- Radio interviews of MFM


The campaign was monitored and the analytics gathered showed a positive engagement by the target audience (students, staff, alumni and SU stakeholders).





## **DIGITAL STAFF NEWSLETTER:**

The announcement of the revised Disability Access policy was placed in the digital staff newsletter (news@StellenboshUni) and distributed to 3 300 staff, according the language preference.

- The opening rate for the English edition was 29.6 %, while the click rate was 3.2%
- The opening rate for the Afrikaans edition was 31.6 %, while the click rate was 5.5 %

It is important to point out that the opening rates and click rates compare very well with industry standards, which are 23.9% and 2.1% respectively.

The new policy, in place since 1 April 2018, has a campus-wide lens that focuses on students, staff and visitors to the university's different campuses and how we can make them more inclusive from a disability perspective. We recognise that disability is not only about students with disability on our campuses, but also about staff and visitors. We are re-looking at how we care at our institution and revamping and planning for better access, with a special focus on people with disabilities.


