Term Overview

During the term, the Special Needs committee participated in the following activities on campus:

I. Special Needs Sub-Committee

The Special Needs Sub-Committee was formed at the beginning of the year. An advertisement was sent out to all students to apply for the Special Needs sub-committee and was filed in March 2021. The committee currently consists of 7 members with the following positions:

- Secretary
- Financial Manager
- Workshops and Engagement officer
- Marketing and Media Officers
- Events Manager

2. Workshops on Campus

The portfolio set out during the term to have workshops during the term for student communities on campus. The workshops aim to create awareness on disability issues faced by students with disabilities on campus and to open the conversation of accessibility. The committee hosted 3 workshops during welcoming week and 2 workshops during first term. The special needs manager with the assistance of the Prim Committee presented at a training for Prims and HC members prior to welcoming week.

3. SRC Accessibility Audit

The Special Needs manager created an accessibility audit document of the SRC office highlighting the accessibility issue of the office that students with disabilities may face when using the SRC office and other SRC venues. The document was accepted by the SRC and sent to the Disability Unit as well as facilities for discussion.

4. SRC Lead with Disability

The special needs portfolio with assistance from the SRC Vice-chair, assisted the Disability unit in setting up a lead with disability course specifically designed for the SRC.

5. TSR Lead with Disability

The special needs portfolio with assistance from the TSR student wellness officer, assisted with the set-up of the TSR lead with disability course specifically designed for the TSR needs and time.

6. SRC Special Needs Safe Space

The portfolio created a safe space group for students on campus to discuss issues of disabilities and to create a space for students with disabilities to share their experiences of campus.
