The cost of education

In 2015 #FeesMustFall called for no university fee increases in 2016. After nationwide student protests, government agreed to a moratorium on fee increases. But what are students paying at SA's higher education institutions?

fter government agreed to a moratorium on fee increases in 2015, students should pay the same this year as they did last year. The moratorium will lead to a R2.3bn shortfall in university funding this year, which will be covered by universities and support from Treasury. The National Student Financial Aid Scheme (NSFAS) will see a R4.58bn shortfall, which will be covered by loans and other assistance from Treasury. Yet, despite the 0% increase in 2016, fees remain high. Here is a round-up of first-year fees, compiled by Africa Check.

SA'S MOST EXPENSIVE DEGREE

R64500

The first year of the University of Cape Town's (UCT's) Bachelor of Medicine (MBBCh) is the most expensive of the fees obtained by Africa Check to date. At R64 500, it costs R23 000 more than the first year of the medicine degree offered by the University of the Free State.

MOST EXPENSIVE UNIVERSITY

R60000

For the first year, the three most expensive degrees are all at UCT: medicine is first, followed by two degrees that specialise in actuarial science, one a BBusSc and the other a BCom. These all cost more than R60 000 per year. UCT also came out the most expensive when compared with the other universities on the cost of a Bachelor of Arts, a Bachelor of Commerce and a Bachelor of Science.




