Dr. Kwesi Aning presently serves as the Director, Faculty of Academic Affairs & Research, Kofi Annan International Peacekeeping Training Centre, Ghana and Clinical Professor of Peacekeeping Practice at Kennesaw State University, Atlanta, USA. He has served with the African Union as its first counter-terrorism expert and from 2007 to 2008, as a senior consultant to the Department of Political Affairs (DPA) at the United Nations (UN). He serves on the World Economic Forum's (WEF) Council on Conflict Prevention. In 2014, he was appointed by the United Nations Office on drugs and Crime (UNODC) as the first independent evaluator of its Global Programme on Strengthening the Legal Regime against Terrorism. Since 2015, he was appointed by the UN Secretary General to serve as an Advisory Group member to the Peacebuilding Fund.
