2. CONFERRAL OF QUALIFICATIONS

Justice Edwin Cameron, Chancellor:

By virtue of the powers vested in me as Chancellor by the Statute of Stellenbosch University and by the laws and the Constitution of this country, I hereby confer the degrees, diplomas and certificates that are listed in the graduation brochures for this graduation season. The names will appear online and are also available in those brochures.

I look forward to seeing you in person in December, when we have come out on the other side of the disaster that is besetting our country and the world at the moment. We will hold graduation ceremonies then.
