The project was initially conceptualized by Dr Shantal Windvogel back in 2018, with partnerships established between Voorbrug Secondary School in Delft, Axiology Labs and the Division of Medical Physiology. The project facilitated the formation of internal social impact collaborations the Division of Clinical Anatomy and the division of Molecular Biology and Human Genetics.



The aim of the project is to invite youth from the community (grade 11 Voorbrug Secondary School learners) to a university environment (Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences, Stellenbosch University). Learners visit the faculty, including the library, anatomy museum, laboratories and attend the Physiology Symposium. Visits to the are arranged, with workshops to discuss a range of health topics.




