Why would you want to do research during your MBChB degree?

- ❖ Get exposure to both clinical and research experience in area of interest
- ❖ Help to clarify your interests and decide whether to pursue research further
- ❖ Puts you ahead of the game...stand out among peers and among other graduates
- ❖ Gives you valuable (early) experience in working towards a skripsie (research project)
- ❖ Specialisation requirement: compulsory requirement for MMed (specialisation)
- ❖ You can publish in academic journals and present at conferences...your name in lights!
- ❖ Can make you famous
- ❖ Can get you money to find out more cool stuff (research funding)

Research Electives: MBChB IV and MBChB V

If you have an interest in doing research at some point in your degree or career, now is the time to start. The table below shows how, by doing research electives in your fourth and fifth years, you can arrive at your final year already well on the way to completing your skripsie – which leaves you more time to develop it into a publication ready for submission to a peer-reviewed journal before you graduate.

This is intended as a guideline for how you might use all or part of your electives in 4th and 5th year to do research. Students have chosen to structure this in different ways depending in their goals and interests.

	4 th year elective 4 weeks	5 th year elective* 4 weeks	Skripsie 1 year
Register elective / topic	July	April	End of 1 st semester
Identify internal & external supervisors	September	May	August (research supervisor only)
Start date	October	July	August
Submission deadline	January following year	August	August following year
Potential starting point	Interest in research	Ethical approval obtained	Data ready for analysis
Suggested activities	Week 1: Contact time and workshops coordinated by Undergraduate Research Office [†] Protocol development	Data collection in field	Analysing data and writing up skripsie Preparing paper for publication
Suggested assessment outcome/s	Draft protocol for full research project and associated outcomes Reflective summary on experience	Demonstration that empirical work has been conducted (i.e. data collected) and associated outcomes Reflective summary on experience	Skripsie – ready for publication
