highly rated."

The School of Public Leadership's Prof Mark Swilling, who is also Project Leader of the TsamaHub, gave a talk on "Africa's Development Challenges in a Resource Constrained World". He pointed out that against the backdrop of a "new scramble for Africa", if the continent wants to eradicate poverty it must find ways of increasing its economic output with fewer resources.

## US en Anglikane onderteken ooreenkoms

" 'n Geskiedkundige oomblik," is hoe prof Russel Botman, US Rektor, die ondertekening van 'n ooreenkoms tussen die US en die Anglikaanse Bisdom van Valsbaai beskryf het.

Die is die eerste keer dat die Universiteit 'n venoot van buite die gereformeerde tradisie bykry, en, sê Botman, "simboliseer die konkrete stappe om mekaar te vind en ons studente in dieselfde konteks te laat leer".

Die ooreenkoms is op 2 Maart deur Biskop Merwyn Castle van die Anglikaanse Bisdom van Valsbaai en Botman onderteken om bande tussen dié twee instansies formeel te versterk.

Ingevolge die ooreenkoms word die Anglikaanse Bisdom van Valsbaai 'n kerklike venoot van die US om predikante van die Anglikaanse Kerk van Suider-Afrika by die Fakulteit Teologie in kerklike bediening op te lei.

Die Bisdom sal ook, in ooreenstemming met die vereistes van die Universiteit, voltydse of deeltydse dosente kan aanstel om Anglikaanse Studies vir sy studente aan te bied.

## African first: Advanced Atlas.ti training at US

The African Doctoral Academy (ADA) will host the first advanced Atlas.ti training course in Africa from 25 to 29 June 2012. The course presenter is Dr Susanne Friese of Qualitative Research and Consulting (QUARC) in Wedemark.

Friese specialises in qualitative data analysis, focusing on computer-aided data analysis software and is the author of the textbook *Qualitative Data Analysis with Atlas.ti*. Ms Lauren Wildschut, ADA's Atlas.ti trainer, initiated Friese's visit in an effort to establish the Atlas.ti Institute for Africa. This institute's aim will be to establish a network of Atlas.ti trainers in Africa.

Atlas.ti is a powerful qualitative data analysis software package. It enables users to process vast amounts of data, to code original data sources, to keep track of interrelations and to visualise their importance. This course forms part of the ADA's biannual schools in social sciences research methods.

"The ADA is pivotal in building research capacity in Africa and this initiative is an embodiment of our vision to enhance the visibility of doctoral study and research at the University," Prof Johann Mouton, director of the ADA, remarked.

"During the Summer School in January we trained 73 delegates from 16 countries. We foresee rapid growth in the number of attendees and are gearing ourselves towards meeting the great demand we are experiencing."

## Arts and Social Sciences launches new website


The Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences recently went live with its new-look website at [www.sun.ac.za/arts](http://www.sun.ac.za/arts).

The website has been given a new look-and-feel, and was completely restructured to make navigation easier and information more accessible to the general public, prospective and current students, as well as staff members.

The design and layout was conceptualised by Ms Rachael Spiers from eSight along with the Faculty's marketing officer, Ms Lynne Moses. Various staff members also gave input regarding how the website could be improved and assisted with the gathering of information needed to populate the platform.

"After four years, the old website was outdated and we found that users had difficulty finding the information they needed. A website is supposed to function as a window into the inner workings of an environment and our window was not giving a clear picture of the exciting things happening in the Faculty. It was therefore due time to redesign and restructure how we were packaging and sharing information with our web visitors," says Moses.

According to the Dean of the Faculty, Prof Hennie Kotzé, "increased online activity, including Internet access via mobile phones, has resulted in a high demand for websites that are not only engaging and interactive, but also user-friendly and easy to navigate".



