

Web Portals

A web portal or gateway is a classified collection of links to other web pages.

- Maria Pantelia's **Electronic Resources for Classicists** (<http://www.tlg.uci.edu/index/resources.html>) - one of the most comprehensive portals for Classics that also contains links to several other portal.
 - **University of Chicago Classics Resources** (<http://classics.uchicago.edu/resources>) - contains many interesting links.
 - **Ancient World WWW Sites** (<http://www.kchanson.com/LINKS/ancweb.html>) - not recently updated, but contains wide variety of links.
 - **Diotima Women & Gender in the Ancient World** (<http://www.stoa.org/diotima/>) - contains information about much more than just women!
 - **Egyptology Resources** (<http://www.fitzmuseum.cam.ac.uk/er/>) - contains a wide variety of links about Ancient Egypt.
 - **Lifestyles of Ancient Egyptians** (<http://personaldividends.com/lifestyles-of-ancient-egyptians/>) - provides a comprehensive collection of sources and links on the Ancient Egyptian World.
 - **New Testament Gateway** (<http://ntgateway.com>) - excellent portal for New Testament Studies and related fields.
 - **Resource Pages for Biblical Studies** (<http://torreys.org/bible/>) - contains int. al. links to sources about the social world of the ancient Mediterranean.
 - **Rutgers University Virtual Religion Index** (<http://virtualreligion.net/vri/>) - offers a large collection of links to Internet sources on religious topics, including Ancient Near Eastern, Greek and Roman religions, as well as the Hebrew Bible and the New Testament.
 - **ABZU** (<http://www.etana.org/abzubib>) - contains a large collection of sources (including the complete texts of books) on the Ancient Near East.

Web databases/encyclopedias

Under this heading may be included websites containing a variety of textual and visual material.

- **De imperatoribus Romanis** (<http://www.luc.edu/roman-emperors/>) - a comprehensive encyclopedia of Roman emperors and related information.
- **Holy Land Photos** (<http://www.holylandphotos.org>) - a classified photo collection of the Biblical world.
- **The Beazley Archive (Oxford)** (<http://www.beazley.ox.ac.uk/index.htm>) - excellent collection of Greek art.
- **New Pauly Online (Brill' 's New Pauly)** (Stellenbosch University library > [Databases](#) > N >) - up to date and authoritative encyclopedia on the ancient world.
- **Logeion** (<http://logeion.uchicago.edu/>) - Greek and Latin online dictionary.

Texts and translations:

- **Perseus Digital Library** (<http://www.perseus.tufts.edu/hopper/>) - Greek and Latin texts, original and translation; studies; reference works.
- **Thesaurus linguae graecae (TLG)** (Stellenbosch University library > [Databases](#) > T >) - almost complete database of ancient Greek texts up to Byzantine period; dictionaries; complex searches.
- **Packard Humanities Institute (PHI) Latin texts** (<http://latin.packhum.org/>) - classical Latin texts; includes Word search and Concordance.
- **Suda Online** (<http://www.stoa.org/sol/>) - Byzantine encyclopedia on ancient authors and topics; translation and Greek; search on topics.
- **Etana** (<http://www.etana.org/>) - Ancient Near Eastern texts; translations.

Bibliographical sources

There are several websites with bibliographical information about specific ancient authors.

The more general sources are the following:

- **L'Année philologique** (<http://www.annee-philologique.com/>) - an Internet version of the most important bibliographical aid for Classical Studies. Admission is only by subscription, but it is free through the Stellenbosch University Library's website (<http://www.sun.ac.za/library>). Follow the link to *Databases* and choose L'Année philologique (alphabetised under A).
- **Gnomon Online** (<http://www.gnomon.ku-eichstaett.de/Gnomon/en/Gnomon.html>) - a selection of the most recent publications on Classics. It can be searched by title or author.
- **Tables of Contents of Journals of Interest to Classicists** (<http://projects.chass.utoronto.ca/amphoras/tocs.html>) - gives a valuable survey of the table of contents of classical and related journals.
- **Propylaeum Virtual library** (<http://www.propylaeum.de/>) - books on ancient studies in German libraries.

An example of more specific bibliographies:

- **A Hellenistic Bibliography** (<http://sites.google.com/site/hellenisticbibliography/home>) - by Martine Cuypers; bibliographical details of studies on Hellenistic Greek poets and the Latin poets influenced by them.
- **Online Egyptological Bibliography** (<http://oeb.griffith.ox.ac.uk/>) - lists all publications on Ancient Egypt since 1992.

When searching for the bibliographical details of a book, it also helps to go to online catalogues of research libraries:

- **COPAC Home Page University Research Library Catalogue** (<http://copac.ac.uk/>) - online catalogue of research libraries in the UK.
 - **Oriental Institute Online Archives** (<http://oi.uchicago.edu/research/library/>) - catalogue of one of the biggest libraries on the Ancient Near East.
 - **WorldCat** (Stellenbosch University library > [Databases](#) > W >) - includes a large number of library catalogues throughout the world.

Electronic journals

- **American Schools of Oriental Research Publications** (<http://www.asor.org/pubs/index.html>) - with links to the journals *Bulletin of the American Schools of Oriental Research*, *Journal of Cuneiform Studies* and *Near Eastern Archaeology*.
 - **Brynn Mawr Classical Review** (<http://bmcr.brynmawr.edu/>) - reviews of books on Classics. One may search the website or subscribe to receive reviews by e-mail.
 - **Review of Biblical Literature** (<http://www.bookreviews.org/default.asp>) - reviews of books on the Hebrew Bible and New Testament.
 - **Biblica** (<http://www.bsw.org/Biblica>) - full text available from vol. 79 (1998).
 - **Biblical Archaeology Society** (<http://www.biblicalarchaeology.org/>) - contains links to the semi-scientific journals *Archaeology Odyssey*, *Biblical Archaeology Review* and *Bible Review*.
 - **Aramaic Studies** (<http://booksandjournals.brillonline.com/content/journals/17455227>) - contains summaries of articles.
