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Constitutional Responsibilities

It is my duty to ensure that the Student Body of the Military Academy is always well informed of the SRC decisions and information, and that the SRC is well informed of all the diverse activities (Academic and Military) taking place at the Military Academy.



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Portfolio Overview

1. Oversee the Military Academy Student Council.
2. Ensure Military Discipline and Wellbeing (Academic, Mental, Social, Emotional, Physical etc.) of the Student Body.
3. Report students' concerns and ensure they are attended to by Section Military Development and Faculty.
4. Inform the SRC of all developments at the Military Academy and that concerns from the Military Academy are raised in SRC discussions. Also ensure the SRC decisions/information is communicated with the Military Academy.



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Committees/Task Teams

1. There are two committees under the DSSC portfolio which forms part of the MASC which are the Men's forum and the Women's forum. The purpose is for both forums to have a platform to address Gender-Based Violence and other gender-based issues that may arise.
2. Social/Diver: Social/Diversity sub-committee composed of each year group social rep; 1st Years rep, 2nd Years rep, 3rd Years rep, post-grads rep and Trans-Enduro rep to integrate all planned activities.



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Term Overview

1. DSSC: Movember awareness movement in November 2022 to bring awareness of prostate cancer to the Student Body. No funds used. Funds were raised through making a competition of mustache to generate funds for future DSSC events.
2. Social/Diversity: Contacted Kuko Rep from SRC to coordinate functions and cultural activities to open them up to the faculty of Military Science. Introduced the Military Academy Acapella group to Kuko Rep.
3. MASC: MASC training programme on the 16th of October 2022. The MASC facilitated the quarantine week for first years from 9 January 2022 to 16 January 2022. MASC also facilitated the induction week for the first years, and it was integrated with military leadership and teambuilding activities.