## Wes-Kaapse regering vereer Le Cordeur

Dr Michael le Cordeur van die US se Fakulteit Opvoedkunde is deur die Wes-Kaapse regering aangewys as die wenner in die afdeling Taal en Kommunikasie vir sy bydrae tot veeltaligheid en die bevordering van Afrikaans en isiXhosa as amptelike tale in die Wes-Kaap. Dr Ivan Meyer, Wes-Kaapse minister van kuns en kultuur,

het die toekenning in Februarie aan Le Cordeur oorhandig.

In sy toespraak het Meyer na Le Cordeur se rol in die Wes-Kaapse Taalkomitee verwys wat oor 'n periode van nege jaar gestrek het. Aanvanklik was Le Cordeur lid van die Taalkomitee wat die Taalbeleid vir die provinsie opgestel het saam met baanbrekers

soos dr Neville Alexander, dr Christa van Louw, prof Stan Ridge en prof Sandile Gxilishe, asook wyle prof Johan Combrinck. Daarna was Le Cordeur vir twee agtereenvolgende termyne die voorsitter van die Wes-Kaapse Taalkomitee. Ingevolge die grondwet mag hy hom nie weer beskikbaar stel vir 'n volgende termyn nie.

Voordat Le Cordeur se termyn op 29 Februarie ten einde geloop het, het hy 'n kollokwium op 20 Februarie in die parlement aangebied waaroor die nuwe Taalwet van Suid-Afrika besin is.

Le Cordeur is onlangs verkies tot die voorsitter van die Afrikaanse Taalraad, 'n sambrelorganisasie wat meer as 40 Afrikaanse organisasies verteenwoordig, en het beloof om hom te beywer vir die bevordering en beskerming van Afrikaans, asook die bemagtiging van al die sprekers daarvan.

Hy is ook die ondervorsitter van die Afrikaanse Taalmuseum en -monument in die Paarl, voorstander van die Trusteraad van die Breytenbach Sentrum op Wellington, en ondervorsitter van die Media24 Rachel's Angels Bemagtigingstrust.



## Kollegas bring hulde aan JC Kannemeyer



Die vermaarde biograaf en literator prof John C Kannemeyer (foto bo) is begin Maart deur die US se Departement Afrikaans en Nederlands gehuldig vir sy groot bydrae tot die letterkunde. Kannemeyer was buitengewone professor in dié departement.

Kollegas het Kannemeyer, wat op Kersdag verlede jaar oorlede is, beskryf as 'n "literator van formaat" en 'n "gesaghebbende figuur".

Hy is in 1939 op Robertson gebore en het sy studies aan die US voltooi. Uit sy pen het talle publikasies gekom oor die lewens van die grootste figure in die Afrikaanse letterkunde, waaronder DJ Opperman en C Louis Leipoldt. Kort voor sy afsterwe het hy die laaste deel van sy biografie oor JM Coetzee voltooi. Benewens talle prysse, waaronder van die SA Akademie vir Wetenskap en Kuns, het Kannemeyer 'n eredoktorsgraad van die US ontvang.

## MHB neem stap na papierlose kampus

Die US se Afdeling Menslike Hulpbronne (MHB) is een van die eerste afdelings van die Universiteit wat begin het om hul papierrekords elektronies te skandeer. Dié loodsprojek by MHB het reeds enorme voordele van produktiwiteitsverbetering en besparing van papier en ruimte tot effek.

Die projek is 'n voortsetting van die drukkerbestuurstelsel wat in 2011 in gebruik geneem is en reeds 'n enorme papierbesparing tot gevolg gehad het.

Saan met die skandering van papierrekords en die nuwe

drukkerbestuurstelsel word daar ook na talle tegnologiese inisiatiewe gekyk om papierloos aan die US te word. Een van dié inisiatiewe is om studente beter toe te rus met skootrekenaars om klasnotas elektronies te kan bestuur. Die Fakulteit Natuurwetenskappe is aan die voortou om klasnotas en handboeke in elektroniese formaat beskikbaar te stel.

