

Dr Michelle Pentecost has a dual training in clinical medicine (University of Cape Town) and medical anthropology (University of Oxford). She is a Lecturer in Global Health and Social Medicine at King's College London. Her primary research in South Africa is focused on the social science of early life interventions. Her UKRI Future Leaders Fellowship will partner with the DPRHU's Healthy Early Life Trajectories Initiative to investigate the social and ethical implications of public health interventions in the early life period from preconception to early childhood and develop innovative qualitative methodologies for studying the social factors that shape life trajectories. Prior to her UKRI Future Leaders Fellowship, Michelle's work has received support from DFID, the Wellcome Trust and the British Academy.
