Who should apply?

If you are permanently employed, been working at SU for more than two years within a PASS environment, you are eligible to apply.

What does the programme entail?

We hope to present an exciting and engaging programme that will be attended by other SU Staff, PASS staff from University of Hamburg and Northwestern University. If you register, will be required to attend all activities offered, and all sessions for the duration of the programme. Social events in the evening are optional, but we would strongly encourage that you try to attend these events as well, as it forms an essential part of the programme learning.

You will be expected to actively participate in group discussions and there will be an opportunity to present what you learned, with your current work environment.

What are the cost implications?

There are no costs involved, however, your line manager will have to sign off on your participation and you will have to capture "Leave of Absence - attending training/a course" on the HR leave system.

Why should I apply?

This programme is the first of its kind at SU and is a wonderful opportunity to engage with peers for SU but also from leading international institutions.

The programme is a fantastic Internationalisation@Home event, and only five (5) participants will be selected. Your participation in this programme, will be acknowledged should you apply for any other PASS development programme that SU International will host or arrange. It's a unique and specialized programme to develop staff in PASS environments by creating an awareness of internationalisation in general.