Volgens mnr Helmi Dreijer, Senior Direkteur: Inligtingstegnologie, word daar binne die konteks van volhoubaarheid en "groenwees" in verskeie forums gedink oor hoe die US minder afhanklik van papierrekords kan wees, dokumente liefs elektronies te kommunikeer en dan binne 'n elektroniese dokumentbestuurstelsel te liasseer vir argivering. "Om minder afhanklik van papier te wees is wêreldwyd die regte ding om te doen en in pas met verskeie aksies om meer omgewingsvriendelik te wees."

Volgens Dreijer word, saam met die visie van 'n papierlose kampus en die lesse wat uit die brand in die Wilcocksgebou geleer is, aksies geneem om die groter risiko's van brandgevaar uit te skakel.

'n Opname word tans op die kampus gemaak van papierrekords wat waardevol is en waarvan die inhoud noodsaklik is om te bewaar. Informasiestegnologie en die Afdeling Fisiese Infrastruktuur ontwikkel metodes om dié risiko's te bestuur.

# Green movement

"To go green is the call of our time," says Prof Russel Botman, SU Rector. Our generation has not only realised the effects all our actions have on the environment, but know that changing our way of living will ensure the survival of our planet and future generations.

At Stellenbosch University, sustainability has become a buzzword over the past few years, with several projects – like the print management system – in place to decrease our carbon footprint.

Rezoning the Stellenbosch Campus into a residential erf, new thoughts on parking due to an increase in motor vehicles on campus, more

accommodation for students, a campus-wide bicycle project and a shuttle service all form part of the Campus Master Plan.

The University faces a number of challenges, one of which is the institution's unprecedented growth. This led to a shortage of parking on the Stellenbosch campus. For this reason the new Mobility Plan and Matie Bike Project was launched in March.

"If everyone should get a parking space, there will still be a shortage of 7 200. But the more vehicles we have on campus, the bigger our carbon footprint is. What we did as a university is to commit to promoting a sustainable environment. This means we made

a choice for renewal, for the sake of sustainability. Consequently, the Campus Master Plan was created, which include facilities and mobility, because these two are closely related," says Botman.

By creating facilities that are environmentally friendly and solving problems around mobility, the University facilitates sustainability.

"This is a big leap but let us do our part for our town, our country, our planet. To go green is the call of our time. We all can do something to help save our planet. Maties have always set the pace. Let us now be an example. It all starts with a shift in our mindset – it's time to think differently and do differently."

## Facilities

A new entrance to the Stellenbosch campus will be built in Crozier Street, with a main artery stretching up to Jan Marais Park where an interactive relaxation space is on the cards. New student accommodation is also planned.

The purpose of the Master Plan is to rezone the Stellenbosch campus into a residential area, which means it will be safer for pedestrians, that no heavy-duty vehicles will be allowed, a speed limit of 35km/h will apply, and cycling will be ideal.

For 2012, the new parking fee is R528 per year. This amount will be recovered on a monthly basis – R44 per month. This year, everyone who registered for parking will pay the same basic rate, but in 2013 there will be differentiated tariffs with the cheapest parking on the outskirts of campus at Coetzenburg and Lentelus.

## Mobility Plan

The overarching aim of the new Mobility Plan is to reduce the amount of motor vehicle traffic on campus and in the rest of Stellenbosch.

### Matie Bike Project

On 15 March, SU launched the Matie Bike Project to coincide with the University's Sustainability Day celebrations.

A total of 400 commuter bikes have been imported from the Netherlands for this purpose. Staff and students can rent a bicycle for R1 000 per year, R600 of which will be refunded if the bike is returned in a good working condition.

SU is also planning safe cycling routes on campus, with Victoria Street first in line. The campus routes will link up with similar routes that the municipality is planning for the rest of the town.

Staff and students can register their own bikes with the SU Risk and Protection Services (USBD), and also use the dedicated bicycle shed. This applies not only to the Matie bikes, but to all bicycles.

A shed is already available next to

the Neelsie, and more sheds are being planned. Users can lock the bicycles that they leave inside the sheds.

