



By tracking involvement in both face-to-face and online student development activities, we can measure the impact of these interventions and identify crucial factors to optimise academic achievement. Example applications are:

The BeWell Mentor Wellness System, involving approximately 600 mentors and 4000 first-years annually.

i-FlourishWell4Life - an intervention- and evidence based curriculum to optimise student well-being. i-FlourishWell4Life aims to simultaneously advance success and well-being, and attempts to explicitly develop a series of malleable factors that are linked to academic performance. All interactions are tracked. Target audiences currently include EDP students in five faculties, main stream students from two faculties and the online onboarding programme for newcomers.
