
 An extensive range of postgraduate study options is available, including vocationally orientated postgraduate diplomas, honours, master's and PhD degrees.

HISTORY

1929

The faculty pioneer, Prof CGW Schumann, became Dean of the faculty, a position he held until his retirement in 1960.

1960

A fire caused great damage to a large part of the Van der Sterr Building in the year that the faculty celebrated its 90th anniversary. The building was subsequently modernised and extended.

2018

The first 10 students graduated with a BCom degree after the establishment of the Commerce Faculty in

The Van der Sterr Building was inaugurated. A newly erected building named after Prof Schumann was added in 1977.

2015

Prof Ingrid Woolard, the first female dean in the history of the faculty, was appointed.