### Shuttle Service

The Mobility Plan also includes an extensive shuttle service on campus. Motorists who drive to campus will be encouraged to park at Lentelus and Coetzenburg where they can board a shuttle to campus. A pilot project is currently operational on two routes – from Coetzenburg to the Conservatorium and from Lentelus to Joubert Street.

Furthermore, a website will be launched shortly to bring people in contact with each other who stay in the same area.

As far as public transportation is concerned, SU is in discussion with the Stellenbosch municipality and taxi associations about a joint strategy.

"Briljant!" is hoe van die deelnemers aan vanjaar se 14de Professionele Onderrigontwikkelingsprogram vir Akademici (PRONTAK) dié leerskool oopsom – 'n kortkursus aangebied deur die US se Sentrum vir Onderrig en Leer (SOL) wat nuwe dosente aan die Universiteit toerus om voutreflike akademici te word.

Vanjaar het 'n groep van 69 nuutaangestelde US-akademici PRONTAK 2012 deurloop vanaf 29 Januarie tot 2 Februarie by die Goudini Konferensiesentrum naby Rawsonville. (Foto onder.) Gemeet aan dié groep se reaksie was dit 'n leerervaring soos min.

Die deelnemers het 44 US departemente verteenwoordig, sommige met geen onderrigervaring nie (waaronder 16 nuwelingdosente), terwyl ander al tot 15 jaar lank klasgee. Juis hierdie diversiteit het die PRONTAK-program in ag geneem deur 'n wye verskeidenheid onderwerpe te dek, waaronder die US-konteks, die beplanning van 'n module (uitkomste en assessering), en die bevordering van studenteleer. Deelnemers het 'n mikro-onderrigsessie, waartydens 'n mini-lesing van elke deelnemer verfilm en daarna deur hul kollegas en 'n PRONTAK-fasiliteerder in klein groepies bespreek is, as 'n besonder waardevolle leerervaring beskou.

Die PRONTAK-kortkursus

bestaan uit drie modules waarvan die deelnemers Module 1 in Januarie voltooi het. Die ander twee modules strek oor die res van die jaar en bestaan uit klasbesoeke op uitnodiging, deelname aan werkwinkels, kortkursusse, seminare en gefokusde belangsgroepe, asook 'n mini-konferensie vir PRONTAK-deelnemers in Oktober. Deelnemers kan ook 'n portefeuille van hul werk saamstel met die hulp van 'n PRONTAK-fasiliteerder.

Soos die afgelope twee jaar is die program oorwegend in parallele Afrikaanse en Engelse sessies aangebied. In 'n nuwe toevoeging tot die program, "Ontwerp vir leer", het dosente egter oor die taalgrense heen daagliks in groepies saamgewerk om 'n spektrum van leergeleenthede vir studente te skep wat hulle as 'n hulpbron in hul onderrig sou kon gebruik.

Prof Magda Fourie-Malherbe, voormalige Viserekotor: Onderrig, het PRONTAK 2012 geopen. Sy het gesprekke met deelnemers gevoer oor onderrig aan die US binne die internasionale en nasionale konteks van hoër onderwys. Die geleentheid is ook bygewoon deur senior fakulteitsverteenvwoerdigers, wat die geleentheid benut het om nuwe personeel in hul fakulteite beter te leer ken, informeel fakulteitsverwante sake te bespreek en vrae van die dosente te beantwoord.



# Betowerende portrette



'n Selfportret van Paul Emsley

Die betowerende portrette – van beroemdes tot blomme – van die vermaarde skilder Paul Emsley word tans in die US se Sasol Kunsmuseum uitgestal.

Emsley was vanjaar die US Woordfees se feeskunstenaar, en sy uitstalling in die Kunsmuseum duur nog tot 21 April. Die feeskurator, Amanda Botha, het 'n oorsigtstoontelling van dié kunstenaar wat tans in Londen woon se werk saamgestel.

