## NQF levels of a qualification

## **Higher Education Sub-Framework (HEQSF)**

The HEQSF was implemented in 2014 as a revision of the original Higher Education Qualification Framework (2008). The HEQSF is the backbone/framework that all academic programmes offered by higher education institution (including Stellenbosch University) must adhere to. It describes the minimum requirements, nomenclature regulations and a shared terminology that aims to ensure quality assurance in the entire academic offering in HE. Should we consider curriculating a new programme or amending a current programme, we need to be aware of the parameters we can move within and the requirements we need to meet for a programme to be accredited/to still be eligible.

The framework consists of 11 qualification types which are mapped onto six exit levels on the NQF. Some levels have more than one qualification type. All qualifications offered via this framework has to be approved by the Department of Higher Education (DHET), accredited by the Council on Higher Education (CHE) and registered by the South African Qualifications Authority (SAQA).

This framework focusses on qualifications on NQF levels 5 – 10.

The NQF levels for the different qualification types and the minimum number of credits for each qualification type as follows:
