1994 UNDP Human Development Report

- Human security was defined through two main aspects as **'...first, safety from such chronic threats as hunger, disease and repression. And second, it means protection from sudden and hurtful disruptions in the patterns of daily life – whether in homes, in jobs or in communities'**

- Governance
- Poverty

Contemporary Reconstruction Barriers

- Legitimacy
- Knowledge – Attitude - Competence
- Relief dependency
- Lack of participation and local ownership
- Lack of Infrastructure for Peace

Infrastructure for Peace (I4P)

- “A network of interdependent systems, resources, values and skills held by the government, civil society and community institutions that promote dialogue and consultation; prevent conflict and enable peaceful mediation when violence occurs in a society.”

Example: Health Infrastructure

- The training of health professionals
- The building of hospitals
- The building of pharmacies
- Building civil society capacity
- Establishing government infrastructure and capacity
- Developing prevention policies
- Building a Global Intern-Government Infrastructure
- Promoting a Culture of Health and healthy living
- Developing a Code of Conduct, as the Hippocratic Oath

Proposal: I4P at Sea and on Land

- **Human Security & Peace Committees** – national, district and local (highly respected people with competence, knowledge and experience) for violence reduction, community building and dialogue
- **National Maritime Security Platform or Forum** – consists of main stakeholders in maritime security for consultation and cooperation

Proposal: I4P at Sea and on Land

- **Building national capacities for human security** – increase the capacity of peacebuilding and human security institutions of government, departments, maritime security agencies and others, including CSO groups.
- **A Maritime Security Support Unit** – may be established at a ministerial level in order to develop and implement government policy on maritime security.