Emsley is in 1947 in Glasgow gebore, maar het in Suid-Afrika grootgeword. Hy is internasionaal bekend om sy buitengewoon gedetailleerde swart-wit tekeninge van mense, diere, blomme en landskappe. Dalk is hy die bekendste vir sy groot en noulettende portrette van wêreldberoemde figure soos die Nobelprys-bekroondes Nelson Mandela en V.S. Naipaul. Hy teken ook portrette van diere (soos haaie, gorillas en renosters) en blomme (veral rose).

Sy tegniek is gebaseer op waarneming, maar is deur ervaring verfyn sodat die beelde wat hy skep nie foto-realisties word nie, maar 'n besonder individuele blik op die wêreld wat veral deur die val van die lig en die verloop van tyd verfyn word.

"Ek het nog altyd van skets gehou. Die droogheid van die papier en die kryt vereis presisie. Dit verklap gou 'n

mens se swakhede en foute, en laat geen plek vir slim truks nie," sê Emsley oor sy werk op sy webblad.

Hy het sy eerste solo-uitstalling in 1993 in die Sasol Kunsmuseum aangebied. Die huidige retrospektiewe tentoonstelling van sy werk bied 'n oorsig oor vyf spesifieke periodes in die ontwikkeling van sy kunstenaarsloopbaan.

want daar is beide inheemse en uitheemse plante waarop studente en wetenskaplikes navorsing kan doen.

Die tuin is relatief klein en beslaan slegs 1,8 hektaar, maar daar is uiteenlopende plantespesies, veral dwergplant. In die tuin kry jy ook die geskenkwinkel BioBou Sentrum, wat organiese produkte verkoop, asook die Katjiepiering-restaurant, 'n gewilde eetplek vir toeriste én inwoners wat 'n rustige middagete wil geniet.



# Exploring the oceans

*The enquiring minds of children sparked the idea for her to write a children's book, says Dr Sophie von der Heyden, a marine biologist and senior lecturer at Stellenbosch University. ENGELA DUVENAGE spoke to her about her upcoming marine life field guide for youngsters.*

For Dr Sophie von der Heyden, a marine biologist and geneticist in the Department of Botany and Zoology, writing for children has been "a real eye-opener and huge fun".

This senior lecturer and mother of two youngsters is busy adding the final touches to a field guide for children on South Africa's marine life which will hopefully be in bookstores by the end of the year.

"We haven't actually yet finalised the title of the book, and I'm guessing it will come last in the process," laughs Von der Heyden, who hails from Germany and received her doctorate in zoology and genetics from Oxford University in England.

Last year, she was one of eight budding or established authors to receive a grant from the Academic and Non-fiction Authors Association of South Africa (ANFASA). Through its Grant Scheme for Authors (AGSA), ANFASA aims to support interesting academic and non-fiction projects.

The grant has covered her travelling costs, and has taken her from Namibia to the southern Mozambican coast to especially compile the holiday guide section of the book.

The idea for the book was sparked when Von der Heyden was exploring rock pools at Margate with her two young children a few years ago.

"Nearby, a father was being stumped time and time again by the questions his sons were asking about the things they were finding in the pools," she remembers. "Kids love the sea, so I started to think about the value of an informative and fun guide that was age

appropriate."

She saw a gap in the field guide market for school learners, but has tried to create something which will benefit people of all ages.

Her project proposal for a new book was enthusiastically received by an editor at Random House Struik Publishers, and the writing process started in earnest in 2010.

Von der Heyden is glad to be working with the respected marine photographer Guido Zsilavec from Southern Underwater Research Group (SURG), who is contributing most of the photographs needed to make the species and identification part of the

book come to life. Illustrations by Sally McLarty, an experienced illustrator of children's and nature books, will also be used throughout the full-colour book.

In drafting the text, Von der Heyden was constantly challenged to describe the scientific aspects of the marine environment in an understandable way that does not sacrifice too much detail or scientific integrity.

"I hope the book will inspire future generations to become biologists, oceanographers and conservationists working together to preserve our amazing oceans," says this enthusiastic lecturer, who has been associated with SU since 2005.
