I am a historian of southern Africa during the twentieth and twenty-first centuries with a particular interest in political history. I work on decolonisation, nationalism, political leadership, elections, ethnicity, historical biography, populism, civil society, and the challenges of state sovereignty and political sustainability in national and regional contexts.

A common thread that runs through my research is the location of contemporary political developments in a historical context, showing that the roots of contemporary democratic politics lie in the early post-colonial and even late colonial periods. Using historical biography as a methodological approach, my work has explored a number of understudied themes in southern African political history such as the roots of the strategies that political actors employ to mobilise electoral support in recent times, the interaction between racial nationalism, domestic politics and regional security concerns during the liberation struggle, the competitiveness of parliamentary elections in single party regimes and the role of patronage politics within this theme, and the importance of individual political leadership to the success of opposition parties in electoral campaigns.
