NATIONAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS



The National Research Foundation (NRF) is the main funder of postgraduate studies in South Africa. The NRF offers partial and full-cost scholarships to Honours, Master's, and Doctoral students. Please visit www.nrf.ac.za for more information.

GENERAL SCHOLARSHIPS

The National Research Foundation invites all 2022 postgraduate students full-time students not in salaried employment (contractual or permanent) while studying, to apply for funding support. You should apply for this funding opportunity even if you are not sure if you are going to be offered admission to your chosen degree programme.

The NRF minimum academic requirement for postgraduate funding is 65%. Applicants for Honours, Master's and Doctoral funding must be 28, 30 and 32 years of age or younger respectively in the year of application. Successful applicants will be funded either at Full Cost Study (FCS) or Partial Cost of Study (PCS). The FCS funding will be awarded to South African citizens and permanent residents only, who are either financially needy (i.e., those whose combined household family income is less or equal to R350 000 per annum), living with a disability or exceptional academic achievers. The PCS funding will be awarded to 5% of international students including South African citizens and permanent residents who could not be funded under FCS but meet other minimum requirements for the NRF scholarship funding criteria.

Values: Scholarships are available at partial or full cost.

DAAD-NRF

All fields are funded. Applicants must be SA citizens or permanent residents. The programme targets candidates who are working towards a Master's or Doctoral degree. Preference will be given to full-time registered young South Africans or full-time SU staff members (SA citizens/SA permanent residence status) studying towards a Doctoral qualification.

Honours Scholarships

South African citizens and permanent residents. BSc Honours in Physics, Electronics, Astronomy or Astrophysics or Computer Science. Minimum of 65% for the major subjects in the final year of undergraduate studies. Applicants must be 28 years of age or younger.

Master's Scholarships

South African citizens and permanent residents, AND citizens of Botswana, Ghana, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia and Zambia. Studies must be relevant to the scientific and technical goals of the SKA and MeerKAT radio telescopes. A minimum of 65% for all subjects at Honours level or 65% for all final year subjects of a four-year degree. Applicants must be 30 years or younger.

Doctoral Scholarships

South African citizens and permanent residents, AND citizens of Botswana, Ghana, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia and Zambia. Studies must be relevant to the scientific and technical goals of the SKA and MeerKAT radio telescopes. A minimum of 65% for Masters. Applicants must be 32 years or younger.

- All applications must be accompanied by the following supporting documents:
- Proof of South African Identity Document (ID) or Passport (for international students) and Permanent Residency - Official and certified university degree certificates
- Transcript of academic record indicating a minimum accumulative academic achievement in the previous degree.
- Recommendation letter by Supervisor (compulsory for Masters and Doctoral applicants)
- Admission letter indicating full-time registration (if available).
- This will be required if the application is successful
- Reference letters (if available). This will be required if the application is successful.

The IBS postgraduate bursary support is intended in funding students approved for or registered for full-time studies for Honours/ 4th year Engineering/Postgraduate Diploma, Masters or PhD degrees at any South African public university. HB & MJ THOM SCHOLARSHIPS

The HB & MJ Thom Scholarship programme is designed to recognise and reward outstanding post-matric leadership in various fields such as sports, culture, academics, religion, and more. The scholarship is open to students who have completed an undergraduate qualification and now would like to proceed to complete a postgraduate qualification at SU.

While a good academic record is not mandatory for eligibility, the University prefers applicants who have excelled in their previous academic pursuits. In addition to meeting the stipulated criteria, candidates must also submit two testimonials and a comprehensive CV along with their completed application form.

To qualify for the scholarship, applicants must demonstrate exceptional achievements in at least two of the following categories: participation in SU student leadership structures, engagement in sports, involvement in cultural activities or community service, or leadership roles in religious organizations. The applicant must provide specific examples of their leadership accomplishments, highlighting three exceptional achievements in these areas

The scholarship committee will evaluate the applications and select the most deserving candidates based on their leadership abilities, academic achievements, and overall potential to make a positive impact in their chosen field.

Scholarship recipients will receive financial assistance towards their tuition and living expenses

Qualifying Criteria

- South African citizens only
- Full-time Honours, Master's, and Doctoral studies
- All fields of study are considered

CRITERIA

The Harry Crossley Scholarship Programme at Stellenbosch University is a prestigious scholarship that provides financial assistance to exceptional students who demonstrate academic excellence (an average of 70% or more in previous degree studies).

The Harry Crossley Scholarship Programme covers tuition fees, accommodation, and living expenses. In addition to financial support, recipients of the scholarship also benefit from a range of personal development opportunities.

To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must have completed their undergraduate studies with outstanding academic results.

All fields are funded (excluding Theology and Political Science)



STELLENBOSCH UNIVERSITY POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMME (PSP)

The Stellenbosch University Postgraduate Scholarship Programme is designed as a collaborative initiative to support, foster and strengthen our postgraduate talent, enhance student access and promote research excellence. This programme offers various scholarships to postgraduate students across all faculties, including Honours, Master's, and Doctoral degrees. The scholarships are awarded based on academic merit, financial need, or both. The values of the scholarships vary depending on the availability of funding, with some offering partial funding and others offering full funding. The application process is open from August to October each year, and successful applicants are notified from December to March.

CRITERIA

- Each faculty determines its academic requirement(s); typically a minimum of 65% average in your previous degree (or your major) is required.
- Students must intend to register for full-time studies (no part-time programmes are supported unless stated otherwise).
- Honours, Master's and Doctoral degrees are supported (excluding postgraduate diplomas, certificates or advanced bachelor's degrees).
- Applicants may not be employed for more than 20 hours per week.
- Focus on further developing research excellence at our institution.

SCHOLARSHIP VALUES

- Scholarships vary depending on the availability of funding.
- Partial and full scholarships are available based on academic performance/financial need.

POSTGRADUATE OFFICE (PGO) OVERSEAS CONFERENCE GRANTS

Are you a full-time Masters or Doctoral student looking to attend an international conference to present a paper or poster? The PGO Overseas Conference Grant (OCG) could be just what you need to supplement other grants and make your dream a reality.

The PGO OCG is a supplementary award that provides financial support to attend an international conference outside of South Africa to present a paper or poster. Full-time registered Masters and Doctoral students are eligible to apply for this grant, and the support should supplement grants provided by other sources. The award may not exceed 50% of the total budget to a maximum of R17500.

To be eligible, applicants must submit proof of acceptance of the presentation by the conference organisers. An applicant can only receive the grant once during their postgraduate studies. Applications for the PGO OCG are accepted three times a year.


