Centre For Global Engagement

The Centre for Global Engagement (CGE) was formed through the amalgamation of the Global Education Centre and the Centre for Partnerships and Internationalization Support. Currently the CGE consist of two functional units: The Unit for Partnerships & INTERINFO and the Unit for Global Education.

The Unit for Partnerships & INTERINFO plays an important role in terms of managing and supporting Bi- and Multilateral partnerships at Stellenbosch University. The Unit is also responsible for the information management of internationalization activities at Stellenbosch University. The responsibility regarding staff internationalization which includes academic and pass staff mobility is similarly situated within the unit.

The Unit for Global Education focuses on supporting non-degree mobility, which includes semester and short-term mobility. The activities of the unit are grounded in a global learning approach, with a specific focus to attaining certain global learning outcomes with the respective programmes. In addition to the above the unit also has a strong focus on student integration and success of international students at Stellenbosch University.

The SUI Communications & Marketing function is as well situated within the Centre for Global Engagement. This responsibility area is accountable for SUI branding and events support publications, website, newsletters, and social media. The respective coordinator also needs to ensure alignment with institutional communications and marketing. The CGE also hosts the Stellenbosch University Japan Centre, as well as the Skema-Stellenbosch Student Campus Office.

The Centre for Collaboration in Africa

The Centre for Collaboration in Africa (CCA) at SU International is responsible for creating an enabling environment for partnership development and support for bilateral and multilateral partnerships in Africa, through initiatives such as the SU Africa Platform. We further continue to grow awareness amongst staff and students of opportunities in other African countries, through coordinating events such as Africa Day and Africa University day on the different campuses.

Responsibilities in the centre include the administration of the Africa Collaboration Grant associated with the bilateral partners and the administration of various Intra-Africa mobility programmes. In addition, the CCA host the secretariats of the AUDA-NEPAD Southern African Network of Water Centres of Excellence (AUDA-NEPAD SANWATCE) and the Partners Enhancing Resilience for People Exposed to Risks (PERIPERI U), and also support the activities related to the African Research Universities Alliance (ARUA) - linking numerous universities across the continent through thematic networks.

The CCA also facilitates SU's contribution to the AUDA-NEPAD Centre of Excellence in Science, Technology & Innovation (AUDA-NEPAD CoE in STI). Finally, the CCA host of the Stellenbosch University SDG/2063 Impact Hub, where we continue to raise awareness, create global partnerships and coordinate the collection of data to measure and communicate SU's contribution to the Sustainability Goals (both United Nations SDGs and African Union Agenda 2063)

Africa Centre for Scholarship

The Africa Centre for Scholarship (ACS) ACS is home to the following three units:

SU – Unit for International Credentialing (SU-UIC): Supports the evaluation and quality assurance of foreign and international qualifications to enable access of eligible applicants to quality higher education institutions. Currently the Unit acts as the external quality assurer for Africa's first international school-leaving qualification, the Independent Examinations Board's International Secondary Certificate. The first round of examinations was deemed fair, reliable and valid by SU-UIC and took place in Namibia, Mozambique and Eswatini in 2022.

The African Doctoral Academy (ADA): Aims to strengthen Higher Education and research in Africa by delivering high-impact research and methodology training for prospective and current doctoral candidates, their supervisors and researchers from Africa and beyond. Recently, the ADA hosted its first in-person Summer School post Covid-19 in Stellenbosch, during January/February 2023 with delegates coming from South Africa, Kenya, Ethiopia, Uganda and Zimbabwe, attending 12 different courses facilitated by world class leaders in their respective fields. The ADA is excited to announce its Winter School taking place from 3 to 21 July 2023. The Winter School is open to all African and global scholars seeking to become established researchers in their fields.

The Emerging Scholars Initiative: is a collaborative project comprised of 12 Joint Schools at selected SU partner universities across Africa. The project focuses on emerging scholars comprising of doctoral students and early career researchers. The most recent joint school was hosted by Makerere University in Uganda from 20 – 24 February 2023. The school was attended by 49 delegates, 5 of which were from Stellenbosch University.
